## CSSB 9 - RULES SUSPENDED TIME LIMITS

Speaker Burrows addressed the house, speaking as follows:

Members, without objection, on **CSSB 9**, the chair is going to allow 40 minutes for opening debate, with one extension of time for 10 minutes. The first 20 minutes of opening debate will be uninterrupted and divided between the members involved in developing the committee substitute for the bill. During the second 20 minutes and any extension, members will be permitted to ask questions of those members.

  - (7) Strike page 16, lines 6 through 8, and substitute the following:
  - (f-1) In an appeal filed under Subsection (a)(7), a court of appeals shall:
    - (1) conduct a de novo review of all issues presented;
    - (2) expedite the appeal; and
    - (3) issue an order not later than the 20th day after the date the appeal is
  - (8) Strike page 23, line 26, through page 24, line 4.

- (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), a magistrate described by Articles 2A.151(5)-(14) may modify, but may not reduce, the amount or conditions of bond set by a judge of a district court, including the judge of a district court in a different county, pursuant to a written referral from the judge who set the bond. A referral made under this subsection:
  - (1) may only apply to a single defendant; and
  - (2) must be limited in duration.
- (c) A judge may not make referrals under Subsection (b) in a manner that has the effect of transferring to a magistrate or magistrates a substantial portion of the judge's powers and duties related to modifying bond amounts and conditions.

- (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this constitution, a person to whom this section applies shall be denied bail pending trial if a judge or magistrate determines after a hearing that the attorney representing the state has demonstrated that:
- (1) probable cause exists to believe that the person engaged in conduct constituting an offense described by Subsection (a) of this section; and
  - (2) the person:
- (A) was previously convicted of an offense described by Subsection (a) of this section; or
- (B) at the time of the new offense, was released on bail for an offense described by Subsection (a) of this section.
- (c) At a hearing described by this section, a person is entitled to be represented by counsel.
- (3) On page 3, line 16, between "felony" and the period, insert "and requiring the denial of bail to persons accused of certain offenses punishable as a felony who have previously been convicted of or who were released on bail for certain offenses punishable as a felony at the time of the new offense".

### Amendment No. 2 - Point of Order

Representative Moody raised a point of order against further consideration of Amendment No. 2 under Rule 11, Section 2, of the House Rules. The speaker sustained the point of order, announcing his decision to the house as follows:

Mr. Moody raises a point of order against further consideration of the Little Amendment (Amendment No. 2) under Rule 11, Section 2, on the grounds that the amendment is not germane to the joint resolution.

Both the joint resolution and the amendment limit the discretion of judges in setting bail. However, the amendment impermissibly expands the scope of the resolution to effectively eliminate judicial discretion. It does this by making the probable cause supporting an accused's arrest, together with the accused's prior criminal history, conclusive facts absolutely prohibiting the granting of bail.

Because the amendment negates the discretion granted by the resolution and is not related to the conditions required in the resolution, it is not germane. (See 88 H. Jour. 3775 (2023).

Accordingly, the point of order is well-taken and sustained.

The ruling precluded further consideration of Amendment No. 2.

- (4) an animal under the supervision of a peace officer, corrections officer, or jailer, if the person knows the animal is being used for law enforcement, corrections, prison or jail security, or investigative purposes;
- (5) the transmission of a communication over a citizen's band radio channel, the purpose of which communication is to inform or inquire about an emergency;
- (6) an officer with responsibility for animal control in a county or municipality, while the officer is performing a duty or exercising authority imposed or granted under Chapter 821 or 822, Health and Safety Code; [ef]
  - (7) a person who:
- (A) has responsibility for assessing, enacting, or enforcing public health, environmental, radiation, or safety measures for the state or a county or municipality;

- (B) is investigating a particular site as part of the person's responsibilities under Paragraph (A);
- (C) is acting in accordance with policies and procedures related to the safety and security of the site described by Paragraph (B); and
- (D) is performing a duty or exercising authority imposed or granted under the Agriculture Code, Health and Safety Code, Occupations Code, or Water Code; or
- (8) a person who is an employee or agent of a utility while the person is performing a duty within the scope of that employment or agency.
  - (e) In this section:
- (1) "Emergency" [, "emergency"] means a condition or circumstance in which an individual is or is reasonably believed by the person transmitting the communication to be in imminent danger of serious bodily injury or in which property is or is reasonably believed by the person transmitting the communication to be in imminent danger of damage or destruction.

- (I) a retail water or sewer utility service, as defined by Section 13.002, Water Code.

- (g) The commission may impose an administrative penalty under Section 15.023 against a municipally owned utility or electric cooperative for a violation of this section or a rule adopted under this section.

**CSHB 142**, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to the Health and Human Services Commission's office of inspector general, the review of certain Medicaid claims, and the recovery of certain overpayments under Medicaid.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 544.0106, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 544.0106. PROCUREMENT OF [CONTRACT FOR REVIEW OF INVESTIGATIVE FINDINGS BY] QUALIFIED EXPERT ON BEHALF OF OFFICE OF INSPECTOR GENERAL. A qualified expert retained by the commission on behalf of the office of inspector general is considered an expert witness for purposes of Section 2151.005 [(a) If the commission does not receive any responsive bids under Chapter 2155 on a competitive solicitation for the services of a qualified expert to review investigative findings under Section 544.0104 or 544.0105 and the number of contracts to be awarded under this subsection is not otherwise limited, the commission may negotiate with and award a contract for the services to a qualified expert on the basis of:

- [(1) the contractor's agreement to a set fee, either as a range or lump sum amount; and
- [(2) the contractor's affirmation and the office of inspector general's verification that the contractor possesses the necessary occupational licenses and experience].
- [(b) Notwithstanding Sections 2155.083 and 2261.051, a contract awarded under Subsection (a) is not subject to competitive advertising and proposal evaluation requirements.]

SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 544, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 544.0115 to read as follows:

- Sec. 544.0115. PERMITTED DISCLOSURE OF CERTAIN INFORMATION. For purposes of performing the duties of the office of inspector general under this subchapter, the office may disclose information obtained in the course of conducting the office's administrative oversight activities to:
  - (1) a federal, state, or local governmental entity, including:
    - (A) a federal agency or an agency of this state or another state;
- (B) the criminal, civil, or administrative department, division, bureau, or other entity with enforcement or prosecutorial authority of:
  - (i) this state;
  - (ii) the United States;
  - (iii) another state; or
  - (iv) a local governmental entity of this state or another state;

and

- (C) a political subdivision of this state; or
- (2) a person authorized by the office to receive the information.

SECTION 3. Section 544.0153(b), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) Except as required by federal law, to [To] determine a health care professional's eligibility to participate as a Medicaid provider, the office of inspector general may not conduct a fingerprint-based criminal history record information check of a health care professional who the office has confirmed under Subsection (a) is licensed and in good standing. This subsection does not prohibit the office from conducting a criminal history record information check of a provider that is required or appropriate for other reasons, including for conducting an investigation of fraud, waste, or abuse.

SECTION 4. Section 544.0202(b), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

- (b) The commission shall:
- (1) aggressively publicize successful fraud prosecutions and fraud-prevention programs through all available means, including the use of statewide press releases; and
- (2) ensure that the commission or a health and human services agency maintains and promotes an appropriate communications system [a toll free telephone hotline] for reporting suspected fraud in programs the commission or a health and human services agency administers.

SECTION 5. Section 544.0504, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 544.0504. RECOVERY AUDIT CONTRACTORS. (a) To the extent required under Section 1902(a)(42), Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section 1396a(a)(42)), the commission shall establish a program under which the commission contracts with one or more recovery audit contractors to:

- (1) identify Medicaid underpayments and overpayments, including underpayments and overpayments under the Medicaid managed care program; and
  - (2) recover the overpayments.
- (b) An overpayment under Subsection (a)(2) may be recovered from either the provider or the managed care organization.
  - (c) A recovery audit contractor may not:
    - (1) initiate a review of a claim unless:
      - (A) the office of inspector general or the office's designee:
        - (i) determines that the review would be cost-effective; and
        - (ii) approves the review; and
- (B) at least one year has elapsed since the date the claim was received; or
- (2) initiate a recovery effort on a claim if a managed care organization has notified the office of inspector general that the organization is auditing the claim.
- (d) On request by a recovery audit contractor or the office of inspector general, a managed care organization or provider who is the subject of a review conducted under this section shall submit to the contractor or office all

information necessary to perform the review not later than the date specified in the request. All information and materials obtained under this section are confidential under Section 544.0259(e).

- (e) The executive commissioner by rule shall adopt a process for appeals related to overpayments identified by a recovery audit contractor under this section.
- (f) The commission may contract with a third party to administer Subsection (b) or the appeals process adopted under Subsection (e).
- (g) The executive commissioner, in consultation with the office of inspector general, may adopt rules necessary to implement this section.

SECTION 6. The following provisions of the Government Code are repealed:

- (1) Section 544.0201; and
- (2) Section 544.0252(a).

SECTION 7. If before implementing any provision of this Act a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the waiver or authorization is granted.

SECTION 8. The Health and Human Services Commission is required to implement a provision of this Act only if the legislature appropriates money specifically for that purpose. If the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that purpose, the commission may, but is not required to, implement a provision of this Act using other money available to the commission for that purpose.

SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

  - [(5)] the State Health Services Council.

- (3) developing a consistent engagement model for communicating with legal advocates involved in child protective investigations and courts presiding over child protective services cases;
- (4) developing and monitoring effective training for all investigative employees;
- $\overline{(5)}$  monitoring compliance with investigation procedures and processes;
- $\overline{(6)}$  developing and implementing a data-informed model for conducting investigations; and
- (7) providing a forum for public input on problems or concerns related to investigations.
  - (b) The advisory committee shall:
    - (1) make recommendations for:
      - (A) conducting child protective investigations;
- (B) monitoring compliance with investigative requirements under state and federal law;
- (C) developing and monitoring the implementation of policies and procedures to protect the due process rights of individuals subject to child abuse or neglect investigations; and
- (D) monitoring the execution of policies and procedures across all department jurisdictions for the subject of an investigation;
  - (2) identify any challenges or barriers to:
- (A) the standardization of child protective investigative practices and procedures; and
- (B) the application and implementation of legal requirements and department investigative policies and procedures in child abuse and neglect investigations;
- (3) make recommendations to address issues identified under Subdivision (2), including any training or other accountability measures required to address those issues;
- (4) identify and monitor challenges related to the department's interaction and collaboration with any external parties that participate in the investigation processes; and

- (5) make recommendations for legal procedures for the operations of parties described by Subdivision (4).
  - (c) The advisory committee is composed of the following members:
- (1) one member of the public appointed by the governor to represent the governor's office who shall serve as chair;
- (2) one member of the public appointed by the lieutenant governor to represent the lieutenant governor's office who shall serve as vice chair;
- (3) one member of the public appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives to represent the speaker's office;
- (4) the department employee charged with oversight of child protective investigations appointed by the commissioner;
  - (5) a regional director of investigations appointed by the commissioner;
- (6) at least one child protective investigations supervisor or investigator appointed by the commissioner from each of the following:
  - (A) a rural region; and
  - (B) an urban region;
- (7) a district judge who has experience presiding over suits affecting the parent-child relationship appointed by the governor;
- (8) one parent or caregiver, who has been involved in a child protective services legal case, appointed by the commissioner; and
- (9) four members appointed by the commissioner with consideration to individuals who have relevant experience as:
  - (A) a county district attorney;
- (B) an attorney assigned to represent caregivers in legal cases involving the department;
- (C) an attorney assigned to represent children or parents in legal cases involving the department;
- (D) an associate judge who hears or has heard child protective legal cases;
  - (E) a state or local law enforcement officer;
- (F) a parent who has been the subject of a child protective investigation;
- (G) an individual who has been in the conservatorship of the department; or
- (H) an individual employed as a consultant to represent the interests of a parent in a child protective investigation.
- (d) In appointing the members of the advisory committee under Subsection (c)(9), the commissioner shall consult with the chair of each standing committee of the legislature with primary jurisdiction over child protective services.
- (e) An individual may not serve on the advisory committee as a member appointed under Subsection (c)(1), (2), (3), (7), (8), or (9) if the individual is:
- (1) employed by a state agency or contracts with the department, child welfare vendors, or behavioral health providers and organizations contracted with the department or the Health and Human Services Commission, notwithstanding approved department or judicial personnel; or

- (2) related within the third degree of consanguinity to individuals who work at the department or for organizations that contract with the department or hold contracts with vendors of the department, including vendors in community-based care.
- (f) Members of the advisory committee shall recuse themselves from the committee's deliberation regarding recommendations that directly relate to a case that involves the member. Members of the advisory committee who are employed by the department serve as nonvoting members.
- (g) The chair of the advisory committee shall direct the advisory committee and the department shall provide administrative support and resources to the advisory committee as necessary for the advisory committee to perform the advisory committee's duties under this section.
- (h) The advisory committee shall meet quarterly in Austin or at another location determined by the chair. A meeting of the advisory committee is subject to Chapter 551, Government Code. The advisory committee may conduct a closed meeting in accordance with Subchapter E, Chapter 551, Government Code, to discuss information related to a case under review by the committee under Subsection (i). The advisory committee shall:
- (1) provide a period for public comment during at least one public meeting each year;
- (2) present recommendations made under this section to improve the quality and consistency of child protective investigations; and
- (3) post public notice for meetings conducted for the sole purpose of reviewing cases under Subsection (i).
- (i) The department shall provide a random sample of closed child protective investigations for advisory committee review. The department shall, in accordance with this section, provide relevant case information to enable the advisory committee to review the case. The information provided to the advisory committee under this subsection may not include identifying information for individuals involved in the investigation, including an individual's name, address, or date of birth.
- (j) The following is confidential and not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552:
- (1) any information provided to the advisory committee regarding a child protective investigation;
- (2) information from investigation records, including the department's determinations as a result of the investigation; and
  - (3) advisory committee work product.
- (k) The department shall adopt and implement procedures to ensure that confidential information is not disclosed in violation of this section.
- (1) Not later than September 30 of each year, the advisory committee shall submit a report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, members of the legislature, and the commissioner. The department shall publish the report on the department's Internet website. The

report must include the following information for the state and for each department region for the two state fiscal years preceding the state fiscal year in which the report is published:

- (1) the number of:
- (A) phone calls made to the agency that resulted in an investigation for child abuse or neglect;
  - (B) completed investigations for child abuse or neglect;
  - (C) each type of case disposition;
  - (D) administrative closures;
  - (E) abbreviated investigations;
  - (F) children removed from the child's home;
  - (G) children placed in foster care;
- (H) cases in which the child was not removed from the child's home but the family received family-based safety services or family preservation services;
  - (I) cases per investigator in unspecialized investigative units; and
  - (J) cases per investigator in specialized investigative units;
- (2) the average employment rate for unspecialized investigators and supervisors and specialized investigators and supervisors;
- (3) the average amount of time to complete investigations for each level of investigation;
- (4) the total number of administrative reviews of investigation findings and the results of those investigations for that year;
- (5) the number of complaints filed with the office of consumer affairs of the department and the Office of Inspector General;
  - (6) any identified challenges to:
    - (A) the standardization of an investigative training program; and
- (B) the application and implementation in the field or of legal requirements and department investigative policies and procedures in child abuse and neglect investigations;
- (7) the committee's recommendations for improving any identified challenges under Subdivision (6), including any human resource accountability measures to address those issues; and
- (8) recommendations for legislative or other action related to human resource accountability measures for individuals investigating or supervising the investigation of cases of suspected child abuse or neglect.
- (m) The advisory committee is abolished and this section expires on September 1, 2029.
- SECTION 7. Effective September 1, 2026, Sections 40.045(e) and (i), Human Resources Code, are amended to read as follows:
- (e) Not later than March 1 of the state fiscal year in which an efficiency audit is required under this section, the commissioner, in collaboration with [the council,] the department's chief financial officer[,] and the department's internal audit director, shall select an external auditor to conduct the efficiency audit.

(i) Not later than November 1 of the calendar year an efficiency audit is conducted, the auditor shall prepare and submit a report of the audit and recommendations for efficiency improvements to the governor, the Legislative Budget Board, the state auditor, the commissioner, [the council,] and the chairs of the House Human Services Committee and the Senate Health and Human Services Committee.

SECTION 8. Effective September 1, 2026, the following provisions of the Human Resources Code are repealed:

- (1) Section 40.001(2-a);
- (2) Section 40.021;
- (3) Section 40.022;
- (4) Section 40.023;
- (5) Section 40.024;
- (6) Section 40.025; and
- (7) Section 40.026.

**CSHB 29**, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to water losses reported by certain municipally owned utilities to the Texas Water Development Board; authorizing administrative penalties.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 16, Water Code, is amended by adding Section 16.0122 to read as follows:

- Sec. 16.0122. WATER AUDIT VALIDATION BY CERTAIN MUNICIPALLY OWNED UTILITIES. (a) In this section, "municipally owned utility" has the meaning assigned by Section 13.002.
- (b) This section applies only to a municipally owned utility that provides potable water through more than 150,000 service connections.
- (c) A municipally owned utility that has filed an annual water audit under Section 16.0121 shall:
- (1) not later than the 180th day after the date the audit was filed, complete a validation of the audit to ensure the utility accurately assessed potential inaccuracies in data used in the audit; and
- (2) not later than the first anniversary of the date the audit was filed, develop and submit to the board a water loss mitigation plan.
- (d) Not later than December 31, 2030, and every 10 years thereafter, a municipally owned utility that has filed an annual water audit under Section 16.0121 shall:
- (1) complete a more detailed validation of the utility's most current water audit to:

- (A) determine whether the implementation of water leakage reduction strategies is appropriate; and
  - (B) investigate the accuracy of the utility's billing data; and
- (2) update the water loss mitigation plan developed by the utility under Subsection (c)(2) accordingly.
- (e) Each validation required under Subsection (c)(1) must be performed by a person who has completed water audit validation training and is certified to conduct the validation. The validation:
  - (1) must follow board validation guidelines; and
- (2) may not be conducted by a board staff member or the person who submitted the water audit.
- (f) Each water loss mitigation plan developed under Subsection (c)(2), as updated under Subsection (d)(2), if applicable, must be incorporated into the utility's most recent water conservation plan required under Section 13.146 not later than the first anniversary of the date the mitigation plan is completed. As part of the utility's annual water conservation report under Section 16.402(b), the utility shall report the utility's progress in implementing the mitigation plan. The mitigation plan must include:
- (1) one-year, three-year, five-year, and ten-year goals for water loss mitigation;
- (2) descriptions of water loss mitigation projects or programs designed to meet those goals;
- (3) estimated financial savings from the implementation of the projects or programs under Subdivision (2);
- (4) estimated water savings from the implementation of the projects or programs under Subdivision (2); and
- (5) cost estimates for implementing each project or program under Subdivision (2).
- (g) If the utility must complete a validation under Subsection (d)(1), the utility shall update the water loss mitigation plan developed by the utility under Subsection (c)(2) to revise the utility's one-year, three-year, five-year, and ten-year goals.
- (h) Each validation required under Subsection (d)(1) must be performed by a person who is experienced in performing required validation activities. The validation:
- $\underline{(1)}$  must be based on the recommendations from the utility's validation performed under Subsection (c)(1);
- (2) must be completed in consultation with the person who completed the validation under Subsection (c)(1);
  - (3) must be conducted in accordance with industry standards; and
- (4) may not be conducted by a board staff member or the person who submitted the water audit.
- (i) The commission shall assess against a municipally owned utility an administrative penalty of \$25,000 if the utility fails to develop and submit to the board a water loss mitigation plan required by Subsection (c)(2).

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

SECTION 1. Section 266.012(a), Family Code, is amended to read as follows:

- (a) Not later than the 45th day after the date a child enters the conservatorship of the department, the child shall receive:
- - (A) [(1)] a screening for trauma; and
- (B) (2) interviews with individuals who have knowledge of the child's needs; and
- (2) a screening for risk of commercial sexual exploitation using a validated, evidenced-informed tool selected by the Child Sex Trafficking Prevention Unit established under Section 772.0062, Government Code, if:
- (A) validation guidelines based on the child's age indicate the screening is appropriate; or
  - (B) concerns of commercial sexual exploitation exist.

SECTION 2. Section 221.003(b), Human Resources Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) A juvenile probation department must, before the disposition of a child's case and using a validated risk and needs assessment instrument or process provided or approved by the department, complete a risk and needs assessment for each child under the jurisdiction of the juvenile probation department. The risk and needs assessment must include a screening for risk of commercial sexual exploitation using a validated, evidence-informed tool selected by the Child Sex Trafficking Prevention Unit established under Section 772.0062, Government Code.

SECTION 3. The Department of Family and Protective Services and the Texas Juvenile Justice Department are required to implement a provision of this Act only if the legislature appropriates money to the respective department specifically for that purpose. If the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that purpose, the Department of Family and Protective Services and the Texas Juvenile Justice Department may, but are not required to, implement a provision of this Act using other money available for that purpose.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

**CSHB 3809**, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to the removal of battery energy storage facilities.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Title 6, Utilities Code, is amended by adding Chapter 303 to read as follows:

CHAPTER 303. BATTERY ENERGY STORAGE FACILITY AGREEMENTS

Sec. 303.0001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

- (1) "Battery energy storage facility" includes:
  - (A) a battery energy storage resource; and
- (B) any facility or equipment necessary to support the operation of a battery energy storage resource, other than a facility or equipment owned by an electric utility, as defined by Section 31.002.
- (2) "Battery energy storage facility agreement" means a lease agreement between a grantee and a landowner that authorizes the grantee to operate a battery energy storage facility on the leased property.
- (3) "Battery energy storage resource" means an electrochemical device, whether connected at the transmission or distribution level, with a capacity of one megawatt hour or greater that charges from the grid or a colocated generation resource and discharges that energy at a later time.
- (4) "Battery operation date" means the date on which a battery energy storage resource is first used for its intended purpose.
- (5) "Grantee" means a person, other than an electric utility as defined by Section 31.002, who:
  - (A) leases property from a landowner; and
  - (B) operates a battery energy storage facility on the property.
- (6) "Recycle" means the processing, including disassembling, dismantling, and shredding of battery energy storage cells, modules or other equipment, or their components, to recover a usable product.
- Sec. 303.0002. APPLICABILITY. Except as provided by Section 303.0004(c), this chapter applies only to an agreement that authorizes a grantee to operate a battery energy storage facility that is not subject to Chapter 301 or 302.
- Sec. 303.0003. WAIVER VOID; REMEDIES. (a) A provision of a battery energy storage facility agreement that purports to waive a right or exempt a grantee from a liability or duty established by this chapter is void.
- (b) A person who is harmed by a violation of this chapter is entitled to appropriate injunctive relief to prevent further violation of this chapter.
- (c) The provisions of this section are not exclusive. The remedies provided in this section are in addition to any other procedures or remedies provided by other law.
- Sec. 303.0004. REQUIRED AGREEMENT PROVISIONS ON FACILITY REMOVAL. (a) A battery energy storage facility agreement must provide that the grantee is responsible for removing the battery energy storage facility from the landowner's property and that the grantee shall, in accordance with any other applicable laws or regulations, safely:
- (1) clear, clean, and remove from the property each battery energy storage resource, transformer, and substation installed and owned by the grantee;
- (2) for each foundation installed in the ground for a battery energy storage resource, transformer, or substation installed and owned by the grantee:

- (A) clear, clean, and remove the foundation from the ground to a depth of at least three feet below the surface grade of the land in which the foundation is installed; and
- (B) ensure that each hole or cavity created in the ground by the removal is filled with soil of the same type or a similar type as the predominant soil found on the property;
- (3) for each buried cable, including power, fiber-optic, and communications cables, installed and owned by the grantee:
- (A) clear, clean, and remove the cable from the ground to a depth of at least three feet below the surface grade of the land in which the cable is installed; and
- (B) ensure that each hole or cavity created in the ground by the removal is filled with soil of the same type or a similar type as the predominant soil found on the property; and
- (4) clear, clean, and remove from the property each overhead power or communications line installed and owned by the grantee on the property.
- (b) The agreement must provide that the grantee is responsible for:

  (1) collecting and reusing or recycling, or shipping for reuse or recycling, all components of the battery energy storage facility practicably capable of being reused or recycled, in accordance with any other applicable laws or regulations; and
- (2) properly disposing of components of the battery energy storage facility not practicably capable of being reused or recycled:
- (A) at a facility authorized under state and federal law to dispose of hazardous substances for a component considered hazardous under those laws; or
- (B) for nonhazardous components, at a municipal solid waste landfill or other appropriate waste disposal facility authorized under state and federal law to dispose of that type of component.
- (c) A wind power facility agreement entered into under Chapter 301 or solar power facility agreement entered into under Chapter 302 that authorizes the operation of a battery energy storage facility must include the provisions described by Subsection (b) and the financial assurance required by those chapters must be sufficient to secure the performance of the grantee's obligations under that subsection, in the manner provided by Section 303.0005.
- (d) The agreement must provide that, at the request of the landowner, the grantee shall:
- (1) clear, clean, and remove each road constructed by the grantee on the property; and
- (2) ensure that each hole or cavity created in the ground by the removal is filled with soil of the same type or a similar type as the predominant soil found on the property.
- (e) The agreement must provide that, at the request of the landowner, if reasonable, the grantee shall:
- (1) remove from the property all rocks over 12 inches in diameter excavated during the decommissioning or removal process;

- (2) return the property to a tillable state using scarification, V-rip, or disc methods, as appropriate; and
  - (3) ensure that:
- (A) each hole or cavity created in the ground by the removal is filled with soil of the same type or a similar type as the predominant soil found on the property; and
- (B) the surface is returned as near as reasonably possible to the same condition as before the grantee dug holes or cavities, including by reseeding pastureland with native grasses prescribed by an appropriate governmental agency, if any.
- (f) The landowner shall make a request under Subsection (d) or (e) not later than the 180th day after the later of:
- (1) the date on which the landowner receives from the grantee via certified mail a copy of a notification of intent to suspend operations filed with a grid operator indicating an intent to permanently cease operations; or
- (2) the date the landowner receives written notice of intent to decommission the battery energy storage facility from the grantee.
- Sec. 303.0005. REQUIRED AGREEMENT PROVISIONS ON FINANCIAL ASSURANCE. (a) A battery energy storage facility agreement must provide that the grantee shall obtain and deliver to the landowner evidence of financial assurance that conforms to the requirements of this section to secure the performance of the grantee's obligations under Section 303.0004. Acceptable forms of financial assurance include a parent company guaranty with a minimum investment grade credit rating for the parent company issued by a major domestic credit rating agency, a letter of credit, a bond, or another form of financial assurance reasonably acceptable to the landowner.
- (b) The amount of financial assurance must be at least equal to the estimated amount by which the cost of removing the battery energy storage facilities from the landowner's property, recycling or disposing of all the components of the battery energy storage facilities, and restoring the property to as near as reasonably possible the condition of the property as of the date the agreement begins, as described by Section 303.0004, exceeds the salvage value of the battery energy storage facilities, less any portion of the value of the battery energy storage facilities pledged to secure outstanding debt.
  - (c) The agreement must provide that:
- (1) the estimated cost of removing the battery energy storage facilities from the landowner's property, recycling or disposing of all the components of the battery energy storage facilities, and restoring the property to as near as reasonably possible the condition of the property as of the date the agreement begins, as described by Section 303.0004, and the estimated salvage value of the battery energy storage facilities must be determined by an independent, third-party professional engineer licensed in this state;

- (2) the grantee must deliver to the landowner the estimated cost of removal and recycling or disposal of the battery energy storage facilities and the salvage value on or before the 10th anniversary of the battery operation date of the grantee's battery energy storage resources located on the landowner's property; and
- (3) the grantee must deliver an updated estimate of the cost and salvage value described by Subdivision (2) at least once every five years after the initial estimate for the remainder of the term of the agreement.
- (d) The grantee is responsible for the costs of obtaining financial assurance described by this section and determining the estimated removal, recycling, and disposal costs and salvage value.
- (e) The agreement must provide that the grantee shall deliver financial assurance not later than the earlier of:
- (1) the date the battery energy storage facility agreement is terminated; or
- (2) the 15th anniversary of the battery operation date of the grantee's battery energy storage resources located on the landowner's property.
- (f) The grantee is responsible for ensuring that the amount of financial assurance remains sufficient to cover the amount required by Subsection (b), consistent with the estimates required by this section.
- (g) The grantee may not cancel financial assurance before the date the grantee has completed the grantee's obligation to remove the grantee's battery energy storage facilities located on the landowner's property in the manner provided by this chapter, unless the grantee provides the landowner with replacement financial assurance at the time of or before the cancellation. In the event of a transfer of ownership of the grantee's battery energy storage facilities, financial assurance provided by the grantee shall remain in place until the date evidence of financial assurance meeting the requirements of this chapter is provided to the landowner.

SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to an agreement entered into on or after the effective date of this Act. An agreement entered into before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the agreement was entered into, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Title 4, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is amended by adding Chapter 75C to read as follows:

CHAPTER 75C. LIMITED LIABILITY FOR CAVERN ACTIVITIES

Sec. 75C.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

- (1) "Cavern activity" means an activity inside a cavern at a cavern area for recreational or educational purposes.
- (2) "Cavern activity participant" means an individual, other than an employee of a cavern entity, who engages in a cavern activity.
- (3) "Cavern activity participant injury" means an injury sustained by a cavern activity participant, including bodily injury, emotional distress, death, property damage, or any other loss arising from the person's participation in a cavern activity.
- (4) "Cavern area" means a commercial property with a natural cavern designed to provide cavern access for cavern activities.
- (5) "Cavern entity" means a person engaged in the business of owning or operating a cavern area.
- Sec. 75C.002. LIMITED LIABILITY. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a cavern entity is not liable to any person for a cavern activity participant injury or damages arising out of a cavern activity participant injury if, at the time of the cavern activity participant injury, the warning prescribed by Section 75C.003 was posted in accordance with that section.
  - (b) This section does not limit liability for an injury:
    - (1) proximately caused by:
- (A) the cavern entity's negligence with regard to the safety of the cavern area or cavern activity participant;
- (B) a potentially dangerous condition at the cavern area, including inside the cavern at the cavern area, of which the cavern entity knew or reasonably should have known; or

- (C) the cavern entity's failure to train or improper training of an employee of the cavern entity actively involved in the cavern area or a cavern activity; or
  - $\overline{(2)}$  intentionally caused by the cavern entity.
- (c) A limitation on liability provided by this section to a cavern entity is in addition to other limitations of liability.

Sec. 75C.003. POSTED WARNING. For the purposes of limitation of liability under Section 75C.002(a), a cavern entity must post and maintain a sign in a clearly visible location at each entrance to a cavern at a cavern area. The sign must contain the following language:

### WARNING

# TEXAS LAW (CHAPTER 75C, CIVIL PRACTICE AND REMEDIES CODE) LIMITS THE LIABILITY OF A CAVERN ENTITY FOR INJURIES OR DEATH OF A CAVERN ACTIVITY PARTICIPANT RESULTING FROM A

### CAVERN ACTIVITY.

SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only to a cause of action that accrues on or after the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 11.145, Tax Code, is amended to read as follows:

- Sec. 11.145. INCOME-PRODUCING TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY [HAVING VALUE OF LESS THAN \$2,500]. (a) In this section:
  - (1) "Related business entity" means a business entity that:
- (A) engages in a common business enterprise with at least one other business entity; and
  - (B) owns tangible personal property that:
- (i) is held or used for the production of income as part of the common business enterprise; and
- (ii) is located at the same physical address that tangible personal property owned by at least one other business entity engaged in the common business enterprise is located.
- (2) "Unified business enterprise" means a common business enterprise composed of more than one related business entity.
- (b) Subject to Subsection (f) and except as provided by Subsection (d), a [A] person is entitled to an exemption from taxation by a taxing unit of \$125,000 of the appraised value of the tangible personal property the person owns that is held or used for the production of income and has taxable situs at the same location in the taxing unit [if that property has a taxable value of less than \$2.500].
- (c) [(b)] The exemption provided by Subsection (b) [(a)] applies to each separate location in a taxing unit in which a person holds or uses tangible personal property for the production of income, and, for the purposes of Subsection (b) [(a)], all property that has taxable situs in each separate location in the taxing unit is aggregated to determine taxable value.

- (d) A person who leases tangible personal property is entitled to an exemption from taxation by a taxing unit of \$125,000 of the total appraised value of all the tangible personal property the person owns that is held or used for the production of income and is subject to a lease, regardless of where the property is located in the taxing unit.
- (e) The exemption provided by Subsection (d) applies to each separate taxing unit in which a person holds or uses tangible personal property for the production of income.
- (f) For the purposes of Subsection (b), if a person is a related business entity, all property described by that subsection that has taxable situs at the same location in a taxing unit and that is owned by the person is aggregated with the property described by that subsection that has taxable situs at the same location in the taxing unit and that is owned by each other related business entity that composes the same unified business enterprise to determine taxable value for the entity.
- (g) A chief appraiser may investigate a business entity to determine whether the entity:
  - (1) is a related business entity; and
- (2) has aggregated tangible personal property as provided by Subsection (f).

SECTION 2. Section 22.01, Tax Code, is amended by amending Subsection (c-1) and adding Subsections (j-1), (j-2), (j-3), and (n) to read as follows:

- (c-1) In this section:
- (1) "Related business entity" and "unified business enterprise" have the meanings assigned by Section 11.145.
- (2) "Secured party" has the meaning assigned by Section 9.102, Business & Commerce Code.
- $\underline{(3)}$  [ $\underline{(2)}$ ] "Security interest" has the meaning assigned by Section 1.201, Business & Commerce Code.
- (j-1) Notwithstanding Subsections (a) and (b), a person is required to render tangible personal property the person owns that is held or used for the production of income only if, in the person's opinion and as applicable:

   (1) the aggregate market value of the property that has taxable situs in
- (1) the aggregate market value of the property that has taxable situs in the same location in at least one taxing unit that participates in the appraisal district is greater than the amount exempted under Section 11.145(b); or
- (2) the aggregate market value of the property in at least one taxing unit that participates in the appraisal district is greater than the amount exempted under Section 11.145(d).
- (j-2) A person required to render property for taxation under Subsection (j-1) must render all tangible personal property the person owns that is held or used for the production of income and has taxable situs in the appraisal district. This subsection does not apply to property exempt from taxation under a provision of law other than Section 11.145.
- (j-3) A person who elects not to render property for taxation as authorized by Subsection (j-1) must file a rendition statement or property report that includes a certification that the person reasonably believes that the value of the property is

not more than the amount exempted under Section 11.145(b) or (d), as applicable. The election takes effect beginning with the tax year following the tax year in which the rendition statement or property report is filed and continues in effect until the ownership of the person changes. Notwithstanding Subsection (j-1), a person described by that subsection must render property for taxation if required by the chief appraiser.

(n) A rendition statement of a related business entity must contain the information required by Subsection (a) or (f), as applicable, stated for each related business entity that composes the unified business enterprise of which the related business entity that is the subject of the rendition is a part.

SECTION 3. Section 22.24(c), Tax Code, is amended to read as follows:

(c) The comptroller may prescribe or approve different forms for different kinds of property but shall ensure that each form requires a property owner to furnish the information necessary to identify the property and to determine its ownership, taxability, and situs. Each form must include a box that the property owner may check to permit the property owner to affirm that the information contained in the most recent rendition statement filed by the property owner in a prior tax year is accurate with respect to the current tax year in accordance with Section 22.01(1). Each form must include a box that a property owner that is a related business entity, as defined by Section 11.145, must check to identify the owner as a related business entity. Each form must include a box that a property owner who elects not to render the property for taxation as authorized by Section 22.01(j-1) must check to certify that the owner reasonably believes that the value of the property is not more than the amount exempted under Section 11.145(b) or (d), as applicable. A form may not require but may permit a property owner to furnish information not specifically required by this chapter to be reported. In addition, a form prescribed or approved under this subsection must contain the following statement in bold type: "If you make a false statement on this form, you could be found guilty of a Class A misdemeanor or a state jail felony under Section 37.10, Penal Code."

SECTION 4. This Act applies only to ad valorem taxes imposed for a tax year that begins on or after the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect January 1, 2026, but only if the constitutional amendment proposed by the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, to authorize the legislature to exempt from ad valorem taxation a portion of the market value of tangible personal property a person owns that is held or used for the production of income is approved by the voters. If that amendment is not approved by the voters, this Act has no effect.

### Senate Amendment No. 1 (Senate Floor Amendment No. 1)

Amend **CSHB 9** (senate committee printing) as follows:

- (1) In SECTION 1 of the bill, in amended Section 11.145, Tax Code, between Subsections (d) and (e) of the section (page 1, between lines 59 and 60), insert the following:
- (d-1) Notwithstanding Subsections (b) and (d), a person is entitled to an exemption from taxation by a taxing unit of \$125,000 of the total appraised value of all the tangible personal property the person owns that is held or used for the

production of income in the taxing unit if the property has taxable situs within the taxing unit at any location that is not owned or leased by the owner, regardless of where the property is located within the taxing unit.

- (2) In SECTION 1 of the bill, in added Section 11.145(e), Tax Code (page 1, line 60), strike "The exemption provided by Subsection (d) applies" and substitute "The exemptions provided by Subsections (d) and (d-1) apply".
- (3) In SECTION 2 of the bill, in added Section 22.01(j-1)(2), Tax Code, between "11.145(d)" and the underlined period (page 2, line 36), insert "or (d-1), as applicable".
- (4) In SECTION 2 of the bill, in added Section 22.01(j-3), Tax Code (page 2, line 47), strike "11.145(b) or (d)" and substitute "11.145(b), (d), or (d-1)".
- (5) In SECTION 3 of the bill, in amended Section 22.24(c), Tax Code (page 3, line 8), strike "11.145(b) or (d)" and substitute "11.145(b), (d), or (d-1)".
