#### Amendment No. 1

Representative Dutton offered the following amendment to **CSHB 3860**:

Amend **CSHB 3860** (house committee report) by adding the following appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill and renumbering subsequent SECTIONS accordingly:

SECTION \_\_\_\_\_. Subchapter E, Chapter 375, Local Government Code, is amended by adding Section 375.0923 to read as follows:

Sec. 375.0923. NOTICE TO LEGISLATOR OF DISTRICT ACTION. A district may not take any action authorized under Sections 375.092(c) through (n) unless the board first sends written notice describing the action to each state senator and state representative who represents a legislative district in which any part of the district is located.

SECTION \_\_\_\_\_. The change in law made by Section 375.0923, Local Government Code, as added by this Act, applies only to an action of a municipal management district taken on or after September 1, 2013.

Amendment No. 1 was adopted.

**CSHB 3877** (by Pitts), A bill to be entitled An Act relating to the powers and duties of the Ellis County Municipal Utility District No. 1; granting a limited power of eminent domain; providing authority to issue bonds; providing authority to impose taxes.

**CSHB 3895** (by Toth), A bill to be entitled An Act relating to the name of The Woodlands Road Utility District No. 1, of Montgomery County, Texas, and to the administration, powers, and duties of the district.

**HB 3898** (by Hilderbran), A bill to be entitled An Act relating to water districts in Bandera County.

#### **HB 3898 - STATEMENT OF LEGISLATIVE INTENT**

REPRESENTATIVE HILDERBRAN: **HB 3898** codifies the enabling act for the Bandera County River Authority and Springhills Water Management District, both governed by the same board of directors, ("Districts") into a single chapter of the Special District Local Laws Code. The bill combines the two districts into a single district, ratifies the change in name, and moves the board of directors election date to November of even-numbered years.

In 1971, the legislature created the Bandera County River Authority (the "River Authority") which included all of Bandera County, except for territory within two then-existing districts. The River Authority was granted all the "rights, powers, privileges, authority, and duties conferred and imposed by the general laws of this state now in force or hereafter enacted, applicable to water control and improvement districts created under authority of Article XVI, Section 59 of the Texas Constitution." In 1989, the legislature created the Springhills Water Management District (the "Management District"), which included all of Bandera County, including the territory excluded from the River Authority, and authorized the Management District to exercise all the rights and powers of the River Authority, granted the Management District the powers and authority granted to

groundwater conservation districts under then-codified as Texas Water Code, Chapter 52 (but now codified as Chapter 36), and authorized the directors of the Management District to serve as the directors of the River Authority. In 2003, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality approved a request by the Management District to change the name to Bandera County River Authority and Groundwater District. The District does not currently own any water rights and has never held a permit for surface water rights.

Bexar-Medina-Atascosa Counties WC1D No. 1 ("BMA") owns permits authorizing the installation and operation of dams on the Medina River that form Medina Lake and Diversion Lake, the impoundment of water in those lakes, and the diversion of water for irrigation and municipal use.

It is the legislature's intent that BMA has the right to adopt and enforce its rules on any body of water owned or controlled by BMA, and that nothing in **HB 3898** grants the District any rights or authority to adopt rules over the same body of water owned or controlled by BMA.

**HB 3910** (by Creighton), A bill to be entitled An Act relating to the boundaries of the East Montgomery County Municipal Utility Districts Nos. 6 and 7.

**SB 1862** (Isaac - House Sponsor), in lieu of **HB 3911**, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to the creation of the Crosswinds Municipal Utility District; granting a limited power of eminent domain; providing authority to issue bonds; providing authority to impose assessments, fees, or taxes.

Representative Isaac moved to lay **HB 3911** on the table subject to call, and the motion prevailed.
