HB 1106 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE A. DAVIS: I have some serious concerns for this bill, as it opens the door for mistreatment and abuse of our children. In each of the cases mentioned as precedent, there was severe, heartbreaking abuse involved. The children were not removed simply because their parents refused to affirm their gender identity. In the case mentioned in Indiana, the child had an eating disorder so severe that doctors were concerned about their brain health. In Arizona—a heartbreaking case. That child was not removed because the parents didn't affirm their gender identity. The child was removed because the child confessed that the older brother had been molesting the child in the household since the child was seven years old. That's why the child was removed.

If we allow a bill like this to happen, does this open the door for more abuse of children, like we've seen? The precedents have all shown there is severe abuse happening in those households. It's not because of the affirmation. I really hope we can come together and formulate a bill that does preserve parental rights, but I also want to make sure we prioritize the safety of our children here in Texas.

REPRESENTATIVE WU: Ms. Davis, would it be fair to say that CPS cases and family cases are extremely complex?

A. DAVIS: Absolutely. In each of these cases, it wasn't just cut and dry that those parents didn't want to affirm the gender identity and the child was taken away. There was a lot of abuse that was involved in each of those cases.

WU: In these kinds of cases, DFPS and CPS—in any of these cases—are unlikely to act in that extreme manner unless the allegations were severe.

A. DAVIS: Absolutely. It even says in the court documents that the court doesn't believe a child should be taken away because of the parents' beliefs. It's when that abuse begins to harm the child emotionally and physically that those conversations start to happen about removal.

WU: In fact, the standard of proof—like in Texas and most other states—the standard of proof for removing a child from a family is clear and convincing evidence. So it is higher than normal civil law, which is beyond a reasonable doubt.

A. DAVIS: Correct. And sadly, in a lot of these cases, it was the children who were telling people about the abuse that was happening to them and were asking to be removed from these households.

WU: Does it seem like the advocates for this legislation are cherry-picking what they want to see and hear and ignoring 99 percent of the remaining cases?

A. DAVIS: I hope that we can all come together and formulate strong policies, strong bills, and strong laws that do, like I say, protect parental rights. But this allows abuse of children without really identifying the true cause of what's going on in those households.

WU: Would it be fair to say that the bill author, in deciding on these particular decisions using those incomplete cases, is an arbitrary act?

A. DAVIS: I want to say, in his testimony, that my good friend Representative Shaheen—he's coming from a good place. It's just that the language in this bill is not strong enough to make sure it's actually protecting our children that are going through horrific circumstances.

REPRESENTATIVE V. JONES: Members, I thought a lot about an opposition speech to this legislation. If I could just get y'all's attention for just a minute, I'd really appreciate it. I want to speak in a language that I know that you all can hear and that's coming from the heart and being very personal.

When I think about this bill, I think about my childhood, because this bill is not just impacting those who are part of our body, but it impacts everyone to our very core. As a young boy, I knew that I was different, and other people knew that I was different. Some said I was "a little softer"; some said I was "a little funny acting." And this sometimes made me a target of unnecessary attention—and that was from loved ones. As you think about this legislation, I hope that you never have to go through an experience of having the you beat out of you—having a family member who is supposed to love you but wants to beat something out of you that you have absolutely no control over. I want you to

think about that as you take away from children the right to call for help when they need help. Because this bill is not just about refusing to use a child's preferred pronouns or express orientation. It's about not acknowledging that child's humanity when they are asking—when they are begging—for help, because there is so much more behind that story.

So I just ask, members—I beg you to please consider what this legislation is doing to our young people. Because when they need help—they won't come to their parents when they need help because they will be scared to death to ask for that help. They know that they need help and support from their parents, but they know that could turn into a physical ordeal that could be violent, that will scar that child for the rest of their life.

REPRESENTATIVE WALLE: Representative, I was sitting at my desk and was moved by what you said. I just want to let you know that you're aware you're loved on this floor? Is that correct?

V. JONES: Absolutely, every day.

WALLE: Are you aware that you are loved because you are you?

V. JONES: That's right.

WALLE: And many folks like you need to be proud of who they are. Is that correct?

V. JONES: Absolutely. They need to see that, and they need to be affirmed every day.

WALLE: Let alone you, but many children in this state and across this country struggle on a daily basis because of the doubt in their minds, because society has placed on them—but we love them. Is that correct?

V. JONES: That is correct.

WALLE: Many of us have family members that are struggling through this. Is that correct?

V. JONES: Absolutely. We talk to them every day in this building.

WALLE: We need to love them for who they are. Is that correct?

V. JONES: Yes.

WALLE: And we need to love them for who they love. Is that correct?

V. JONES: Absolutely.

REPRESENTATIVE FLORES: Thank you so much for this. I understand your pain. I've just come back from a family situation, and my nephew is now transitioning to be my niece. Fortunately for her, she's got a very supportive and loving mom, dad, and family. It's not easy because, even with that support, he, back then, was struggling and dropped out of high school. Now that she has begun transitioning, she is now very happy and is actually going back to college and talking about getting a degree and a future. So you know, I understand what you're saying about needing that healthy environment. Some kids are fortunate, but not all kids are fortunate like that, are they?

V. JONES: Absolutely not. And there is data; there is tons of data. And even if you cannot see the data, please allow the lived experiences of people in this building to tell you that there is data that shows there are two roads to this story. It's not just about supporting whether someone's LGBTQ or not. Again, it's about supporting their humanity. We know that those things change people's lived experiences and their outcomes. The stories about suicide and attempted suicide—it is true. That is something I tried when I was in the sixth grade, when I thought that I had nobody to go to. When I went to my family members—the ones I still love to this very day—who did not understand me. So even though I am not a part of the transgender community, my heart goes out to this community because I know what it feels like to be misunderstood to a level of incomprehension. All you want to do, particularly from the people who are supposed to love and accept you, is just want them to be able to accept you for who you are. This is not about a title. This is about acceptance from that carnal, family level, because we know, whether you identify as LGBTQ or not, what this world will do to you when you do not have that love.

What we are doing with this legislation—and I mean this with my heart. I am not trying to chub; I mean this with my heart. This legislation impacts me to my core. I hate this bill. I just want you all to understand why people hate this bill. Because if you are taking the ability for children to advocate for themselves when they are in the homes that are supposed to be protecting them but are abusing them—we are causing so much harm, everybody. Members, we are causing harm by this legislation. I cannot be silent and let this happen.

WU: Mr. Jones, I very much appreciate your passion on this. Have you in your life, in your experience, met LGBTQ+ people who have been abused or kicked out of their homes because they came out?

V. JONES: Absolutely. Not only in my personal life but also in my professional life. I used to run a youth drop-in center for LGBTQ youth and had to help people find showers, people find toiletries, people just get the basic needs to serve their lives when their families turned their backs on them, literally kicking them out of their homes and not having somewhere to go and having to resort to sex work and other things just to survive. It's not just these cute things; it was survival. And that's what I have seen and experienced in my life and career.

WU: And these are people who, if it were not for the fact that they were LGBTQ, that if it were not for that, they would be loved and supported by their family. It's this one thing that is driving hate into their lives.

V. JONES: Absolutely. And this legislation only—this only codifies that hate.

WU: Are you concerned that this legislation, if adopted, would give people who are already inclined to hurt their own children—children that they would otherwise love and be supportive of—that this would give them permission to be more abusive?

V. JONES: Yes. And we have seen—I know I only shared that story with you, but we have seen and we have heard from Representative Davis, who had to deal with this in her very committee, hearing about the abuse. And when you just pull

one layer back of this story, you see the tons and tons of abuse that was attached to this story. The physical abuse, the mental abuse, the rape that happened. These things are real, and especially when you are dealing with people who are LGBTQ, sometimes not having your own parents to talk to makes it feel like you can't talk to anybody, and people take advantage of that. So when we talk about predators, let's talk about the predators that are targeting our youth when they see this vulnerability. Let's believe those children when they come and talk about these things, especially when it's happening in their own damn house.

WU: And can this abuse extend as far as murder? That a parent would kill their own child rather than deal with the idea that they might be a little bit different?

V. JONES: Yes. Young people have been targets of violence, especially when we talk about young boys. Young boys being beaten by their fathers, who do not feel that they should be this way and just going too far. These are the young people—look up the stories of how many young people, young boys, have been harmed because they were just a little bit "too soft" or a little bit "too feminine." Yes, this is something that happens, and it's for real in this state.

REPRESENTATIVE J. GONZÁLEZ: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members, and thank you to my colleague and vice-chair for sharing his personal story. I, too, myself experienced the same thing. I got bullied—locker at school vandalized, my home vandalized—but I'm not going to go into my personal story. I'm going to share some stories that aren't from too long ago, and they're not from far-off countries either, like the author has referred to in his layout. They are from our communities. They are stories of the LGBTQIA children who were beaten, who were humiliated, and killed, often by the very adults who are supposed to be protecting them. Their only offense: being or being perceived as gay or feminine or just different. I'd like to begin by telling you about Gabriel Fernandez, but before I do, I want to offer a clear content warning to those watching or listening that this story involves descriptions of child abuse—real child abuse—and I share them with the deepest respect for the gravity of this moment. But I also believe that this body cannot make informed decisions in the abstract. If we are to legislate on identity, on neglect and family structures, then we must understand the real-world consequences, especially when those consequences are fatal. So with care and with purpose, I ask you to listen.

In California, Gabriel Fernandez, age eight, was tortured and killed for being gay. In one of the most gut-wrenching child abuse cases in recent memory, Gabriel Fernandez was murdered by his mother, Pearl Fernandez, and her boyfriend in 2013—I'm going to ask members to take their conversations outside the rails—because they believed he was gay. Gabriel was forced to wear girl's clothes, was beaten daily, shot with a BB gun, burned with cigarettes, and locked in a cabinet. In his final words, he had a cracked skull, broken ribs, missing teeth, and BB pellets embedded in his lungs. "Why don't you like me, Mommy?" Gabriel once asked. She never answered. This is the cost of teaching children that being gay is something to be punished.

In Georgia, "gay" shaved into a boy's head on Instagram Live. In 2021, a horrifying video surfaced of a young Black boy in Georgia being slapped, berated, and forcibly shaved by adults who believed he was "acting gay." They carved the word "gay" into the side of his head and posted the abuse on Instagram Live. "You still doin' gays? You still think this is cute?" one of the adults yells. Three adults were arrested and charged with cruelty to children. This wasn't discipline. It was public humiliation and psychological torture broadcast for likes. No charges were filed, despite public outcry. A child's dignity was weaponized as content. Where was the protection there?

In Texas, a father beats a 2-year-old for "acting gay." In 2024, a Texas father was sentenced to 45 years in prison for violently abusing his 2-year-old son, who he claimed was "acting gay." Prosecutors described how Thompson repeatedly beat the toddler, leaving injuries so severe they required hospitalization. This was a hate crime against a toddler.

In Milwaukee, a first grader was abused by a school principal for having two dads. In 2024, a federal lawsuit was filed, alleging that a first grader in Milwaukee was subjected to repeated abuse by his school principal at his elementary school because he had two gay dads. The principal allegedly isolated him, denied him recess, and publicly mocked his family. "They said my family is not real," he told his parents. He started begging not to go to school. Family rejection doesn't just happen at home; it's happening in our classrooms, too.

In another case, a young 10-year-old boy from California told his family he liked boys. Shortly after, he was tortured and murdered by his mother and her boyfriend in 2018. He was whipped with a belt, burned, slammed on the ground, and forced to kneel on rice for hours. "I'll hurt you, but I still love you," he told his mother during the abuse. That was the last thing he ever said. The child died loving the people who tortured him. That's what shame and silence can do.

These are not just isolated tragedies; they are connected by a culture that criminalizes and punishes queerness, especially in children. The children that this body always claims they are trying to protect. Every anti-LGBTQIA bill introduced, every book ban, every curriculum erased sends a message that it's okay to treat these kids like they're broken, like they won't belong. But our children are listening, and some of them won't survive the silence. So I ask you to let us really protect our kids.

WU: Mr. Shaheen, in the list of incidents you referred to as the basis of this legislation, how many of those cases were from Texas?

SHAHEEN: There have been cases across the nation and across the State of Texas. I called out two from different states and one from the State of Texas. Then I also called out concern about actions of other legislatures that are making it the definition of abuse to not acknowledge a child's orientation and gender.

WU: I know we don't have visibility in other states, but did you know that legislators—we have the ability to request files, complete files, for these types of cases? Were you aware of that?

SHAHEEN: Yes.

WU: And did you request the files for these cases in Texas?

SHAHEEN: No. I just confirmed there were allegations of abuse based on a parent's decision not to align with their child's gender identity.

WU: And where did that information come from?

SHAHEEN: Multiple news sources.

WU: Multiple news sources? Did you confirm it with the parents themselves?

SHAHEEN: No.

WU: Okay. Did you confirm it with DFPS?

SHAHEEN: I read the articles. Multiple articles that laid out that there were allegations of abuse merely because the parents held traditional values of what sex was.

WU: And you understand that the news just reports what they're told, right?

SHAHEEN: Well, one was from the *Texas Tribune*, so it had to be right.

WU: I'm sorry. You understand that the press reports what they're told, right? Like the news articles say, "this person says—"

SHAHEEN: No, that's inaccurate. No, the press will also look at legal documents. They'll source their information.

WU: Did you look at the legal documents in the Texas cases?

SHAHEEN: I don't believe so. I think I just referenced the multiple articles where there were allegations of abuse.

WU: Because normally—because this is what I practice on a day-to-day basis—these documents are sealed. These are confidential documents, and unless you're in the case—even other attorneys cannot have access to them. Did you ask how the press got ahold of them?

SHAHEEN: No. I just read the articles.

WU: So you believe it's true because it was reported on and somebody said it?

SHAHEEN: I believe it's true because there have been multiple reports across the United States and in Texas of allegations of abuse and threats to parents of their children being removed because of that.

WU: Did you ask DFPS to sit down with you and to go over the cases?

SHAHEEN: Normally when I read an article in the press, I don't typically reach out to the individuals that are involved to confirm the article. I just read the article.

WU: I mean, DFPS is an arm of the State of Texas. They work for the state, and they answer to you. Could you not have simply asked them, "Hey, what happened here?"

SHAHEEN: When you read the same article from multiple resources, that typically is sufficient.

WU: So that's curious, because usually when I read an article and it all quotes the same source, I ask myself, "Is that source correct?" And you did not think about that at all. You did not think, "I should go talk to the people who are actually in charge of these cases to find out the complete story"?

SHAHEEN: I will tell you that court documents were reviewed yesterday during one of the points of order, and in those court documents, there were allegations of abuse merely because the parents did not align with the child's perceived gender.

WU: Allegations—

SHAHEEN: Those were in the court documents.

WU: Allegations—court documents from Texas?

SHAHEEN: I think it was Texas and one other case, and I can't remember the state, but there were actually copies of the court documents provided. And in those documents, it stated that there were allegations of abuse because the mom and dad did not align with the child's perceived gender. So they were accused of abuse, they were accused of neglect, and there was an effort to remove their child simply because there was a difference in ideology.

WU: And who provided those court documents?

SHAHEEN: Whoever raised the point.

WU: Are those documents verified? Are they certified?

SHAHEEN: They're court documents, so—I didn't go to the courthouse in the other state to see if they were in there, if that's what you're asking.

WU: I don't know about other states, but in Texas when you want to present a court document as a court document, it usually has to be certified because people can make those things up. People could edit them; people could change them. We've had that happen all the time.

SHAHEEN: You know, Mr. Wu, if you don't believe the allegations, then vote against the bill.

WU: No, I'm asking how you made your legislative decision, what your intent is in doing this, how you came to this conclusion, and whether or not your decision was arbitrary and capricious in coming up with this definition.

SHAHEEN: And I've said multiple times that there have been cases throughout the United States; you can Google it. There are cases in the State of Texas, and there's also a concern over actions that legislative bodies are taking to define this as abuse.

WU: Can you understand that often these types of cases are extremely complex, involve multiple people, and involve years of allegations? Different kinds of allegations in that. Can you understand that?

SHAHEEN: Of course.

WU: Can you understand that some people in the case—one side may argue that it's being done for one reason, and the state may say, no, it's actually a whole big list of reasons? Is that something that you can comprehend?

SHAHEEN: Yes, but, again, if you go back to the bill and what the bill does, it just states that abuse and neglect do not include a refusal by a mom and dad to go along with the child's perceived gender. So yes, cases are complex. They take quite a bit of time. There are multiple individuals involved. But all this bill does is it just provides clarity on the definitions of abuse and neglect—that it does not include when a mom and dad refuse to abide by a child's perceived gender.

WU: Yesterday when we did amendments, there was an amendment offered that said we would provide the other side of that equation. That's saying if a child—if a parent does provide all these things, a parent does all these things, that cannot be seen as child abuse either. And that amendment was rejected, correct?

SHAHEEN: "All these things"—can you be more specific?

WU: I'm sorry. If a parent provides affirming care to their child—their child says, "I'm gay" or "I'm trans" or whatever it is—that the parent goes and provides them with the care they need—takes them to the doctor, takes them to the therapist. Do all those things—providing them with outside care—that cannot be seen as child abuse?

SHAHEEN: That's not the intent of this bill. That's the exact opposite. That's why that amendment was rejected.

WU: You understand that that was a different view from yours, your bill, right?

SHAHEEN: And you understand that the purpose of this bill is to ensure the definition of abuse and neglect does not include refusal by a mom and dad to align with their child's perceived gender? So the amendment you're referring to did not align with the intent of this bill.

WU: Absolutely. So your intent is to—your intent is for the state to adopt this particular view of this issue? I mean, that's fair.

SHAHEEN: The intent of this bill is to ensure the definitions of abuse and neglect do not include the refusal of a mom and dad to go along with the perceived gender of their child.

WU: And in our discussions, we have both discussed people—the possibility that parents might be prosecuted for abuse and neglect for denying the care. And we talked about—through the amendment—the idea that people might be prosecuted for providing the care. Do you remember all those discussions?

SHAHEEN: My reference to those was the fact that there are other definitions with respect to abuse and neglect that have to do with the physical and mental abuse of a child. Those are already covered.

WU: I'm sorry?

SHAHEEN: In the current definitions of abuse and neglect in statute—addresses mental abuse and physical abuse of a child.

WU: Absolutely not what I'm asking about.

SHAHEEN: Those things are against the law already. So you have to go back to the intent of this legislation and what it does.

WU: That is exactly what I'm trying to get to. All I'm trying to say is—asking you—you understand that on this question of whether it is abuse or not, that the decision—whether it's abuse or not—that the state saying that we are going to say this side of the equation is not abuse and neglect—that the parents who deny it, deny this care, should not be—

SHAHEEN: No, you're mischaracterizing the bill. It doesn't talk to anything about denying care. What it says is if there's an ideological difference between mom and dad and the child, they don't lose custody. If a child is not getting the care that they need—food, shelter, what have you—that falls within the definition of neglect already. It's already in statute. This piece of legislation is specifically focused on making sure Mom and Dad don't lose custody of their child because there's a disagreement over ideology.

WU: And we're protecting the people over here who have this ideology, correct? That's all I'm asking.

SHAHEEN: And I'm answering your question. Multiple times. I'm literally reading you pieces of the legislation as my response.

WU: No, absolutely. But the legislation is in legal terms. The legislation isn't about prosecution. It's about investigation and things like that. In a practical sense—from a 20,000-foot view—we are saying that you can have two different philosophies about what happens in these types of cases, whether this type of treatment is abuse or not, right? Whether denying this treatment is abuse or not, whether providing this treatment is abuse or not—your legislation says if you deny care, it is not abuse. It cannot be considered abuse.

SHAHEEN: I would strongly suggest you read the bill.

WU: And what are the things that your bill would say—if you did these things, it is not abuse? What kinds of things would those be?

SHAHEEN: Abuse does not include the refusal by a person responsible for a child's care, custody, or welfare to affirm a child's perception of the child's gender, including refusal to use a child's preferred name or pronoun, regardless of whether the child's name has been legally changed, or a child's expressed sexual orientation. So any other concepts that you want to try to introduce with respect to mental abuse, physical abuse, they are covered in other areas of statute. I just read to you specifically what this bill has to deal with.

WU: Let me just ask in the exact terms of the bill. If you—you're saying that if a parent does not affirm, that is not child abuse, and under state law, it cannot be considered child abuse?

SHAHEEN: That's what the bill says.

WU: But if a parent does affirm, there's nothing to say that that cannot be child abuse?

SHAHEEN: That is not the intent of this legislation.

WU: Absolutely, that's all I wanted.

SHAHEEN: That's not the intent of this legislation.

REPRESENTATIVE GOODWIN: I'm sure that you heard the heart-wrenching speeches by Representative V. Jones and Representative J. González. Do you understand how your bill, should it become law, could harm some children?

SHAHEEN: Respectfully, this bill doesn't harm children. Those speeches were gut-wrenching, and no child should ever experience the abuses, both physical and mental, that were articulated on the floor. Those were horrific, and the parents should be ashamed of themselves.

GOODWIN: Well, I thought that you might not see how your law would impact kids, but when I was listening to those stories, what I heard was that because of a child's decision that they are gay, lesbian, transgender, what have you, they may face abuse in their own home. And that abuse should be something that is addressed.

SHAHEEN: Which is covered under current statute. If you look at the definition of abuse and neglect of a child, the examples that were articulated to you were examples. So under current statute, those stories that were articulated to the body, those were against the law, currently. Nothing in this bill makes the physical and mental abuse of a child legal. It's illegal right now, and it'll be illegal tomorrow, and it'll be illegal after September 1 of this year.

GOODWIN: You just mentioned the mental abuse. Sometimes it's hard to see mental abuse, and that mental abuse could be the denial of a child and how they—

SHAHEEN: Mom and Dad disagreeing on a topic is not abuse. Children disagree with their moms and dads every day. That is not abuse.

GOODWIN: I really believe that the consequence of your law could lead to some children remaining—

SHAHEEN: The consequences of my law will be families left intact. Children will be left in—

GOODWIN: And that could lead to—

SHAHEEN: Excuse me, if I may finish—that children will be left in a loving environment, with a mom and dad that love them. And that's the intent of this law.

GOODWIN: And that's a beautiful picture, and we all want that to happen in every family situation, but we know that that's not the reality. The reality is there are some families who deny their children who they are, and that escalates into physical abuse.

SHAHEEN: Which is against the law.

GOODWIN: Correct.

HB 1106 was passed by (Record 2458): 85 Yeas, 59 Nays, 2 Present, not voting.

HB 1586 ON THIRD READING

(by Hull, McQueeney, Bonnen, Leach, Capriglione, et al.)

HB 1586, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to an exemption from required immunizations for school enrollment.

HB 1586 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE GOODWIN: So we debated this quite a bit last night, but I am left with the question of what has led to the increased need for these forms and the increased anti-vaccine movement?

REPRESENTATIVE HULL: That has nothing to do with this bill. This bill has to do with where a form is printed. This bill is so children can start school on time.

GOODWIN: Well, the reason you want it to be printed at the school is for ease?

HULL: It's not printed at the school.

GOODWIN: Well, online—

HULL: This is about—you seem to have a problem with current law and a parent's fundamental right to opt out and to choose their children's—what is best for their child's medical choices and their health. That is not this bill. This bill changes where a form is printed.

GOODWIN: If this were one or two kids that we were talking about, where the form is printed probably would not be super relevant. Correct?

HULL: It wouldn't—it doesn't matter how many children. It doesn't matter if it's one or—it doesn't matter. Pick a number. It literally does not matter. This is about where a form is printed. Period. The end. If you do not like what current law is, you and whoever else can come back again next session or sessions after to try and change that. But that is not what this bill is.

GOODWIN: I mean, government is here to make our lives easier, better, more convenient, and to provide services that we need. I just don't understand the need for the bill.

HULL: I think you just explained why we need the bill.

GOODWIN: We already have a process for getting these forms. It seems that your bill is intended to make that process easier, and I—

HULL: It is to make it more timely so children can start school on time.

GOODWIN: Correct. And my understanding is that more and more children every year are using these forms to opt out of vaccines, which is a concern given—

HULL: That has nothing to do with this bill.

GOODWIN: Well, honestly, I think it does have something to do with this bill because you are talking about letting parents have a form to fill out—

HULL: They already can have this form. This is so we do not have unnecessary taxpayer dollars spent on a government agency printing forms that parents can print themselves.

GOODWIN: And why are so many parents printing these forms?

HULL: Again, that has nothing to do with this bill. The "why" has nothing to do with this bill. It is about where a form is printed so children can start school on time. School districts have asked for this. This is about a child's fundamental right to an education, starting school on time, and not missing valuable instruction time because they are out days and weeks at the beginning of the school year because a government agency has lost the form or the forms get lost in the mail.

GOODWIN: Thank you, Representative.

HULL: Members, this is the bill that changes where your mom can print a form.

REPRESENTATIVE C. MORALES: Honestly, I did not want to speak against this bill, but I was listening to the discussion yesterday, and I feel compelled to come up here and speak to you. I have such great respect for the bill author, who happens to be my committee chair—runs a great committee—and I know she brings this bill forward as a mother and likely with the best intentions to make things easier for parents navigating health care decisions for their children and making things easier. So I respect her heart as a parent, but I have to speak from my own experience. Because in my line of work, I have seen the unimaginable. I have seen the faces of parents who have lost a child. I have seen mothers who couldn't even walk or remain conscious through their child's funeral. That kind of pain stays with you. It changes you, and I don't wish it on anyone.

My worry is that this bill, even unintentionally, sends the wrong message that opting out of a vaccine is easier, more acceptable, and less risky than it truly is. The truth is, kids will die if we normalize vaccine hesitancy. This bill may be about streamlining a process on the surface, but the real impact could be devastating. It risks encouraging policies that go against science and that go against the safeguards that have protected generations of children. We cannot open the door to more preventable deaths. I urge you to vote no on this bill for the health and safety of Texas children.

REPRESENTATIVE JOHNSON: I am a Texan, and my dad, Jake Johnson—many of you know—served here in the Texas House, and he, too, is a Texan. He loved President Dwight Eisenhower, a republican from Texas and president of the United States. He loved him so much that he named my brother

Jacob Dwight Johnson. I, too, have a tremendous amount of respect for Chairwoman Hull. We came in together, and I agree with what she argues for and what she talks about—about the simplicity of trying to do the form. I know that her heart is right when she says that she doesn't want children to miss school, and she's trying to make it easier for those things to happen to ensure that they can get into school and not be delayed because of the form. What worries me is the message we're sending from here with regard to public health or whether we believe in vaccines.

I want to remind everybody that our nation was suffering significant public health crises and disease in the early parts of the 1900s. It was President Eisenhower who used the power of the bully pulpit and the White House to praise individuals like Dr. Jonas Salk, who had come up with a vaccine for polio. For those of you that remember or know folks of that time, polio is a debilitating disease and, unfortunately, one we are starting to see come back. The president published this statement in 1955, and he said, "I want to caution the people of our nation about two things. First: No vaccination program can prevent all cases of the disease against which it is directed. Let us not forget that Dr. Francis reported the polio vaccine—as used in the 1954 field trial—was found to be 60 to 90 percent—not 100 percent—effective in the field trials last year." Today, we hear many people criticize vaccinations and say, "Well, they're not 100 percent effective; why are you relying upon them?" And this is no different from where our nation was when we began battling the public health crisis with immunization and vaccination. President Eisenhower then went on to say, "Second: Although the manufacturers are now moving toward full-scale production and distribution of this vaccine, it will take them varying periods of time to retool to meet the revised production standards. During the months immediately ahead, we must be patient with our limited supply of vaccines—used first to protect those who need it most. Every parent and every child should be grateful to those scientists who have been working without rest and without relief during recent weeks to find answers to the problems that are causing the delay. They have found these answers, and another battle in the continuing fight against polio has been won."

In my view, that is great leadership from our government. To tell parents—and let's not forget when we talk about immunizations, we are predominantly talking about protecting children—something that I would dare say none of us in this room know or worry about because all of our parents—all of our parents—had us vaccinated to protect us from disease.

REPRESENTATIVE FRANK: I think at the start of your comments—when you were actually talking about this bill, you said that you understood the bill—it makes it more efficient; kids will get in school earlier. Is that correct?

JOHNSON: I said that I believe very much in Chairman Hull's concern about that issue. My concern, and the reason I'm voting no on this bill, is that I'm worried that the message coming from this chamber is that vaccination is not a public health crisis, which we should take most seriously.

FRANK: So you referred back to when, I believe, Eisenhower—do you know how many doses of vaccines were required back then for a child?

JOHNSON: I know you're going to tell me, but I don't. I don't know the answer, so if you will, tell me what it is in the form of a question.

FRANK: Around 16 separate doses. Do you know how many are required now to be in school?

JOHNSON: I know it's a much higher number.

FRANK: It's around 88 separate doses to be in school. Most of the people that ask for exemptions—are they asking for exemptions from all vaccines or just some?

JOHNSON: I don't know the answer to that.

FRANK: Most people get vaccines. They are asking for exemptions from some. We've had multiple testimonies—do you realize we've had multiple testimonies from professionals in public health this year that, when they talk about vaccines, have used words—for example, the measles vaccine—they used words such as, "this is one of the good vaccines." Our state health—do you realize that has been said?

JOHNSON: I'm on that committee with you, and I remember when we talked about that—they talked about the question of "good." What I recall is they were talking about the efficacy. That if you get the measles vaccine, it's up to 97 percent effective.

FRANK: And I think the measles vaccine clearly has been proven phenomenal, but there is a spectrum that we appreciate—I think—most of us appreciate. Most people that don't want their kids with all 88 vaccines are not anti-vaxxers, despite the fact that they get accused of that. Would you agree with that?

JOHNSON: You and I have talked about this, which is—and we've said this—politicizing this particular issue, no matter which way you're doing it, is a bad thing for public health. You and I have had these very honest conversations about people getting informed of how they want to practice good public health. One of the things we've heard in our committee is that people trust their primary physician the most. And one of the other things that we have heard in our committee is, we, in Texas, have a lot of folks that don't have a primary care physician because many people are not covered or there's low access to care. Which is why we're equally trying to say, "Hey, get kids immunized wherever you can get them"—or we're talking about rural health care. We're talking about these stand-up urgent care centers and trying to get more access. So you and I will agree that this is incredibly complex. It's not so simplistic.

FRANK: Correct. But this bill, at its core, is incredibly simple. We have kids not going to school—not going to school because the parents are having to call the state agency. The state agency is then hiring four different people to send out in the mail different forms. Is that right? And then waiting two weeks. So that is a little—it's a little bit silly. I appreciate the message, and I appreciate your time.

JOHNSON: Well, I appreciate your questions, and I would say that this is similar to—

REPRESENTATIVE J. JONES: I, like Representative C. Morales, really wasn't going to talk. I had no intention of talking about this bill. I love Representative Hull. We're in the same area. We both go to a bunch of domestic violence events because it's important to us. But we just have two fundamentally different beliefs about the importance of these worksheets that no longer have a state seal. And it's interesting. Before I got on the Public Health Committee, I didn't think much about vaccines, because my mom took me to get vaccinations when I was younger, and I didn't like taking them. In fact, I have a scar on my rear from jumping when I got one. I didn't understand the importance of it. But as I've gotten older, I've learned, I've lived, and I've seen that some people don't have as strong of an immune system as I do. I didn't realize measles was a thing. I thought measles had been eradicated. So I was as surprised as anyone to hear about the measles outbreak in West Texas and that children were getting it and that children died.

I don't know if you know this—anybody who follows me on social media knows I'm a new grandmother. I adore my granddaughter. There is in my family—some people have compromised immune systems. And when I was sitting in the first Public Health Committee meeting at the beginning of this session, I was surprised. The first thing I did when I was sitting at the dais was I called my son and my daughter-in-law, and I asked if my granddaughter had a vaccine, if she had been vaccinated for measles. Again, I didn't think anything about it until I was sitting in the public health meeting. And my daughter-in-law tells me, "No, you don't take that until you're this age." So she hadn't had it yet, and all I could think was, "I don't want my granddaughter to die." I had learned in the Public Health Committee meeting that you could take it earlier, and it won't hurt you. So I literally begged and pleaded—sort of ordered—my son and my daughter-in-law to take my grandbaby to get her vaccine. And they did. And I started paying attention. Then I thought, "I believe in public education." I graduated from public high school; I went to public school in middle school; I went to public elementary school; I went to a public university because I fundamentally believe in a public education. But all of a sudden, I'm wondering right now—mind you, my grandbaby is not my child; she is my son and my daughter-in-law's child. I'm literally having conversations with them about whether they should send her to public school. Because, like most people in Texas, I didn't even understand immunity, but I understand it now. It terrifies me to think that my granddaughter can go to school and get measles from somebody because there aren't enough protected people with vaccines at the school, which is a fundamental change in how I believe.

So my cousin literally went to eat lunch with her daughter. She didn't really want to go out, but her daughter begged her to. Come to find out—and my cousin didn't believe in the vaccine, in the COVID-19 vaccine. She went out with her daughter. They went out to lunch. Less than a week later, my cousin—if I remember correctly, I think she was 54 or 55 years old—was dead. She got COVID-19 going to lunch with her daughter. It took her fast.

So I know there are people with vaccine hesitancy, but there are also people like me who absolutely believe in vaccines, not just because I believe it's going to protect my granddaughter, but because I think it protects people who don't necessarily believe how I believe. The fact that the official seal is removed means that any parent can have their kid in a school and no one will even know. I would like to know—as a grandparent, as a parent—do we have herd immunity at this school that my granddaughter is going to go to? Because if we don't, either I'm going to homeschool her or I'm going to help my son and my daughter-in-law find another school for her to go to. But I'm not going to send her there because it's literally the difference between life and death. And again, this is America. We can believe what we want to believe, but dying from not having vaccines is real. I've experienced it in my family. So I respectfully urge you to vote against this because kids could literally die.

REPRESENTATIVE BRYANT: Members, I'll be very brief, but I don't think that this matter should pass by so quickly without specific references to what this bill does. It is not a bill simply to simplify a form. Let me explain what is in the current law. The current law says that the Department of State Health Services shall include a seal or other security device to prevent reproduction of that form for obtaining an exemption. The reason is that they do not want this thing to simply be randomly copied and disseminated everywhere. They want to make people who are going to apply to these things go through the process, because we do not want an increase in the number of those people that apply for this without it being a very serious decision. It's not a minor revision. It's the elimination of a statutory safeguard that's in the current law to preserve the integrity of state-issued immunization exemption forms. Ms. Hull's bill will eliminate that. Now, there will just be a simple form that will be allowed to proliferate without reason or without any design.

Second, and equally important, under current law, the Department of State Health Services must track how many forms are distributed and report that information annually to the legislature. This bill eliminates that requirement. Now, you saw yesterday Ms. Howard and Mr. Bucy hold a little chart up that showed how rapidly the people who have applied for these exemptions has increased. That is a threat to the health and safety of every single Texan. This is a serious matter. We're right in the middle of a measles outbreak that we have not seen in many decades. We don't know what else may come behind. I do not know—I truly do not know—why some members of the house here are enthusiastic about discouraging people from taking these vaccines. They have been a miracle. They began with a smallpox vaccine back at the time they were—before we were even an independent nation, and they have gotten better and better and better. I also like what Ms. Howard said yesterday. She said she remembers when everybody wasn't vaccinated. Well, I'm older than her. I remember when everybody got these diseases. I remember when people were in iron lungs. I remember when people were dying of polio and living a life of having lost their mobility because they caught this disease. And it is especially

tragic—to echo Ms. Morales' statement earlier—when one of these children dies. It's especially tragic when you know it could have been prevented simply by taking a vaccine.

I urge you not to get on this bandwagon of encouraging people not to do something that common sense tells us works and protects people. This bill is not a simplification of a form; it's a change in the law that is designed to discourage people from doing this without serious thought. It's a change in the direction we're going in regard to respect for science. This is not a time for partisanship. It's not a time for putting ideology over pragmatism. It's a time to protect the public interest. I urge you to vote no for this bill.

GOODWIN: It sounds like you're understanding the bill the way I am—that it removes some safeguards, and it does make it easier for people to request an exemption from a vaccine that could save lives.

BRYANT: That's exactly right. And it's part of this movement to try to tell people not to take vaccines; otherwise, it wouldn't include these other provisions that I just mentioned.

GOODWIN: That's right. You know, after all the stories that we've heard about how vaccines have eradicated polio, have eradicated measles, and how we have a recurrence of measles, you would think that, logically, people would understand how critically important vaccines are, wouldn't you?

BRYANT: You would think so.

GOODWIN: And yet, I wonder if it's misinformation on social media that has led to many families thinking that vaccines are potentially harmful to their kids?

BRYANT: Yes. I assume that's where it's coming from, because there's no scientific basis for it.

GOODWIN: I agree, and I really hope that families out there will understand that even if they're in the part of Texas that has this measles outbreak—that even if your child hasn't been previously vaccinated—even once you get the measles, you can still vaccinate them and have it be less harmful to them.

BRYANT: That's correct.

GOODWIN: So I appreciate you making the point that you made here.

REPRESENTATIVE VIRDELL: I'll just be real quick. I know you probably don't know this, but I just wanted to ask you—did you know that when my wife was five months pregnant with a baby, we were given a flu shot that we were told would be good for us? Within an hour my wife went into preterm labor and lost that baby because of that flu shot?

BRYANT: I don't know anything about your personal situation. I certainly am sorry to hear that.

VIRDELL: I'll tell you one more story. When my oldest kid now was about two years old, we had to get him the vaccines so he could go to day care, and immediately, he broke out. His left eye—no, his right eye—turned directly

inward, and we ended up having to have surgery to have the muscle cut and reattached. It was a reaction to the vaccine. So I just want you to understand that I do not trust vaccines for personal reasons.

BRYANT: But I would just observe that the gentleman has the option to take advantage of the exemption that's offered under the law.

VIRDELL: I just want you to understand there are reasons that people do not trust the vaccines. That's all I have. Thank you.

BRYANT: Well, possibly. But let me assert this—and I certainly regret your personal circumstance. The science is unequivocal that, on the whole, vaccines protect us from disease.

VIRDELL: At the risk of other people having it forced on them.

BRYANT: Well, individual cases have got to be looked at in connection with what science tells us the broad experience of the American people has been with these vaccines. They have been a scientific miracle. For us, today, to forget all of this history and not remember the tragedies that occurred—flu epidemics killed 500,000 Americans back in the 1920s—things that are clearly part of history. To ignore all of that and pursue this ideological effort to try and encourage more people not to take vaccines, in my view, is what always happens when we put ideology ahead of practical and pragmatic understandings of what's really going on—when we put party ahead of the public interest. I hope that you will vote against this bill.

REPRESENTATIVE RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: One of the comments that Representative Virdell said was they don't want vaccines forced upon them, but it's unfortunate that decision forces the rest of us to be exposed to different viruses and contagions. So although they don't want to be forced, their decisions are forcing other negative implications for us.

But going back to the form, how is the state able to track where the vulnerabilities are? I know, for example, as a family law attorney, there are some forms that we get from the Bureau of Vital Statistics. Those are tracked very carefully. Those are only allotted to certain individuals, and it informs the state of who has access to what so that there can be some safeguards and some accountability mechanisms. So from your understanding of this bill—it sounds like it's just printing something online. How are we, the state, able to ensure that we are protecting the rest of the state and that this bill "just about a form" informs the state and the rest of us where our vulnerabilities lie?

BRYANT: There will be no mechanism for doing that. This bill eliminates the requirement that the Department of State Health Services keep track of the number of these forms that are issued and report it to the legislature. It also eliminates the statutory safeguard designed to preserve the integrity of state-issued immunization forms by removing the seal—the safeguard—and simply disseminating them to anybody.

RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: Thank you. And the bill author kept saying, "It's just about a form; it's just about forms." But in all of this time in Texas policy just about a form—

HULL: Members, this bill is just about a form. It is about where a form is printed. School districts already have to report all of the forms and numbers that they get. Any other number about how many forms or how many forms are printed is completely irrelevant. The school districts report the numbers. This is simply about where a form is printed.

REPRESENTATIVE TROXCLAIR: Can you remind me once and for all who prints this form?

HULL: Your mom.

SB 1833, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to the use of a social media platform in furtherance of an offense involving the delivery of a controlled substance; increasing criminal penalties.

SB 1833 was considered in lieu of **HB 2695**.

SB 1833 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE ANCHÍA: It is sad that this bill was born out of a tragedy that we experienced in the area that we represent—Representative Garcia Hernandez, Representative Bumgarner, and I—where we lost a number of children in Carrollton-Farmers Branch ISD.

In 2023, the Carrollton Police Department dismantled a drug trafficking ring that used social media platforms to distribute counterfeit pills laced with fentanyl, and they did so to students in the Carrollton-Farmers Branch Independent School District. These deadly pills were trafficked into places that we know all too well: DeWitt Perry Middle School, Dan F. Long Middle School, and R.L. Turner High School, which I have represented now for over 20 years. The single investigation by Carrollton-Farmers Branch police uncovered a startling statistic: fourteen juveniles had overdosed, and of those, we had four fatalities. I'll repeat that. Fourteen juvenile overdoses and four fatalities, including students as young as 13. As the chief of police, Roberto Arredondo said, "These are not just numbers to us. These are lives lost, their families devastated, and their futures erased."

Following the tragedy, the school district interviewed overdose victims, and nearly all had obtained these counterfeit pills through social media. Two of the impacted families came to testify and share about their children. We heard from Lilia Astudillo, who spoke about her son, Jose Alberto. Jose was a 14-year-old student at Long Middle School in the Carrollton-Farmers Branch ISD, and he died on January 26, 2023, from fentanyl poisoning. His mother described him as a joyful child. I have a photograph right here if you care to see it. He loved football. He loved dancing with his sister. And he loved bringing laughter to

those around him. He was found unresponsive in his bedroom after ingesting a counterfeit pill that he got from social media, and it happened to be laced with fentanyl. We also heard from Luis Gonzalez. His daughter, Jauslyn Celeste Gonzalez, died at 15 years old also from a fentanyl overdose. She received that fatal pill from social media. Her family describes her as having an infectious laugh, the gift of good humor, sarcasm, and always as a jokester. She loved music and would sing her heart out as their in-house DJ. All they have left of Jauslyn are the memories and videos of her antics and her silliness. And if you had heard the testimony on that day, you would have been absolutely moved.

They have requested that this body help in this fight against the use of social media sales to move fentanyl that is impacting not only children in Carrollton-Farmers Branch, members, but children throughout the districts that you represent. This is not an isolated incident. Rather, it is part of a statewide epidemic. According to the Texas Department of State Health Services dashboard—and you can look at your leisure—that is part of the governor's One Pill Kills campaign, more than five Texans die every day from fentanyl poisoning. Fentanyl-related deaths in Texas have increased more than 575 percent since 2019—from 317 during 2019 to over 2,160 in 2022—and youth are disproportionately affected. The Drug Enforcement Administration has warned that social media is now the leading tool for drug distribution. Platforms like Instagram, Snapchat, TikTok, and X allow traffickers to reach children in their bedrooms with pills disguised to look like prescription medication. And it's delivered to their doorsteps within hours. Since 2023, the Carrollton Police Department Street Crimes Unit has initiated 108 fentanyl-related investigations. Alarmingly, over half—55 percent—of those cases involve traffickers using social media as their primary tool for delivery and distribution. This is a wake-up call for all of us, members. Drug dealers have traded street corners for smartphones, and social media networks have become the superhighway of drugs. Shockingly, members, there is no law that specifically penalizes the use of social media to traffic deadly drugs, even though drug dealers today are able to use social media to enhance their reach and the scale of their operation.

So **SB 1833**, carried by Senator Parker in the senate, addresses this gap. The bill creates criminal penalties for people who are killing our youth today by using social media to traffic fentanyl and other dangerous drugs. The punishment will represent the sheer scale, reach, and impact of their actions. We amend the Health and Safety Code by adding a section entitled "Use of Social Media Platform for Delivery of Controlled Substance." And if a defendant is proven to have used social media to deliver the controlled substance, the punishment is increased to the next higher category of offense. And if the offense is already a first-degree felony, the punishment is enhanced by five additional years in jail, and the maximum fine is doubled.

Since these requirements are not established by the bill, the bill analysis is substantially and materially misleading. See 79 H. Jour. 2481-2482 (2005).

Accordingly, the point of order is well-taken and sustained.

(b) A person who fails to comply with Subsection (a) [~~this section~~] commits an offense. An offense under this section is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than \$200 and not more than \$500. This subsection does not apply to:

(1) a person who conducts a marriage ceremony and, as provided by Subsection (a-1), authorizes the parties to the marriage to return the marriage license to the county clerk; or

(2) a party to the marriage who is authorized under Subsection (a-1) to return the marriage license to the county clerk.

SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to a marriage ceremony conducted on or after the effective date of this Act. A marriage ceremony conducted before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the ceremony was conducted, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

(3) Add the following appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill and renumber subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

SECTION ____. Sections 201.909(e), (f), and (g), Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:

(e) If the application meets the department's requirements and the applicant pays the memorial sign fee, the department shall erect a sign. A sign posted under this section may remain posted for ten [~~two~~] years. At the end of the ten-year [~~two-year~~] period the department may release the sign to the applicant. The department is not required to release a sign that has been damaged.

(f) A sign posted under this section that is damaged shall be removed by the department. Except as provided in Subsection (g), the department may post a new sign if it has been less than ten [~~two~~] years from the posting of the original sign and a person:

(1) submits a written request to the department to replace the sign; and

(2) submits a replacement fee in the amount provided under Subsection

(d)(2).

(g) During the ten-year [~~two-year~~] posting period the department shall replace a sign posted under this section that is damaged because of the department's negligence.

SECTION ____. Section 201.911, Transportation Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (c-1) to read as follows:

(a) In this section, "victim" means a person killed in a highway collision while operating or riding on a motorcycle. The term does not include a person who was under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance at the time of the collision.

(c) A sign designed and posted under this section shall include:

(1) a motorcyclist safety message selected from the options provided by commission rule under Subsection (c-1) [~~red cross~~];

(2) the phrase "In Memory Of" and the name of one or more victims in accordance with the commission rule; and

(3) the date of the collision that resulted in the victim's death.

(c-1) The commission by rule shall develop motorcyclist safety messages that may be used on the memorial signs under this section.

SECTION _____. Section 225.021, Transportation Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:

(a) Subject to Subsection (e), the ~~[The]~~ department shall repair and replace each marker required by this subchapter and maintain the grounds for the marker.

(e) The department may not repair or replace a marker after the 10th anniversary of the effective date of the provision requiring the marker to be erected unless a grant or donation of funds is made to the department to cover the cost of the repair or replacement of the marker. This subsection applies only to a provision of this subchapter enacted after January 1, 2025, that requires the erection of a marker.

SECTION _____. (a) Not later than December 1, 2025, the Texas Transportation Commission shall adopt the rules required by Section 201.911(c-1), Transportation Code, as added by this Act.

(b) Notwithstanding Section 201.911, Transportation Code, as amended by this Act, the Texas Department of Transportation is not required to comply with the changes in law made by this Act to Sections 201.909, 201.911, and 225.201, Transportation Code, before March 1, 2026.

SECTION _____. (a) Subject to Subsection (c) of this section and not later than September 1, 2026, the Texas Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain highway signs guiding road users to the Koreatown District in the Northwest Dallas neighborhood of Dallas from the following routes:

(1) the exits for Royal Lane from northbound and southbound Interstate Highway 35E; and

(2) the exits for Luna Road from eastbound and westbound Interstate Highway 635.

(b) Subject to Subsection (c) of this section and not later than September 1, 2026, the Texas Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain highway signs guiding road users to the Chinatown District in Richardson from the following routes:

(1) the exits for Arapaho Road from northbound and southbound U.S. Highway 75; and

(2) the exits for Belt Line Road and Main Street from northbound and southbound U.S. Highway 75.

(c) A sign erected under this section may not violate the Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices or the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices issued by the United States Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration.

CSHB 5381 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE LOWE: As a retired military veteran, I am honored to bring forward legislation that directly supports children, families, and those who wear the uniform of this country. Today, I rise to lay out **CSHB 5381**, also known as ROCKY's Law, which stands for Reach Out to Compact Kids and Youth. The Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children already exists and has provided essential support for families with frequent school transitions. However, gaps remain. **CSHB 5381** strengthens the Compact Act.

REPRESENTATIVE RAYMOND: Representative, when did you first get interested in public policy and then politics and things that were going on around you? Was it when you were in high school?

CSHB 113 ON SECOND READING
(by Vasut, Cain, Leach, Hayes, Schofield, et al.)

CSHB 113, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to statutory construction, including restrictions on the use of certain aids to construction.

CSHB 113 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE VASUT: **CSHB 113** amends the Code Construction Act and the construction laws chapter of the Government Code to ensure that the laws passed by this body are interpreted according to their plain and ordinary meaning and not based upon legislative intent.

REPRESENTATIVE RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: In reading your bill, I find it honestly a little alarming. On page 1—could you talk a little bit about "intentionalism prohibited"? What does that mean in terms of the everyday operations that we partake in as we're here on the house floor discussing and debating different legislation?

VASUT: I'd say, in general terms, what it means is when we pass a statute, the court is to interpret the statute according to the plain and ordinary meaning of its text. Taking into account all of the definitions we put into the statute, where they're placed, and all the cross-references, but not to look at the back microphone, not to look at the bill analysis packet, not to look at some hidden meaning of, maybe, what somebody said on Twitter. Maybe one out of 150 of us—not what they thought it meant, but rather what the words mean in the common English tongue. What it's really about is that it ensures that the lawmaking power is vested in the legislature and not in the courts.

RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: I understand what you're saying, but it says "use of legislative history prohibited. When interpreting a statute, a court may not consider, consult, cite, rely on, or give any weight" on any statements that any individual legislator says or "a statement by the author or sponsor of the bill." So if that's the case, what would be the whole point? Are you proposing that we

change our whole practice here—that there is no point in us even debating a bill or even being elected and coming to the house floor to discuss bills because we're not allowing the courts to use anything that we've said to interpret a statute? How does that work in your proposal here?

VASUT: Through the legislative process, when the bill is filed by the author and they go to the committee, what the author intends and thinks and is trying to do is relevant for the committee in making a decision about whether to report that bill favorably, unfavorably, or not at all. Once the committee reports the bill and it comes to the house floor, the bill analysis provides the members of this body information about what it does and what the author was trying to do so that we can make an educated policy decision about whether or not we want to enact that law or we want to amend it.

Once we pass the bill through here, of course, it has to go through the senate. So the senate is going to look at the legislative history in determining whether or not it wants to pass the law, and then, once the senate passes it like we have or there's a conference committee and we both adopt the report, it goes to the governor. The governor is going to look and have his team look back at all of the discussion on the bill and everything in the packet to determine whether to sign that into law. That's relevant for those purposes, so it doesn't change that process. What it changes is when the ink hits the paper and that becomes the law. It is not for the court to go back and say, "Well, Representative so-and-so said this at the back microphone, so that must mean what they thought it meant." Or maybe so-and-so over here said it, because you're picking people out of a hat. You're giving more power to an individual of the legislature, rather than what we collectively passed into law. To your question, no, this does not render what we do on this floor meaningless. It's still very meaningful. It just ensures that when we ultimately pass legislation, that the courts give it the effect of the words we chose to put on paper; so the burden is on us to make sure we get it right.

RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: Well, you would agree that a picture is worth a thousand words, right? Looking at something, you're able to understand or interpret what is actually happening versus just reading an article. You get different interpretations based on what you see and what you have access to. As you mentioned, the debate here that we have engages, informs, and educates our peers as to the intention of the bill and why the legislator drafted something. We're afforded that opportunity because we have this dialogue, which will establish more of a basis for the purpose of that legislation. I think it's really important because not only do we get educated, but the populace gets educated as well. We share that information with the senate, and the governor takes that into account as well. We're closing that off when we take it to the courts, because now we're saying all these endless hours that we've spent parsing out words and making sure we understand the intention of the legislator—we're wiping that all away and saying, "Okay, courts. Don't listen to what we've said these past six months. Look at the black letter text, simply that." Now we're asking the court to make their interpretation based on words that they don't even really have a foundational

basis for, because they're now prohibited from going back and doing their research on what the intention is. Is that what you're proposing to do? Closing it out so the courts are not able to use anything that we're talking about here?

VASUT: What I am proposing is that when the legislature speaks, that action occurs through the passage of a bill, not questions and answers from the microphone, not what is in a bill analysis report, not what we put into the journal, but what we decided to underline and strike through in law. This is the legislature speaking. While you and I are having a dialogue that informs the vote on this bill—and is important for that purpose—this is not the law. The law is what we pass, and that's when the legislature speaks—it's through the law. The courts should be tasked with upholding the law passed by the legislature. That's really what we're getting at.

RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: Right, but the legislature speaking is also the legislator speaking. If I have a law that says one thing, but I'm here on the microphone espousing all of these racist statements or whatever, and that was the intention, I'm not going to get that written down in the law. But just know this statement that I say means this on the paper. I can now be on the microphone for hours and talk about another completely separate agenda, but the goal—my agenda—is over here. I'm going to make sure I write those statements to separate that. We're saying that the judges and the courts can no longer use the debate or the conversations. I could be on the microphone and say, "This bill is really intended to kill a lot of people." Now, the courts can't say when interpreting that law that the legislator's intent was to kill all of these people, because I didn't write that in the law. But that was my intent. That's what we're saying in this bill. We're allowing that to happen. Correct?

VASUT: I would disagree. I think, to your point about why you believe someone has filed legislation or pursued legislation, it's oftentimes a subjective analysis. Maybe it's informed by statements you make at the microphone—if somebody admits to something. I get that. But a lot of times it's just what we may view. Like I may be thinking about what you think. You may be thinking about what I think. But we're not expressing it. All a court is called on to do is enforce the law that we have passed and to adjudicate cases and controversies under that law. Regardless of what somebody intended, the law is to be applied. And if there's a problem with the law—if we wrote something that we shouldn't have or the program's not good—then that is our responsibility to fix it when we speak through the law.

RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: Okay. Another question I had—this bill not only prohibits the courts from using our words and the work that we do, other than what's written on the paper, it also explicitly prohibits courts from referring to state agency experts. Experts who, for example, know what environmental rules are or how work safety standards function in the real world. What's the reasoning behind forbidding courts from referring to subject matter experts who work day in and day out and have dedicated their careers, their studies, their education, and their professional lives on working on safety standards? Now we're saying that the courts can't even defer to those agency experts?

VASUT: Well, what we say is they're not required to. Even so, the prohibition does not prevent the court from considering the construction of a statute that an agency does "if that construction is reasonable and does not conflict with the plain language of the statute." You know, when we're giving agencies authority and they're interpreting a statute that we've passed, they should not be interpreting it in a way that is different from what we've said. Agencies are not the lawgiver—the legislature is. All of this is about making sure that the people's elected representatives—not a bureaucrat, not a judge—says what the law is. If we have an issue with how a law is applied or whether we think maybe this law doesn't do enough to address this environmental concern or otherwise, the people go to their members of the legislature and advocate for them to change the law. That's how we address it, rather than, for example, coming up with some interpretation of the law that conflicts with it.

RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: Right. I understand agencies do not create the law, but I think if we were sitting in this body today, it would take us more than six months to tackle just one agency, right? For us to do what HHSC does—or any other agency, like the EPA does or what have you—it would take us more than six months to do that. It would take us years just to tackle one agency, so we depend on the agency to provide those experts and to provide the know-how to guide us in how we're going to implement these laws.

VASUT: May I address where you're going with that?

RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: Yes, sir.

VASUT: Nothing in this prohibits the legislature from delegating authority to the agencies. Nothing in this prohibits the agencies from making and exercising their rulemaking authority that they already have. When the experts are adopting rules, they can do so as long as it is in line with the jurisdiction and the instructions that they have been given by the legislature. All this does is simply say that the agency cannot interpret a statute contrary to its plain and ordinary meaning. So to your point about deferring to experts—yes, there are experts in a variety of fields. I don't know anything about airplane mechanics, so I'm going to defer to an agency on some of those granular details. But the agency is going to do that pursuant to the authority we have delegated them, not exceeding that authority by interpreting the statutes contrary to their plain and ordinary meaning.

RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: If the courts second-guess every agency decision, won't this create chaos and uncertainty for the very Texans who need reliable guidance? How will this affect Texans relying on clear agency rules, like small businesses or families navigating health care programs?

VASUT: Great question. This is actually good for business. What this says to businesses is that when the legislature passes a law, that's what they're going to have to abide by, as opposed to some hidden meaning or intention that might be grasped onto by a judge. They'll know when they look at the statute that that is the playbook they're having to operate under. To your question about the agencies—the same is true for them. If we've delegated rulemaking authority, the rulemaking authority is in accordance with the jurisdiction we've given them.

They are not interpreting the statute contrary to its intent; it's going to be very clear to businesses. And, I think, the other example was families—how the law is going to work. On that basis, I don't see the issue.

RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: Okay. Now this is leading up to a question, so bear with me. Let me say for the benefit of those people at home watching, who may not know—after a decades-long corporate push, the Chevron deference doctrine was recently overturned by the Roberts Supreme Court. To explain, *Chevron* was a 1984 Supreme Court case that set the precedent that federal agencies should have the power to interpret the ambiguities in the laws of Congress. Now, this is important because Congress can't possibly legislate every small rule and regulation that we rely on our agencies to do. Taking away this deference and imposing judicial review means a judge now gets to decide for an agency how to do its job. In the aftermath, we've now seen agencies that protect our worker safety standards or our environmental protections get challenged in court after every rule they make, devastating their ability to protect us. Placing the judiciary above the legislative and executive branches destabilizes the balance of our government. Is this bill part of a national conservative push backed by ultra-wealthy corporate interests to attack our rulemaking agencies that safeguard our consumers—the same conservative movement that overturned *Chevron* in an attempt to bring the billionaire-backed slash-and-burn we see in the federal government happening now?

VASUT: No.

RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: This is not part of a conservative push?

VASUT: Well, I tend to be identified as a conservative. I think it's a pretty conservative public policy. What I mean by that is—I don't mean that in the political spectrum. I mean it's conservative in preserving the core traditions and functions of our government. The people in our Constitution have endowed legislative power in the legislature. This ensures that power is adhered to by the courts. In that sense, it's conservative. Not politically, but philosophically and judicially. So no. I would say no to the rest of your statement, but I hope I answered that fully.

RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: Yes, sir. Last question. It really goes contrary to 250 years of democratic norms where we are not allowed, or the courts are not allowed, to look at the legislative intent. In this practice—in this body—we often say we want the journal to put this in writing for legislative intent, or we want that for history so that we'll know and others will know what the intent is. Will that essentially be unnecessary moving forward?

VASUT: Well, "unnecessary" is perhaps a strong word. Again, as we mentioned, putting things into the journal is important for a number of other reasons—whether it is to inform our constituents or to inform the senate, to inform the governor. All I'm saying is it's not to inform the courts.

RODRÍGUEZ RAMOS: Okay, last thing. Is this a Heritage Foundation bill?

VASUT: No, it is not. I don't think I've ever worked with them.

REPRESENTATIVE MARTINEZ FISCHER: I listened to the earlier questions and answers, and I just want to be clear. Are you doing anything to impact current law on injunctions?

VASUT: Current law on injunctions?

MARTINEZ FISCHER: Or current practice on injunctions?

VASUT: Well, to the extent that you are seeking an injunction based on the violation of a statute and you prove irreparable harm and all of the other factors—let's put that aside and the baseline text. It would impact how the court interprets the statute. The way it would impact it is that the court would give the construction to the statute that was its plain and ordinary meaning.

MARTINEZ FISCHER: So that's your intent when you write this legislation. You are trying to guide the court on how they interpret the statute to render injunctive relief?

VASUT: Not necessarily. As the chief justice said during his state of the judiciary, the living Constitution is dead in Texas. This ensures that the concept of the living statute dies as well. The statute means what it says, not what somebody wants to give it—some other meaning.

MARTINEZ FISCHER: I guess I'm saying in this proposal—in this legislation—if a judge gets past that, he or she interprets a statute and decides to issue injunctive relief. Is there anything in this bill that would limit or instruct the court on how they provide the relief to the litigants?

VASUT: All this bill is about is the general precepts of statutory construction and prohibiting the use of certain material and certain aids, like legislative intent. So this is general application. If you know how this statute works—Section 311.003, Code Construction Act—these rules are not exclusive but are to provide guidance to the courts. I mean, the courts by and large are doing this already, but it's not in statute. And by courts, I mean the Texas courts—the Supreme Court, especially.

MARTINEZ FISCHER: And I get that. I mean, all the interpretation, the construction, and the intentionalism—that's all a judge is deliberating over. A controversy. But let's say a judge decided that injunctive relief is warranted and issued an injunction. Are you doing anything in this bill to instruct the court on the reach or the legal effect of that injunction?

VASUT: I apologize for asking a question from the front microphone, but I want to make sure I'm answering your question. Are you meaning in the sense that I am impacting how a court may craft judicial decrees?

MARTINEZ FISCHER: I think what I mean is that once a judge decides to issue injunctive relief, are you telling the judge who that injunctive relief would apply to?

VASUT: This does not amend, impair, or impede the preexisting statutes covering TROs, TIs, et cetera. I guess my answer to your question would be no, but maybe I'm not following. I apologize for that.

MARTINEZ FISCHER: I think you're right on that, because as I look at the sections of code that you are amending—you're in the Government Code. Is that right?

VASUT: Well, I mean the Code Construction Act and the Construction of Laws chapter—it's interesting that it is not called an act. The way that those work is that 311 is for the codified statutes, and 312 is for the uncodified statutes. It's statutes passed by the legislature. When the courts are interpreting those, they are to give them their plain and ordinary meaning. That's what this is about.

MARTINEZ FISCHER: Because you've said, maybe we don't tinker with injunctive relief. That's because it's in another section of code. If I'm not mistaken, it's in Chapter 65 of the Civil Practices and Remedies Code. Does that sound right?

VASUT: Well, I'll tell you this. It might be 65. It's been a minute since I looked at the CPRC. Whatever the governing statute is for the jurisdictional limits for a court writing injunctive relief, all we're saying is that it is to be interpreted by its plain and ordinary meaning, as opposed to impairing what type of injunctive relief a court grants under that authority.

MARTINEZ FISCHER: Again, we're not telling a judge how to apply an injunction. We're just telling a judge how to arrive at a decision as to whether or not to issue an injunction.

VASUT: Purely based off of interpreting the statute at issue—whatever that statute may be. And to the extent the court is going to craft a remedy, that is, of course, within the court's discretion.

CSHB 113 - POINT OF ORDER

Representative Martinez Fischer raised a point of order against further consideration of **CSHB 113** under Rule 8, Section 3, of the House Rules and under Article III, Section 35(a), of the Texas Constitution on the grounds that the bill contains more than one subject. The point of order was withdrawn.

CSHB 113 - POINT OF ORDER

Representative Wu raised a point of order against further consideration of **CSHB 113** under Rule 4, Section 32(c)(1), of the House Rules on the grounds that the background and purpose statement in the bill analysis is substantially or materially misleading. The point of order was withdrawn.

CSHB 113 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE WU: I'm exhausted, so I'll keep this short. Earlier today, Mr. Wilson and I had an exchange on the front and back microphones. He had a very important bill, and one of the bill's provisions said that something had to be filed. It was a long list of things, and there was no definition of what "filed" means. What needs to be filed? How does it need to be filed? Who would be falling under this—under filed? And it's not anywhere in the bill. As an attorney, you could look at it and say, "I don't know what this means." If I just look at the plain, regular meaning of the word, it still doesn't provide me with a definition of

what "filed" means in the context of that piece of legislation. If we put this law into place, people working on this would not be able to come find the video of us having that exchange and having Mr. Wilson explain what "filed" meant. That would not be available to the courts, even though they know it's right there and they can see it. They would be forbidden from using it—when you have a clear interpretation.

When I worked for the Court of Appeals—when I was an intern in the Court of Appeals, this was specifically one of the issues I worked on. They were looking at an old family law statute, and they could not tell, based on the interpretation of the statute in a parental kidnapping case, what certain words meant in that situation. It was just a common, everyday word. Don't ask me what it was, but it was something very simple. What did the legislature mean by this? The plain language of the statute doesn't give us any clues. So what they had me do was go back and look through the history of that statute. I went back through every single time they changed the statute to see if they changed that word, and we found where they changed it. We found that there were multiple versions of the bill. We found that, in fact, an older version had the word that the opposing counsel was saying, "That's what it should be." We could show that clearly. We could clearly see that the legislature considered using that term, struck it out, and used a different term instead. The courts could then say, very clearly, the legislature meant this instead of that because they had written that first and changed it to this. That is legislative intent. That is legislative interpretation.

The problem is that while all of us think that we're very smart, we are humans. Humans make mistakes. Humans can't think of every single possibility. We are passing laws this very day to try to address the inadequacies of the laws we passed before. How many of you are carrying bills that are just simple "fix-it" bills because you left something out on a big bill you passed a couple of years ago? Every single one of us, except for the freshman, has carried one of those bills at some point. That's the point. Because what we do—we can't possibly think of every situation, every scenario, and we try to pass a law that covers as much stuff as possible. We try to think of all the exceptions that we can think of, but try as we might—because we are human beings and the people who drafted our laws are human beings—we cannot think of everything. And also because we're humans, everything that we do—while it fits a nice, neat bell curve, there are people at the very ends who can find new and interesting ways to not fit the mold. And that's what interpretation is for. We wrote a law. The courts say, "Well, you have a situation that doesn't fall into any of these categories. What do we do?" You have to try to figure out what the intent is. That's it. If you want our justice system to work correctly, please don't vote for this bill. And this is not a D or an R issue. This is, do you want government to work or not? Please vote no.

VASUT: This is about ensuring the laws we pass are given their plain and ordinary meaning so that when the Constitution says, "The legislative power of this state shall be vested in a senate and a house of representatives," that is given effect.
