COMMITTEE ON GENERAL INVESTIGATING REPORT

The chair recognized Representative Murr who addressed the house, speaking as follows:

Mr. Speaker and members, as chair of the Committee on General Investigating, I wish to make the following statement to the house:

Under Rule 15 of the House Rules and Article 9 of the Housekeeping Resolution, the Committee on General Investigating has spent the last month using the authority this body has granted to us to investigate allegations involving Representative Bryan Slaton. As required by the House Rules and the Housekeeping Resolution that this chamber adopted in January, the committee, upon receiving allegations made by three separate complainants in early April, promptly retained the services of former judge, Catherine Evans, to conduct an independent investigation into the matter. Judge Evans conducted this detailed investigation quickly and professionally, interviewing all complainants and cooperating witnesses and assembling documents and other evidence.

On Monday, May 1, Judge Evans submitted her report to our committee. And later that day, the committee reviewed this report and unanimously found reasonable cause to believe that inappropriate workplace conduct involving a violation of rule or policy existed and ordered that a due process hearing, as required by the Committee Rules, be held with Representative Slaton on Thursday, May 4. We conducted the hearing and afforded Representative Slaton his opportunity to provide the committee with any exculpatory evidence and information, including arguments of counsel, that he and his attorney deemed appropriate.

Following the hearing, the committee prepared the committee's report using the findings and facts presented by Judge Evans' investigation. Those facts and findings are undisputed and uncontroverted, and are supported by independent and credible evidence. This morning the committee unanimously adopted the committee report which, in accordance with the Committee Rules, contains findings of fact, conclusions of law, and a recommendation for discipline. Also this morning, I have requested that our committee report be printed and distributed to the members of this body.

I would like to thank Judge Evans for her thorough investigation and diligence in preparing and submitting her report to our committee. I would like to thank my fellow committee members—Vice-chair Johnson, Speaker Geren, and Representatives Longoria and Spiller—for their very deliberative efforts throughout this serious investigation. Our committee treats every complaint with the seriousness it deserves, and we have been and will continue to be dedicated to ensuring a fair and credible process. A copy of the committee's report will be distributed to you in moments and it will be posted online to the committee's website later today.

To summarize the committee report, we find that Representative Slaton engaged in inappropriate sexual conduct with a subordinate. That behavior was induced by alcohol that Representative Slaton provided to that 19-year-old subordinate. Representative Slaton then acted systematically to influence that subordinate, multiple witnesses, and to obstruct the investigation into the matter—to the detriment of both our chamber and those who work here.

As you will read shortly, this committee unanimously recommends that the house discipline Representative Slaton by expelling him as a member of this body. The expulsion of a fellow member is a level of punishment we don't take lightly. It is not meant to punish the member, rather it is intended to protect the integrity and dignity of this legislative body and to provide accountability to everyone that works and serves in this building. The terms "duty and trust," "integrity," and "institutional acceptability to the people" have utmost importance in our recommendation for expulsion.

At the conclusion of my statement today, the resolution to impose the recommended discipline against Representative Slaton will be filed with the chief clerk. On Tuesday, May 9, it is my intention to call up that privileged resolution for consideration before the house. Though the committee's investigation has concluded, proceedings are still ongoing and will ultimately be up to the members of this chamber. Out of respect for the process and those involved, this statement will serve as our committee's only public comment on the matter for the time being.

With a heavy heart, but an obligation to do what is appropriate to best protect this institution, I thank you, Mr. Speaker and members.

The speaker stated that, without objection, Representative Murr's comments would be reduced to writing and placed in the journal.

SB 1484, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to a border operations training program for peace officers employed by local law enforcement agencies.

SB 1484 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE ORTEGA: In your bill, how is the criminal activity defined?

REPRESENTATIVE HOLLAND: How is the criminal activity defined?

ORTEGA: Yes, sir.

HOLLAND: Can you point me to where you're asking the question?

ORTEGA: It's in the content of your bill. I'm sorry, I didn't bring the bill with me.

HOLLAND: Criminal activity occurring along the Texas-Mexico border.

ORTEGA: But how do you define "criminal activity"? Is there place that it's defined within the bill itself?

HOLLAND: The bill is about a training program for peace officers. It's not defining anything in the Criminal or Penal Code.

ORTEGA: Well, I understand that, but it deals with the training for criminal activity. So let me ask it this way: Will the definition of criminal activity come from existing statute?

HOLLAND: I would assume so.

ORTEGA: Thank you. Do you agree that civil violations of immigration laws are not considered criminal activity?

HOLLAND: That's not what my bill is about.

ORTEGA: Do you agree with that, though, that technically violations—civil violations, I'm not talking about any kind of criminal violations—of immigration laws are considered criminal activity or are they not considered criminal activity, since it's civil?

HOLLAND: Ms. Ortega, your remarks are not about my bill.

ORTEGA: Well, again, it goes into training with regard to criminal activity. That's why I'm asking these questions. I want to make sure that I understand the bill as well as others.

HOLLAND: As defined by state law and interpreted by the Department of Public Safety and TCOLE.

ORTEGA: Okay. Has there been, and this is something that I covered with you yesterday, has there been any discussions with any federal agencies about a potential partnership under this bill?

HOLLAND: No.

ORTEGA: And what are the methods for identifying northbound, southbound, and intrastate criminal activity associated with drug trafficking, trafficking of persons, and other organized criminal activity? How are they going to be identified through training or—do you know?

HOLLAND: As identified by the current training practices of the Department of Public Safety of Texas.

ORTEGA: Okay, so that's something that's going to be left open? There is a specific definition already for that?

HOLLAND: It's something that our state troopers already do today.

ORTEGA: And it's defined somehow in their policies?

HOLLAND: Yes.

ORTEGA: Thank you, sir. Thank you for answering the questions.

REPRESENTATIVE ROMERO: Chairman Holland, are you familiar with 287(g) programs, where local law enforcement works with ICE?

HOLLAND: I'm not familiar with those programs, sir.

ROMERO: Those programs allow the state and local law enforcement to work together—they train together. So back to the question that Representative Ortega asked: Is there no coordination, even the training in your bill, with CBP or any other federal agency?

HOLLAND: Mr. Romero, this bill is about an eight-hour refresher course on Texas-Mexico border peace officer response. It's not about anything other than providing our local law enforcement agencies and sheriff's departments an additional tool in their toolbox to train and to help with policies and procedures as consistent with Department of Public Safety training.

ROMERO: I understand. But since we're talking about the Texas-Mexico border, is it your understanding that it's only the federal government's responsibility to enforce the crossing of our border?

HOLLAND: Yes, it is the federal government's responsibility to defend our southern borders which affect all Texans—all 30 million Texans—regardless of where they live in the state or what county they reside. But once crime happens on our side, it is our responsibility to make sure that we are providing the tools and resources to all law enforcement to handle that in the manner in which would be consistent with—

ROMERO: And what type of crime would you be describing?

HOLLAND: All crime.

ROMERO: Can you give me an example? If they're fighting crime, what type of crime do you think that our law enforcement officers are going to be trained in to combat? And the reason for that question—well, go ahead and answer that first.

HOLLAND: The answer to your question is drug trafficking, human trafficking, criminal activity, theft.

ROMERO: You're talking about once we're on the Texas side? You're talking about well into the state or you're talking about along the Texas border?

HOLLAND: All throughout the state. The Texas-Mexico border happens to be in the southern part of our state, but all crime and all encroachment on our state happens and affects even where you and I live in the North Texas area.

ROMERO: So this training is going to be for all law enforcement officers?

HOLLAND: It is an optional training program for any local, or sheriff's, department that would like to participate in an eight-hour refresher on border operations training, so that they can be consistent with what we already teach our Department of Public Safety officers.

ROMERO: You went back to border operations, so that's what I'm getting at with that question. Since it's a federal responsibility to enforce our border laws, but yet there's no coordination with the federal government—CBP and so on since it's currently their role along the border. It's not your intent for them to be acting as border patrol officers, is that correct?

HOLLAND: No.

ROMERO: And I also asked about 287(g) as an example of the type of coordination that happens between the federal agencies. One of the things that you had here is northbound-southbound interstate criminal activity in that training. You specifically talked about drug trafficking and trafficking of persons. Will there be any training in trafficking of firearms?

HOLLAND: The Department of Public Safety in their current training practices for troopers and other law enforcement would be helping with local agencies on identification of trafficking. It would be all criminal activity, Representative Romero.

ROMERO: You specifically pointed out drug trafficking and trafficking of persons. I think when we talk about the cartels and them being armed, that would be something that we would consider. Do you feel that's important? That we should also, in training our officers, that we should train them in—

HOLLAND: On the first page of the bill: "criminal activity occurring along the Texas-Mexico border including drug trafficking, trafficking of persons, and other activity carried out by cartels, transnational gangs, and other groups engaged in organized criminal activity."

ROMERO: I actually don't know the term for folks that sell guns. What if we have somebody moving guns from the U.S. into Mexico to feed those into the hands of the cartels, is that something that we should be concerned with as well?

HOLLAND: I think we're very concerned about that.

- (d) For purposes of this section, a person personally appears before a notary public if:
- (1) for a notarization other than an online notarization, the person physically appears before the notary public at the time of the notarization in a manner that permits the notary public and the person to see, hear, communicate with, and provide proof of identification to each other; and
- (2) for an online notarization, the person appears at the time of the notarization by an interactive two-way video and audio conference technology that meets the standards adopted for online notarization under Section 406.104.
- (5) On page 3, line 5, between "reappointment." and "The", insert "The rules may not require a person to complete more than two hours of education for appointment or two hours of continuing education for reappointment as a notary public."

CSHB 3657 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE SCHOFIELD: We heard this bill in our committee and I certainly applaud your efforts to end some of the fraud that's been going on. As you know, a lot of information and sometimes not exactly accurate information, circulates around the building. One of which was that this was a vendor bill and the training that was prescribed would be for a vendor. So I just wanted to ask you a couple questions. The way I understand Subsection (d) on page 3 of your bill, it simply says the secretary of state will adopt rules regarding the training. There is no limiting language in here that would make it so it only applied to one vendor, or even a class of vendors, and the secretary of state could decide to do it themselves. Is that your understanding of how Subsection (d) works?

REPRESENTATIVE ANCHÍA: Yes, thank you for the question. In fact, the secretary of state is already planning on doing this themselves and offering it online. There will be an online quiz. So this is not a business opportunity for anybody. We have been working intimately with the Secretary of State's office to make sure that they are going to do this in-house.

SCHOFIELD: And with the amendment that you just took on the bill, the amount of time is lowered to the point where a notary wouldn't necessarily have to leave work. They could do it over their lunch hour and make sure they catch up on the latest training? Is that correct?

ANCHÍA: Precisely.

SCHOFIELD: Thank you for bringing the bill.

CSHB 4419 - POINT OF ORDER

Representative Tinderholt raised a point of order against further consideration of **CSHB 4419** under Rule 4, Section 40, and Rule 11, Section 2, of the House Rules. The speaker overruled the point of order, announcing his decision to the house as follows:

Mr. Tinderholt raises a point of order against further consideration of **CSHB 4419** under Rule 4, Section 40, and Rule 11, Section 2, on the grounds that the committee substitute is not germane to the original bill.

The original bill made extensive changes to current law to provide financial incentives to encourage film and television production in this state, including, among other things, amendments to the major events reimbursement program as a source of funding for tax rebates. The substitute creates additional funding programs for additional tax rebates, and Mr. Tinderholt argues that their inclusion renders the substitute not germane.

The analysis of a substitute's germaneness is not a mechanical one. A committee substitute may take a different approach than that of the original so long as each of the elements of the committee substitute fall within the subject of the original bill. 75 H. Jour. 1331 (1997). That is precisely the case here. The substitute is germane.

Accordingly, the point of order is respectfully overruled.
