HR 945, In memory of Pope Francis.

Representative Anchía addressed the house, speaking as follows:

It is with deep, deep reverence that I present this resolution honoring the life and the legacy of Pope Francis. People across the world will come together to grieve his passing at his funeral, which will be this Saturday at St. Peter's Basilica. I'm so pleased to be joined by not only devout Catholics on this house floor but also people from all faith traditions, which is a way that the pope, I think, would want to be remembered.

Pope Francis was a transformational leader. He was a shepherd who guided not just the faithful but people of all backgrounds through his message of love and humility and mercy. He was born Jorge Mario Bergoglio in Buenos Aires, Argentina, and he entered the priesthood in 1969. He became not only the first Latin American pope but the first Jesuit. And for those of you who know, I am also Basque. The Jesuit order was founded in the Basque country, so we're extremely proud of this Jesuit pope. And it marked a historic moment for all of the Americas.

Something I always admired about Pope Francis is that he modeled his papacy after St. Francis of Assisi. He not only asked us to be right with that "vertical Jesus" that oftentimes we pray directly to above, but he asked us to do the harder work of being right with the "horizontal Jesus"—the Jesus that is in all of us. Because when we pray just directly, oftentimes we hear what we want to hear. But it is truly in this hard work—the hard work that the pope did, asking us to be right with the "horizontal Jesus"—that interaction among and honoring of that which is good and right and just and love in all of us. Pope Francis never sought power or prestige or pageantry. Instead, he redefined what leadership could look like in the modern world—one rooted in compassion, in lifting up the poor, healing division, and building unity across all nations.

And his legacy is not just in what he did but how he did it—perfecting the teachings of our Lord and savior, Jesus Christ. With his recent passing, we also recognize the important role that Texas now plays in the Catholic Church globally. Cardinal Kevin Farrell, who many of you from North Texas will remember as former bishop of Dallas, was appointed by Pope Francis himself and is the current camerlengo. He not only certified the pope's death, but he is now serving as the head of the Vatican until a new pontiff is elected. And also Cardinal Daniel DiNardo, who is the archbishop of Galveston-Houston, and he's going to be voting in the upcoming election of the new pontiff as well. So we're immensely proud of these two Catholic faith leaders with deep ties to Texas.

I also want to thank the Texas Catholic Conference of Bishops. For those in the gallery, I ask you to please stand and be recognized. I know that you're here. Hi, Jennifer, welcome. As a Catholic, I can personally say that the pope's teachings centered in mercy, peace, and the dignity of every human being have touched my life and the lives of so many of my devout colleagues here on the house floor. So I ask, members, that you please join me in prayer to close.

Dear heavenly Father, we don't deserve your goodness. Yet, every day you pour your blessings into our lives. Today, we lift up all those mourning the death of Pope Francis. We grant them peace in their sorrow and hope in their faith. We

pray for wisdom and unity for those tasked with selecting the next leader of the Catholic Church. And as we go about our days, I ask that you soften our hearts and help us see others through your eyes. May we act with kindness, courage, and compassion, just as Pope Francis did. Let us, too, be instruments of peace and hope in the world. In your name we pray. Amen.

HB 2216 ON THIRD READING

(by Hull, Rose, Dutton, Richardson, Gates, et al.)

HB 2216, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to procedures and grounds related to the removal and placement of children, including for terminating the parent-child relationship, for taking possession of a child, and for certain hearings in a suit affecting the parent-child relationship filed by a governmental entity.

HB 2216 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE HULL: Members, this bill brings the gold standard to all Texas families involved in our CPS system.

REPRESENTATIVE HOWARD: I'm sorry. I looked for you ahead of time to talk to you about a few things, and I didn't see you. So I'm going to ask a couple of questions, if I may, please. And I think the bill is great. I support the bill, and I definitely appreciate your efforts here. My concern has to do with the lack of funding to support the services that are required to support these families. Because we want these families to stay together, right?

HULL: Yes, we do. And our amendment yesterday helps to clarify that. So it is within the department—whatever their means are. No matter how much money it is that they have, it is active efforts within their means.

HOWARD: And I appreciate that. What I'm trying to figure out here is "active efforts within their means"—which includes helping parents access housing, treatment, and services—when the fiscal note does not fund any of these supports. What happens when those services simply do not exist in the community, especially within CPS's short investigation timeline?

HULL: So again, we, one, extended the runway, so they have until January 1st of 2027. And it is all within their means. So they can just show to the court—again, it's active efforts with what they're capable of doing. If they're not capable of providing something, then they are not dinged for that.

HOWARD: How do you envision DFPS meeting the heightened obligations of **HB 2216**—such as providing and documenting active efforts, coordinating family meetings, and supporting indigent representation within existing resources—when even the scaled-down fiscal note acknowledges the need for hundreds of new FTEs and millions in additional dollars to be spent?

HULL: Yeah, so I think that goes back to, again, extending the runway. And because ICWA already exists, there is already a handbook on all of this. It is already all laid out for them.

HOWARD: If DFPS is unable to meet the burden of proving active efforts, children may be placed in permanent managing conservatorships rather than being reunified or adopted. Wouldn't this, in the long run, increase the number of children in foster care and drive up state costs, contrary to the amendment's goal of limiting spending?

HULL: No, it would not. There are a lot of options that they have at their disposal, including PCSPs. Depending on the situation, they can do kick-out orders. There are a lot of different options that they have at their disposal to prevent all of that, and then they can show that they made those active efforts, and they would have all of the evidence there.

HOWARD: What is the expectation for counties already in crisis due to attorney shortages? Should counties absorb the costs of more hearings and more appointments with no additional help?

HULL: Most counties are already doing this. So for most of them, it should not be an issue.

HOWARD: I believe there was a request for significant additional funding that was not provided in our appropriations, so I think there is some concern that some counties have about that. Have you or your team modeled the long-term fiscal impact of implementing **HB 2216** without service investments? Specifically how much more the state might spend over time on extended foster care placements, litigation, or unmanaged caseloads.

HULL: Well, there's several things: One, I don't believe that this will mean more children in foster care. This is the best possible option to keep children at home when it is safe, and there will be removals when it is necessary. So I don't believe that we will have those outcomes.

HOWARD: Do you see a path forward to couple these reforms with an appropriation or implementation plan—either this session or in a supplemental—to avoid burdening DFPS and counties beyond their breaking point?

HULL: Yes, so again, that's why we extended the runway—to give them the time to see how all of this will be implemented. We know that across the state, all of these regions—with CBC, we already know, and those providers know, where the shortages are. And so we are expecting—again, with this extended runway—to be able to have a better idea of what DFPS needs. And they can come back next session and, hopefully, get more money. But, again, that's why we clarified in the bill with the amendment yesterday that it is all within their means—no matter what is appropriated. We are not expecting them to do things that are not feasible or possible for them.

HOWARD: Thank you, Chair Hull. One last question. This bill was written to make the system fairer and safer for families, which it does, and I really appreciate your efforts here. But if the state refuses to fund the services or staffing required, is there a risk that this reform becomes a costly procedural layer that increases complexity, delays permanency, and inflates the foster care population instead of reducing it?

HULL: No, I do not believe so at all. Again, it is all within their means, and raising these standards will help families—all families—in Texas.

HOWARD: I very much appreciate your efforts, and I'll be supporting your bill.

REPRESENTATIVE FRANK: I just want to follow up on a couple of things that Representative Howard was bringing up in terms of money that the counties might need and that the agency might need. So over the last four years, have the number of kids in foster care gone up or down?

HULL: Down.

FRANK: By about 40 percent?

HULL: Yes.

FRANK: So the number of kids in foster care has gone down by 40 percent, but the budget of the Department of Family and Protective Services has not gone down, right?

HULL: Correct.

FRANK: And so the number of people there that can be redeployed—and I realize that takes a while, to redeploy, and our caseloads have gotten a lot better. But they should be able to provide some of, if not all of, the services with existing staff if the number of kids has gone down 40 percent. Would you agree with that?

HULL: I do agree, yes.

FRANK: They're doing great work, and we've made some major changes. And that agency is doing a great job right now, and so I'm not—but we have made changes. And the same thing with the counties. The counties have had about a 40 percent reduction in number of cases as well. And so should they have some available funds to handle this without us sending them more funds?

HULL: Yes, they should.

The speaker sustained the point of order, announcing his decision to the house as follows:

Mr. Bryant raises a point of order against further consideration of **HB 796** under Rule 8, Section 1(a)(1), on the grounds that the caption of the bill fails to give reasonable notice of its subject.

The bill establishes a new joint legislative committee with powers that are not merely advisory, including the ability to submit determinations of unconstitutional federal actions that must be voted on by each house. The definition of "unconstitutional federal action" is not limited solely to those actions impinging on state sovereignty. The legal effect of the committee's validly approved determination is also not limited solely to such actions. While a caption is not required to detail every element of a bill (78 H. Jour. 1676 (2003)), the bill's short title does not accurately describe the activities authorized by the bill, and thus it does not comply with the rule. See 86 H. Jour. 1818 (2019).

Accordingly, the point of order is well-taken and sustained, and the bill is returned to the Committee on State Affairs for further action. 74 H. Jour. 2185-2186 (1995).

HB 2001, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to increasing the criminal penalties for insider trading and other misuse of official information.

HB 2001 - POINT OF ORDER

Representative Little raised a point of order against further consideration of **HB 2001** under Rule 8, Section 1(a)(1), of the House Rules.

The speaker sustained the point of order, announcing his decision to the house as follows:

Mr. Little raises a point of order against further consideration of **HB 2001** under Rule 8, Section 1(a)(1), on the grounds that the caption of the bill fails to give reasonable notice of the subject of the proposed measure.

The caption uses the term "insider trading" to refer to misuses of official information that result in a financial gain to the public servant. That term, however, is not used in the body of the bill or, indeed, in the Penal Code in reference to the prohibited activity causing the gain. The reader must therefore rely on the colloquial meaning of the term, which is misleading to the legislature and the public regarding the subject of the bill. See 80 H. Jour. 2433 (2007).

Accordingly, the point of order is well-taken and sustained, and the bill is returned to the Committee on State Affairs for further action. 74 H. Jour. 2185-2186 (1995).

HB 2001 was returned to the Committee on State Affairs.

HB 2798, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to disclosures and other requirements concerning virtual currency kiosk transactions; authorizing a fee.

Amendment No. 1

(2) On page 2, line 9, between "purchase" and "currency", insert "virtual".

(3) On page 6, line 21, between "amount" and "of", insert "in fiat currency that is equal to the value of the amount".

(4) On page 7, between lines 21 and 22, add the following appropriately numbered SECTION to the bill and renumber subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

SECTION _____. A virtual currency kiosk operator is not required to comply with Chapter 161, Finance Code, as added by this Act, until September 1, 2026.

Amendment No. 2

Representative Capriglione offered the following amendment to Amendment No. 1:

Amend Amendment No. 1 by Capriglione to **HB 2798** (house committee report) on page 1 of the amendment, by striking Item (3) of the amendment on lines 8 and 9 and substituting the following:

(3) Strike page 6, line 16 through page 7, line 4, and substitute the following:

Sec. 161.007. COMPLAINT AND REPORT; FEE REFUND. (a) Not later than the 14th day after the date that a customer enters into a virtual currency kiosk transaction, if the customer believes the transaction was fraudulently induced, the customer may file a complaint with:

(1) the operator of the virtual currency kiosk on which the transaction was completed; and

(2) an appropriate law enforcement agency or state agency.

(b) A law enforcement agency or state agency that receives a complaint under Subsection (a) shall:

(1) investigate the complaint; and

(2) provide a report to the customer and the operator of the virtual currency kiosk stating whether or not the virtual currency kiosk transaction was fraudulently induced.

(c) If the report provided under Subsection (b) states that a virtual currency kiosk transaction was fraudulently induced, the operator of the virtual currency kiosk shall issue to the customer a refund for any fees charged by the operator in association with the transaction.
