SECTION _____. Subchapter B, Chapter 56, Utilities Code, is amended by adding Section 56.0285 to read as follows:

Sec. 56.0285 REIMBURSEMENT OF FEDERALLY-QUALIFIED HEALTH CENTERS. (a) The health centers defined in Section 58.2535 are entitled to receive from the universal service fund the equivalent of a rebate equal to the difference between the company's tariffed rate for interexchange high capacity service (at or in excess of 1.544 Mbps) as of January 1, 1998 and the lowest rate offered for that service by any local exchange company electing incentive rate regulation under Chapter 58.

(b) This section shall govern to the extent there is a conflict with any other provision of the Utilities Code.

MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE

CSHB 951 – STATEMENT OF LEGISLATIVE INTENT

REPRESENTATIVE HOWARD: Does this bill create any penalties or liabilities for someone who wishes to put a deer blind or fishing on a pipeline easement?

REPRESENTATIVE FARABEE: This bill, as it's substituted, would provide that the person who is going to build that deer blind or some structure notify the pipeline operator and give the pipeline operator an opportunity to have injunctive relief if they feel the deer blind would possibly damage the pipeline. Because of the limited nature of the construction of a deer blind, the people who have consulted on this substitute feel like that would not be damaging to the pipeline.

HOWARD: But does this bill create a penalty for that person?

FARABEE: It does not create a penalty, but this bill, as substituted, does provide an avenue if it's the opinion of the pipeline that this deer blind would do damage. But the opinion of the pipeline operators is that deer blinds would not. But for a larger structure, this bill, as substituted would provide an avenue into court.
