PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY

REPRESENTATIVE LEACH: For the body, can you say again what just happened?

CHAIR (Sheets in the chair): What just happened was that Representative Coleman raised a point of order against further consideration of **HB 1486**. We are currently in the process of determining what course of action should be taken. So that we can move things along, both parties—Representative Galindo and Representative Coleman—agreed that we would temporarily withdraw the point of order and that we would postpone Mr. Galindo's bill until 11:45 a.m. so that we would have time to look at the point of order. Both parties have agreed that they will come up here before any further action is taken.

LEACH: So both Representative Galindo and Representative Coleman have voluntarily agreed to withdraw, not only the point of order, but the bill, temporarily, while the parliamentarian analyzes the point of order and ultimately rules on the point of order, correct?

CHAIR: That's correct. Well, the speaker rules on the point of order.

LEACH: The speaker, while he analyzes the point of order—okay. Is it the practice of the parliamentarian or the speaker to communicate with the author of the bill and the member who raised the point of order before the parliamentarian or the speaker rules on the point of order?

CHAIR: Mr. Leach, because of everything that happened yesterday, we made it very clear to both parties that we would call them up before any actions were taken regarding that bill.

LEACH: Is a member and author of a bill whose bill is subject to a point of order—let's just assume that it's a sustainable point of order—is the author of the bill, going forward, to be allowed the opportunity to withdraw and recommit the bill before a point of order is sustained?

CHAIR: That's up to the agreement of the members that are involved in the point of order on the bill.

LEACH: I think this is important. The reason I'm asking these questions is because what happened yesterday and what's happening now. It's important for the members to understand specifically what did happen and the ramifications going forward. If a member has a point of order that he or she believes is a good, sustainable point of order, are they going to be allowed the opportunity, before the speaker rules on the point of order, to allow the author the opportunity to recommit the bill and otherwise save the bill? Because that opportunity was not given yesterday. I just want to know, going forward, what the practice of this house is going to be.

CHAIR: Members, we just responded to what just happened in this particular case, and that will be the practice going forward.

REPRESENTATIVE MARTINEZ FISCHER: Just so that we're clear. My recollection of the practice of the house is that a point of order supersedes a matter on the floor when a point of order is properly called. Is that correct?

CHAIR: That is correct, sir.

MARTINEZ FISCHER: Okay, and then I think it's been the practice of the house that in those instances when points of order require time and research—and we all know that the parliamentarian needs that opportunity, and no one's trying to deny that—it's been the practice of the house that both bills and points of order are temporarily withdrawn. Am I right there?

CHAIR: That is absolutely correct, sir.

MARTINEZ FISCHER: I think it's also fair to say that when the matter comes back up, that it comes back up in the manner by which it came down temporarily. I want to be careful and mindful. I know that accidents happen, mistakes get made, and we're on a new legislative day. There's nothing that can be done about yesterday. I'm not trying to reargue yesterday. It's just been my general understanding that when something's been temporarily withdrawn, when it comes back up, it comes back the very same way. In other words, no member has to do anything different. If the chair is ready to rule and dispose of the matter or bring the matter back up, it comes up the same way it was withdrawn.

CHAIR: Members, what the chair can say is once a bill is withdrawn from consideration and it's taken back up, there can be interactions on that bill that can be presented to the body.

MARTINEZ FISCHER: I would think, though, that I would ask the chair to-

CHAIR: For instance, there have been points of order raised in this session, in previous sessions, where the bill has been recommitted to committee before the bill is laid out again. There have been times when the bill has been completely withdrawn from the calendar or postponed to a later date.

MARTINEZ FISCHER: Mr. Speaker, if I may, let me just be very clear here. I think that the purpose and intent for members to temporarily withdraw matters is to extend a courtesy to the chair and the parliamentarian and those concerned to adequately have time, because we know that simply if a member who lodges a point of order and refuses to temporarily withdraw that point of order—then the body doesn't move. So I don't think it is the desire of the chair to bring everything to a grinding halt when I think, as a matter of practice, if a matter is temporarily withdrawn, then that matter will come up exactly the same way it was withdrawn so that everybody knows what's happening. There could be instances when a movement of a point of order could be temporarily out of the chamber, and somebody uses that as an opportunity to get a bill back out and recommit or to do whatever that member wants, which I don't think is really the practice of the house. I'm not asking the chair to tell me right now, if the chair wants to think about this, but I think we should be very careful. Otherwise, I think anybody who calls a point of order will have no incentive to temporarily

withdraw it and then the calendar doesn't move. I don't think that's the intent of folks when they call points of order, should they wish to allow business to proceed.

CHAIR: Thank you, Mr. Martinez Fischer. To make it clear, what just happened up here on the dais was that both parties agreed that no further action would be taken on this bill until both parties were present, up here at the dais, to discuss what the next step is.

MARTINEZ FISCHER: I appreciate that—with all due respect, I do—but I also know that we shouldn't have an inconsistent standard for anybody, on any day, who decides to call a point of order. I think we have a house practice, and when people know what the practice is, then I think everybody's most comfortable. As I understand the chair, from their position, that this has happened this session. I just want the chair to understand that from my position, over the course of several terms, I very, very succinctly recall that bills that come down temporarily come back up in the same manner in which they were temporarily withdrawn. So there is a point of order that will sit on top of the bill so that all parties can be present to negotiate, get a ruling, agree to withdraw-so that bills can be recommitted. And that's just my recollection of events. I think that would be the more prudent course of action going forward. I'm not trying to reargue, relitigate what happened yesterday. We are on a new day. But just for my operation going forward, I want to be able to think that should I choose to temporarily withdraw a point of order, I don't lose that moment, if I'm out of the chamber or doing something else.

POSTPONED BUSINESS

HB 1018 ON SECOND READING (by Geren)

HB 1018, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to the prohibition of certain alcoholic beverages; creating an offense.

HB 1018 was read second time on May 1 and was postponed until 9 a.m. today.

Representative Geren moved to postpone consideration of **HB 1018** until 10 a.m. Saturday, July 4.

HB 1486 ON THIRD READING (by Galindo and Fallon)

HB 1486, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to a prohibition on a vendor contact with a member of the board of trustees of certain independent school districts during the procurement process.

HB 1486 was read third time earlier today, an amendment was offered, and **HB 1486** was postponed until this time. Amendment No. 1 was pending at the time of postponement.

HB 1486 - POINT OF ORDER

Representative Coleman raised a point of order against further consideration of **HB 1486** under Rule 4, Section 40; Rule 8, Section 10; Rule 11, Section 2 of the House Rules and Article III, Section 56(a) of the Texas Constitution on the grounds that the committee substitute attempts to create a local bill by amendment and is not germane to the bill.

The speaker overruled the point of order and submitted the following statement:

Representative Coleman raised a point of order against further consideration of **HB 1486** under Rule 4, Section 40; Rule 8, Section 10; and Rule 11, Section 2 of the House Rules and Article III, Section 56(a) of the Texas Constitution on the grounds that the committee substitute attempts to create a local bill by amendment and uses an artificial bracket with no reasonable relationship to the purpose of the prosed legislation. The point of order is respectfully overruled.

A "committee may adopt and report a complete germane committee substitute...." Rule 4, Section 40 of the House Rules. However, Rule 8, Section 10(b) of the House Rules prohibits bills limited by population brackets or other artificial devices unless the bill "classifies political subdivisions according to a minimum or maximum population or other criterion that bears a reasonable relation to the purpose of the proposed legislation...." Rule 8, Section 10(b) of the House Rules. The Texas Constitution generally prohibits local laws, with some exceptions that are subject to public notice requirements. TEX. CONST. art. III, § 56(a) ("The legislature shall not, except as otherwise provided in this Constitution, pass any local or special law...."). Finally, Rule 11, Section 2 of the House Rules bars any "motion or proposition on a subject different from the subject under consideration" from being admitted as an amendment or substitute for a measure under debate. Rule 11, Section 2 of the House Rules.

Representative Coleman notes that **HB 1486** originally applied to all school districts in the state. He asserts that the committee substitute impermissibly added an artificial population bracket to Section 1 of the bill. The bracket in the committee substitute makes the bill apply "only to an independent school district any part of which is located in a county with a population of more than 1.5 million in which more than 75 percent of the population lives in a single municipality." Representative Coleman argues that **HB 1486**, which everyone agrees is a general law, was transformed by the bracket contained in the committee substitute into a local bill in violation of Rules 4, 8, and 10 of the House Rules; Rule 8, Section 10(b) of the House Rules; Rule 11, Section 2 of the House Rules; TEX. CONST. art. III, § 56(a). He further asserts that this bracket bears no reasonable relation to the purpose of the bill.

HB 1486 would prohibit communication in certain circumstances between members of the board of trustees of an applicable independent school district and "an actual or prospective bidder or offeror relating to a request for proposals or an advertisement for bids. . . ." Although the bracket contained in the committee substitute was not included in the bill as originally filed, the bracket's classification scheme applies uniformly, is broad enough to include a substantial class or geographic area and the membership of the class may expand or contract over time, and is based on characteristics that legitimately distinguish, in relation to the public purpose to be served, the class or area from other classes or areas. *See* 83 H.J. HB 996, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to the effect of certain agreements with a collective bargaining organization on certain state-funded public work contracts.

HB 996 was read second time earlier today and was postponed until this time.

HB 996 - POINT OF ORDER

Representative Martinez raised a point of order against further consideration of **HB 996** under Rule 4, Section 32(c)(2) of the House Rules on the grounds that the bill analysis is incorrect.

The chair overruled the point of order and submitted the following statement:

Representative Martinez raised a point of order against further consideration of **HB 996** under Rule 4, Section 32(c)(2) of the House Rules on the grounds that the bill analysis is incorrect, provides insufficient detail, and is materially and substantially misleading. The point of order is respectfully overruled.

Rule 4, Section 32(c)(2) of the House Rules requires each committee report to include "an analysis of the content of the bill or resolution...." Rule 4, Section 32(c)(2) of the House Rules. **HB 996**, in part, disallows both an institution of higher education and a governmental entity "awarding a public work contract funded with state money" from "prohibit[ing], requir[ing], discourag[ing], or encourag[ing] a person bidding on the public work contract, including a contractor or subcontractor, from entering into or adhering to" certain agreements. **HB 996** also disallows these entities from discriminating against such a person "based on the person's involvement in the agreement, including the person's: (A) status or lack of status as a party to the agreement; or (B) willingness or refusal to enter into the agreement."

The bill analysis does not specifically address either the bill's description of "a person" as "including a contractor or subcontractor," nor does it address the bill's description of relevant bases of discrimination as including "status as a party to the agreement" or "willingness or refusal to enter into the agreement." Representative Martinez asserts that the failure of bill analysis to specifically reference these provisions renders the analysis incorrect, insufficient, and misleading in violation of Rule 4, Section 32(c)(2) of the House Rules. HB 996 does not limit a person bidding on a public work contract to contractors or subcontractors; rather, subcontractors and contractors are referenced as non-exclusive examples of the types of people included in this category. Similarly, the prohibited bases of discrimination mentioned in the bill-status as a party to the agreement and willingness or refusal to enter into the agreement-also constitute non-exclusive examples of prohibited discriminatory bases. Because the language of HB 996 is broad enough to reasonably include more than the above-referenced examples, the bill analysis's reference to the broader category in which the examples were included sufficed to satisfy Rule 4, Section 32(c)(2) of the House Rules. For these reasons, the chair determines that the bill analysis is neither incorrect, insufficient, nor misleading. See Rule 4, Section 32(c)(2) of the House Rules.

HB 996 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE C. TURNER: I was listening to your dialogue with Representative Howard, and I just want to understand. Is there an example of a project, PLA, that you're trying to ban with this bill in Texas that has gone wrong, or caused a problem, or hurt the economy?

REPRESENTATIVE PARKER: As I said earlier, representative, in terms of PLA agreements there are PLA agreements that have been used on private projects here in Texas that have been successful in the private sector. So again, this bill is not prohibiting the use of PLA agreements in the future. We're just really allowing contractors to have the choice of whether or not they intend to bid a project using a PLA or not. We're giving them discretion in allowing the state, using state money on a state project, to determine what is best based on value and quality.

C. TURNER: Okay. For example, it's my understanding that the Toyota plant in San Antonio is an example of a project that has used a PLA. If this bill had been in effect, would they have been able to do that?

PARKER: Absolutely. Just like up in the North Texas area there's another Toyota facility as well that, it's my understanding, utilized a PLA agreement in the private sector. So this bill would have no effect on them. We're talking about projects that are using state resources, and we're just leveling the playing field. PLAs are not being disallowed.

C. TURNER: Obviously Toyota is a private project but there were state funds involved. As I recall, it was Texas enterprise funds involved. So if there were state economic development funds involved, then would it have been affected?

PARKER: Well, if state enterprise dollars were involved then the contractor would have the choice of bringing a PLA agreement or not. We wouldn't prohibit a PLA, by any means.

C. TURNER: Okay, I truly want to understand this. In the case of Toyota, even though there was state and probably local incentive funds involved in that plan in San Antonio, your bill would not prohibit a PLA in that case. It would still leave the option to—

PARKER: The option of a PLA could be used for the next—hopefully Toyota will want to build many other plants in the future.

C. TURNER: I hope so, too. We want one in Arlington. Actually, we're a GM town. I take that back.

PARKER: I grew up in Arlington, so I understand GM well.

C. TURNER: Going forward, if it's a Toyota in the future or any other major project—and my understanding is these are usually pretty complicated types of projects. These aren't like building a building. These are complicated projects, like the South Texas nuclear power plant and Toyota manufacturing facility, where these agreements come into play. They could still do those, under your bill, if they chose to, even if state incentive funds were involved?

PARKER: That's right. We allow the contractor to make the decision. That's correct, representative.

CSHB 2123, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to participation of the state military forces in the state group benefits program.

Amendment No. 1

Representative Schaefer offered the following amendment to CSHB 2123:

Amend **CSHB 2123** (house committee report) by striking all below the enacting clause and substituting the following:

SECTION 1. Section 437.212, Government Code, is amended by amending Subsections (f) and (g) and adding Subsections (g-1), (g-2), and (g-3) to read as follows:

(f) A member of the state military forces [volunteer in the Texas State Guard] who is not a full-time or part-time state employee and who has been on state active duty or on state training or other duty for more than <u>60</u> [90] days is, notwithstanding Section 1551.1055, Insurance Code, eligible to participate in the state group benefits program under Chapter 1551, Insurance Code, to purchase health or dental insurance coverage, subject to the following requirements:

(1) the participant must be a member of the <u>state military forces</u> [Texas State Guard] at the time of enrollment in the group benefits program;

(2) the participant must pay the full cost of health or dental insurance coverage under the group benefits program [and may not receive a state contribution for premiums]; and

(3) an application under this subsection for group benefit health or dental insurance coverage must be submitted in accordance with procedures established by the Employees Retirement System of Texas.

(g) The adjutant general and the Employees Retirement System of Texas shall coordinate and consult to implement the benefits program provided by Subsection (f) and shall adopt a memorandum of understanding to establish:

(1) the procedures that a member of the <u>state military forces</u> [Texas State Guard] may use to elect to participate in the state group benefits program; and

(2) an appropriate method to annually confirm continuing eligibility to participate in the group benefits program.

(g-1) A member of the state military forces described by Subsection (f) is eligible to receive a stipend to be paid by the department in an amount to be determined by the department under Subsection (g-3) for each month following the 60th day that the member:

(1) is on state active duty or on state training or other duty; and

(2) subject to verification by the adjutant general as provided by Section 437.2121, pays the full cost of health or dental insurance coverage under:

(A) the state group benefits program;

(B) a government-funded health or dental insurance plan; or

(C) a private or nongovernmental health or dental insurance plan for which the member is required to pay premiums.

(g-2) A member of the state military forces who is eligible to receive a stipend under Subsection (g-1) must notify the adjutant general of the member's health or dental insurance coverage by submitting the authorization form specified by Section 437.2121. The adjutant general may adopt rules to implement and administer this subsection, including rules that prescribe the procedure a member must follow to submit an executed authorization form and the amount of time a member has to submit the authorization form. The comptroller may consult with the adjutant general to adopt rules governing the manner in which an eligible member may receive a stipend.

(g-3) A stipend paid to a member of the Texas National Guard may not exceed the amount of the member's TRICARE premium or an amount equal to that premium to be applied toward the member's private or nongovernmental insurance plan. A stipend paid to a member of the Texas State Guard or other member of a military force organized under state law may not exceed the amount of the member's health or dental insurance plan premium determined by the

premium amount associated with the state group benefits program or an amount equal to that premium to be applied toward the member's private or nongovernmental insurance plan.

SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 437, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 437.2121 to read as follows:

Sec. 437.2121. AUTHORIZATION FORM FOR RELEASE OF PROTECTED HEALTH INFORMATION. (a) A member of the state military forces who meets the eligibility requirements under Section 437.212(g-1) may not receive a stipend under that section unless the member submits to the adjutant general the authorization form specified by this section. The adjutant general must verify that the member has paid the full cost of the member's health or dental insurance coverage before the department may issue a stipend to the member.

(b) The authorization form specified by this section may not be altered or modified. A member who alters or modifies the authorization form, or who revokes an executed authorization, may not receive a stipend to which the member may otherwise be eligible until 60 days following receipt by the adjutant general of a newly executed authorization form.

(c) The authorization form required by this section shall be in the following form and shall be construed in accordance with the Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information (45 C.F.R. Parts 160 and 164):

AUTHORIZATION FORM FOR RELEASE OF PROTECTED HEALTH

INFORMATION

A. I, ______ (name of state military forces member or authorized representative), hereby authorize ______ (name of health or dental insurance coverage provider to whom the authorization form is directed) to obtain and disclose (within the parameters set out below) the protected health information described below for the purpose of verifying that ______ (name of state military forces member), as a member of the state military forces called to state active duty or on state training or other duty for more than 60 days, is eligible for a stipend as provided by Section 437.212, Government Code.

B. The health information to be obtained, used, or disclosed extends to and includes the verbal as well as the written and is specifically described as all records documenting payment of health or dental insurance coverage premiums by ______ (name of state military forces member), including information related to the eligibility for coverage, dates of coverage, billing, payments received, and termination of coverage.

<u>C.</u> The persons or class of persons to whom the health information of (state military forces member) will be disclosed or who will make use of said information are:

1. The adjutant general of the state military forces;

2. Any agent, contractor, or staff of the state military forces, including secretarial, clerical, accounting, information technology, or administrative staff, designated by the adjutant general to assist with the determination of eligibility for a stipend or the processing or issuing of stipends;

3. The comptroller;

4. Any agent, contractor, or staff of the comptroller designated by the comptroller to assist with the determination of eligibility for a stipend or the processing or issuing of stipends.

D. This authorization shall expire on the discharge of the member from the state military forces.

E. I understand that, without exception, I have the right to revoke this authorization by providing written notice to a person or class of persons designated by the adjutant general. I further understand the consequence of any such revocation as set out in Section 437.2121, Government Code.

F. I understand that the signing of this authorization is not a condition for continued treatment, payment, enrollment, or eligibility for health plan benefits.

G. I understand that information used or disclosed under this authorization may be subject to redisclosure by the recipient and may no longer be protected by federal HIPAA privacy regulations.

(a) A person may not engage in the business of money transmission or advertise, solicit, or hold itself out as a person that engages in the business of money transmission unless the person:

(1) is licensed under this subchapter;

(2) is an authorized delegate of a person licensed under this subchapter, appointed by the license holder in accordance with Section 151.402;

(3) is excluded from licensure under Section 151.003; [or]

(4) is licensed as a depository agent under Subchapter J and only engages in the business of money transmission in connection with, and to the extent necessary for, the performance of depository agent activities; or

(5) has been granted an exemption under Subsection (c).

SECTION _____. Section 151.502(a), Finance Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 151.502. LICENSE REQUIRED. (a) A person may not engage in the business of currency exchange or advertise, solicit, or hold itself out as providing currency exchange unless the person:

(1) is licensed under this subchapter;

(2) is licensed for money transmission under Subchapter D;

(3) is an authorized delegate of a person licensed for money transmission under Subchapter D;

(4) is excluded under Section 151.003; [or]

(5) is licensed as a depository agent under Subchapter J and only engages in the business of currency exchange in connection with, and to the extent necessary for, the performance of depository agent activities; or

(6) has been granted an exemption under Subsection (d).

If a public retirement system's actuarial valuation shows that the system's amortization period has exceeded 40 years for three consecutive annual actuarial valuations, or two consecutive actuarial valuations in the case of a system that conducts the valuations every two or three years, the associated governmental entity shall formulate a funding soundness restoration plan under Subsection (e) in accordance with the public retirement system's governing statute.

(d) An associated governmental entity that has formulated a funding soundness restoration plan under Subsection (e) shall formulate a revised funding soundness restoration plan under that subsection, in accordance with the public retirement system's governing statute, if the system conducts an actuarial valuation showing that:

(1) the system's amortization period exceeds 40 years; and

(2) the previously formulated funding soundness restoration plan has not been adhered to.

(e) A funding soundness restoration plan formulated under this section must:

(1) be developed in accordance with the public retirement system's governing statute by the associated governmental entity; and

(2) be designed to achieve a contribution rate that will be sufficient to amortize the unfunded actuarial accrued liability within 40 years not later than the 10th anniversary of the date on which the final version of a funding soundness restoration plan is formulated.

(f) An associated governmental entity that formulates a funding soundness restoration plan shall report any updates of progress made by the public retirement system and associated governmental entity toward improved actuarial soundness to the board every two years.

(g) An associated governmental entity that formulates a funding soundness restoration plan as provided by this section shall submit a copy of that plan to the board and any change to the plan not later than the 31st day after the date on which the plan or the change is formulated.
