HB 1096 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE MURPHY: This is a bill we passed yesterday about establishing what documents are used in the case of a voter's address being disputed.

REPRESENTATIVE CANALES: Can you give me a scenario in which your bill would take effect or would apply? A practical scenario. For instance, voter age on their driver's license doesn't match or—

MURPHY: When someone's registration is challenged—someone says, well, I don't think Terry Canales resides at that address, for instance, it doesn't match—you have a 30-day period before which you'll appear before the voter registrar. That challenge already exists in law today, and what this would do is establish a series of documents that you can use to establish that residency.

CANALES: And a general challenge to somebody would—say, for instance, my driver's license has a different address. Would that preclude me from voting?

MURPHY: No, this is not related to voting. This is to the registration. So your vote is a separate occasion.

CANALES: I'm sorry—would that preclude me from registering? I apologize.

MURPHY: No, this is not necessary to register. This is only in a challenge of what's already registered.

CANALES: So your bill only applies to somebody challenging residency?

MURPHY: Correct, post-registration. So this is not a condition by which you have to register.

REPRESENTATIVE E. RODRIGUEZ: To follow up on Representative Canales' last question—so it's on the registration. So if it's challenged on my voter registration, there's a chance that I won't be able to use that registration. I won't be able to vote, right? Potentially?

MURPHY: It's a 30-day period, and so you have that same period of time in which you could register. The periods mirror each other.

E. RODRIGUEZ: So how many different IDs are in this bill again? There's six different ones, is that right?

MURPHY: Yes, I think there's six or seven. There's a number of exemptions, Representative Rodriguez. There's also an opt-out that if someone has the inability to certify a residence, say in the case of a homeless person, they actually can go to a judge and execute an affidavit and present that to the registrar for the purposes of certifying their address.

E. RODRIGUEZ: In the hierarchy—what's the top in the hierarchy of these?

MURPHY: The Texas driver's license.

E. RODRIGUEZ: So if I just recently moved to an apartment, and my driver's license says one thing, but my actual address, where I'm trying to register, says something else, and there's that time in between before I can actually go to the DMV and change my driver's license information—what happens in that case?

MURPHY: I mean, you could register the day you move.

E. RODRIGUEZ: I can register the day I move?

MURPHY: Right.

E. RODRIGUEZ: Yes, I understand that, but if someone's challenging the residency—

MURPHY: Oh, I'm sorry—it's a 30-day period. You have 30 days before you appear before the registrar. So that would give you 30 days from the date of the challenge to find some time to clarify your documents or whatever was needed.

E. RODRIGUEZ: There are a lot of people, as I'm sure you know, representative, that don't do that in that timely of a fashion. In fact, because now we keep raising the fees to be able to renew your driver's license, for example, people might just wait until it expires before they actually even do that. In that case, then you might have a situation where someone might have a problem with the registration. And that's the concern that I have. Do you see that as a possibility? If someone doesn't do that within those 30 days?

MURPHY: What I want to be clear about is this bill does not create the law that says you have to change your driver's license within 30 days. That's already part of our Transportation Code. It's Section 521.054. It says when you move, you have 30 days to change your driver's license. And so as we talked with Representative Reynolds yesterday, it's a lot cheaper to go and pay your \$11 to renew your license than pay the ticket for having an incorrectly addressed license.

REPRESENTATIVE COLEMAN: You know, I'm just curious. Is there a problem that we're solving with this bill?

MURPHY: I do believe so.

COLEMAN: And what is that problem?

MURPHY: The problem is, as we heard in testimony, we have people who are registered in vacant lots, mailboxes, commercial buildings—and when those people are challenged, there's no way for the registrars to know exactly how to adjudicate that. Do they use this document? That document? So what we're doing here is laying out these are the documents that you use for that purpose.

COLEMAN: And all of them have to have an address that corresponds with the voter registration in terms of the way you laid this bill out?

MURPHY: Well, any one of them does, except for the exemptions. So there are exemptions for full-time students, there are exemptions for military, and a couple others, I believe, Garnet. And then there's also the opt-out where you can go to a judge if you don't have an address, and say you don't have an address, but you reside at this location and you can have that affidavit presented.

COLEMAN: So you think a lot of people who don't reside at a location know how to go to a judge in order to do this?

MURPHY: You know, I really can't tell.

COLEMAN: I'm asking a real, serious question. You're going to require them to go to a judge?

MURPHY: Well, they have that option. If they don't have a driver's license, identification card, residence, car title, a whole series of items—

COLEMAN: Yes, a lot of people don't have that, and the reality is it's still more cumbersome. Why would we make it more cumbersome for people to have a valid voter registration?

MURPHY: This is only, Garnet, in the times where someone has a challenge to their residency address.

COLEMAN: I'm going to tell you something. I'm registered at my family address, which is my mother's house. I want to be very clear about that. And many of the people in my district—that's the family home, and that's what they do. So my driver's license, if somebody were to challenge it, would not fit the address of my registration. I live in my district, and my registration is in the district. This is traditional among, particularly, African American communities. Wouldn't you agree?

MURPHY: I really don't know.

COLEMAN: Well, it is. And so I think that it's a challenge when we change the law to say that somebody's doing wrong because people use that as their permanent forever address for the Coleman family.

MURPHY: Well, the law is pretty clear that you are to reside and vote in the same location. And the process for appealing that, challenging the residency, is already there.

COLEMAN: In the existing law?

MURPHY: Yes. This bill, all it does is lay out how do you figure that out. This is to protect both the voters in the case of a challenge and the registrars in terms of how do they process it fairly.

COLEMAN: Let me be clear. In terms of your present residence—it's not that you live in the place that you call your residence. And I think that there's an issue with this. You know, I'm not—you're doing your bill and all like that, but I just want you to know that there are probably going to be some issues where people who use that as their—they're not students, they're not anything like that. It's how they deal with their family responsibilities. And they do that on purpose, not for anything that is sinister. I'd hope as this moves along you would consider that.

MURPHY: We've worked pretty hard on this-

COLEMAN: I didn't ask you whether you worked hard on it. I'm a stakeholder. I'm asking, would you consider it?

MURPHY: Absolutely, Garnet.

REPRESENTATIVE HERRERO: I'm trying to figure out, practically, what your bill is trying to address in real terms, if you will. So as I understand it, and please correct me where I'm wrong on the process, I'm a high school student that is going to register to vote. So I fill out a voter registration card, and I put in my name and my identification information which would include an address, correct?

MURPHY: Yes, sir.

HERRERO: That gets submitted to the deputy registrar. They then, I guess, verify information and then they give you a voter registration card that tells you what district you're in, U.S. congressional district you're in, senate, et cetera. And then you take that along now with a photo ID to go vote, correct?

MURPHY: Yes, sir, that's my understanding.

HERRERO: So where in the process does your bill come into play? Where in that process, from the time to register to vote to the time that I'm actually voting, who questions the validity of my address? And what's that process? And how do we prohibit someone from arbitrarily picking, let's say you, to challenge your address?

MURPHY: So the question about where in that process does that occur—the answer is nowhere. There is no requirement to have any of this material to register or to vote. That's not a part of the process. The challenge process, saying I don't think this person's address is valid or matches, is already in law. That's already there. And any voter—they have to be from within the same county is the way the law is written—can challenge that registration. So if that were to occur you would have that 30-day period before which you would then go to the voter registrar who would determine if that's valid. What this law is about, Chairman

Herrero, is establishing a process for that registrar to go through that to say okay, these documents match so you're fine or maybe they don't match and you need to do something else. But you still have a 30-day period to sort of cure that problem.

HERRERO: Right now, to the extent that that problem exists, how is that currently rectified? I mean, without your bill; your bill is not law yet, so the process—what you're telling me is that we're not changing existing law, as it is, as to anything else other than if your address, or residency specifically, is contested. Then and only then would your bill take effect as to what are the steps or provisions that would be acceptable to verify that address. So my question is, let's assume your bill does not pass, what is current law when someone's address is contested?

MURPHY: It's really pretty vague, and it's sort of up to each registrar to determine what measures they think are appropriate.

HERRERO: Please give me some examples. So right now if in Nueces County someone's address was contested, who contests this? Is it the registrar in the county that says, you know what, I don't think Representative Murphy's address is really where he says that it is, and so I'm going to ask that he verify that address for me? And then how would you prove otherwise, under current law?

MURPHY: That's one of the problems. One of the things we are seeking to clarify with this law is how does that occur. It is not explicitly defined currently, Chairman Herrero. The challenge has to come from somebody within the county. That's all that the law says currently and then it's up to that registrar. And so in some counties there is a separate voter registrar. In some places it's the county clerk—it sort of depends what county you're in. And then they have their own processes for determining how that takes place. There's really not a standard, and that's what we're seeking to provide here. It's something that we've had a lot of testimony, a lot of witnesses come in, and people try to craft a bill that makes sense. So we're trying to protect the registrars from having their decisions challenged and the voters to know what's expected of them to verify they have a residence.

HERRERO: Is there no notice now as to how someone could correctly identify or verify their address? What you're telling me is that it seems that it could be a number of ways that someone can do it, but you haven't given me how they can do it under current law.

MURPHY: A lot of the processes we've identified here are, in fact, the way that it's occurring. So some places would want to see a piece of mail. Some people—

HERRERO: Your response then would be we're trying to simply codify a practice that is being utilized across the state by different registrars in different ways?

MURPHY: I think that that's a very good way of putting it.

REPRESENTATIVE ANCHIA: Chairman Murphy, I want to understand how this bill works in the case of folks who are called escapees. Have you ever heard of the escapees?

MURPHY: You'll have to define what you mean by that.

ANCHIA: An escapee is someone who lives in their trailer home all year and drives around the United States, but lists Texas as their address. There are trailer parks in many districts throughout the state where you may only have 100 spaces, but you have 5,000 people who list that as their address. How would this impact those situations?

MURPHY: These people, all citizens, would be under the same guidelines that if their address was challenged, they would have to be able to produce one of these documents evidencing that nexus between what's shown on their voter registration address and their residence address.

ANCHIA: And they would have to do that in a 30-day period, once challenged?

MURPHY: Correct. Yes, sir.

ANCHIA: Have you given thought to this at scale? For example, if one of the political parties in Dallas County wanted to do this at scale and submit thousands of challenges to registrations, what happens then? Let's say Toni Pippins-Poole in Dallas County gets 2,000 challenges to voter registrations by the Republican Party of Dallas County. What happens?

MURPHY: You'd have the same situation you had over the years. I know in Harris County we had an issue with a whole bunch of people registered through ACORN, I believe it was, and there were all kinds of challenges—

ANCHIA: What piece of the hypothetical I just gave you—what is the county supposed to do at that point? What is their legal obligation under your bill?

MURPHY: Well, under my bill it doesn't impose any new obligations, but what it would do is clarify that process. I think it would make their job much, much easier, much less costly to the taxpayers. In fact, I think without this bill you would have a repeat of the issue we had in Harris County—this is an example not a theoretical—where they tried to adjudicate it, and there were back and forth challenges and lawsuits. And it was a pretty ugly and unresolved situation because no one really knew exactly how should this be done.

ANCHIA: So under the hypothetical I gave you, if that occurred in Dallas County then the county elections administrator would be required to follow the process in your bill and ask all of these registered persons who have been challenged, let's say 1,000 or 2,000 of them, to produce that information? And if they don't produce that information within 30 days they are removed from the voter rolls?

MURPHY: That's my understanding. They would have to reregister in a location—

ANCHIA: And who bears that cost?

MURPHY: What cost is that?

ANCHIA: The cost of sending out notifications to the challenged voters to verifying the information that's sent back—who bears that cost?

MURPHY: Well, as I said earlier, the voter registrar, not the elections board necessarily, does that. Each county has to designate for itself who their voter registrar is, so sometimes it's the county clerk, sometimes it's the tax assessor-collector.

ANCHIA: So the county. It's some official of the county.

MURPHY: Yes, essentially. The county government is where this authority resides.

ANCHIA: Okay, and so have you thought about how this works at scale then and the costs that may be associated with something done? It could be the Democratic Party doing this, republicans, whoever, furnishing these challenges.

MURPHY: Well, one of the things I would point out is I'm from—well, actually it is the largest county in Texas, so I would say that doesn't really concern me. I have not heard pushback from the counties in the hearings we've had on this. And I would also say I would think about whatever cost there is of mailing some things back and forth or listening to people that want to make sure that they are correctly registered is a pretty good value relative to the integrity of the roll.

- (3) the impact of establishing a regional rating method for determining premiums charged in different regions of the state for the benefits provided under a group coverage plan established under the program.
- (b) The joint interim committee shall be composed of six senators appointed by the lieutenant governor and six members of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.

- (c) The lieutenant governor and speaker of the house of representatives shall each designate a co-chair from among the joint interim committee members.
- (d) The joint interim committee shall convene at the joint call of the co-chairs.
- (e) The joint interim committee has all other powers and duties provided to a special or select committee by the rules of the senate and house of representatives, by Subchapter B, Chapter 301, Government Code, and by policies of the senate and house committees on administration.
- (f) Not later than January 1, 2017, the joint interim committee shall report the committee's findings and recommendations to the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, the governor, the Teacher Retirement System of Texas, and each house and senate standing committee with primary jurisdiction over primary and secondary education or health benefit plan coverage.
- (g) From the contingent expense fund of the senate and the contingent expense fund of the house of representatives equally, the members of the joint interim committee shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this Act in accordance with the senate and house of representatives rules of procedure and the policies of the committees on administration. Other necessary expenses of operation shall be paid from the contingent expense fund of the senate and the contingent expense fund of the house of representatives equally.

SECTION 2. ABOLITION OF COMMITTEE. The joint interim committee on TRS ActiveCare created by this Act is abolished and this Act expires September 1, 2017.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

Amend **CSHB 1492** (house committee printing) by striking all below the enacting clause and substituting the following:

SECTION 1. Chapter 90, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is amended by designating Sections 90.001 through 90.012 as Subchapter A and adding a subchapter heading to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 2. Section 90.010(d-1), Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is amended to read as follows:

(d-1) Beginning on September 1, 2014, the MDL pretrial court shall dismiss each action for an asbestos-related injury or a silica-related injury that was pending on August 31, 2005, unless a report was served on or after September 1, 2013, that complies with Section 90.003, Section 90.004, or Subsection (f). The MDL pretrial court shall provide for the dismissal of such actions in a case management order entered for that purpose. All such actions shall be dismissed on or before January [August] 31, 2016 [2015].

SECTION 3. Chapter 90, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is amended by adding Subchapter B to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER B. ASBESTOS OR SILICA TRUST CLAIMS

Sec. 90.051. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:

(1) "Asbestos or silica trust" means a claims facility, a claims agent, a qualified settlement fund, or any other entity that:

- (A) is created under 11 U.S.C. Section 524(g) or another applicable law for the benefit of creditors of a bankrupt person;
- (B) is formed for the purpose of compensating claimants for asbestos- or silica-related injuries; and
- (C) is in existence on the date trial in an action asserting an asbestos- or silica-related injury is set to commence.
- (2) "Trust claim" means any filing with or claim against an asbestos or silica trust seeking recovery of compensation or damages for or arising from the asbestos- or silica-related injury of an exposed person.
- (3) "Trust claim material" means documentation filed as part of or in connection with a trust claim, including:
- (A) documentation that a claimant submits or provides to an asbestos or silica trust for the purpose of demonstrating asbestos or silica exposure, the existence of an asbestos- or silica-related injury, or the validity of a trust claim; and
- (B) claim forms and other materials that an asbestos or silica trust requires a claimant to submit.

Sec. 90.052. REQUIREMENT TO MAKE TRUST CLAIMS. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (d), a claimant who has filed an action to recover damages for or arising from an asbestos- or silica-related injury shall make a trust claim against each asbestos or silica trust the claimant believes may owe compensation or damages to the claimant for the injury that is the basis of the claimant's action.

- (b) A claimant must make each trust claim required under this section not later than:
- (1) the 150th day before the date trial in the action is set to commence; or
- (2) a date provided by court order if trial is set to commence on or before January 31, 2016.
- (c) A claimant may file a motion seeking relief from the obligation to make a trust claim otherwise required by this section if the claimant believes that the fees and expenses, including attorney's fees, for filing the trust claim exceed the claimant's reasonably anticipated recovery from the trust.
- (d) If a claimant files a motion under Subsection (c), the court shall determine whether the claimant's fees and expenses, including attorney's fees, for making the trust claim exceed the claimant's reasonably anticipated recovery from the trust. If the court determines that the claimant's fees and expenses exceed the claimant's reasonably anticipated recovery, the claimant is not required to make the trust claim but shall provide the court with a verified statement of the exposed person's exposure history to asbestos or silica that is covered by the trust.

Sec. 90.053. NOTICE OF TRUST CLAIM; PRODUCTION OF TRUST CLAIM MATERIAL. (a) A claimant in an action to recover damages for or arising from an asbestos- or silica-related injury shall serve on each party notice of, and trust claim material relating to, each trust claim made by or on behalf of the exposed person. The notice must:

- (1) identify each trust claim made by or on behalf of the exposed person;
- (2) state the amount of any trust claim payment made to compensate for the exposed person's injury; and
- (3) state the date each trust claim was made and whether a request for individual or enhanced review or for a deferral, delay, suspension, or tolling of the claim has been submitted to the trust.
- (b) The claimant shall serve the notice and trust claim materials required by Subsection (a) not later than:
- (1) the 120th day before the date trial in the action is set to commence; or
- (2) a date provided by court order if the court entered an order under Section $9\overline{0.052(b)}$.
- (c) The notice and trust claim materials required to be served under Subsection (a) are in addition to any notice or materials required to be served or produced under other law, rule, order, or applicable agreement.
- (d) If a claimant makes a trust claim after the date provided by Section 90.052(b) but before the date that trial in the action commences, the claimant shall serve the notice of, and trust claim material relating to, the trust claim as required by Subsection (a) reasonably promptly after making the trust claim, but not later than the earlier of:
 - (1) the date that trial commences; or
 - (2) the 15th day after the date the additional trust claim is made.
- (e) If a claimant discovers that the notice or trust claim materials provided by the claimant under this section were incomplete or incorrect at the time the notice or trust claim materials were served or that the notice or trust claim materials as served are no longer complete and correct, the claimant shall supplement the notice and the production of trust claim materials. The claimant shall serve the supplemental notice or trust claim materials reasonably promptly after the claimant discovers the necessity for the supplementation, but not later than the 15th day after the date the claimant discovers the necessity for the supplementation.
- (f) A claimant shall serve notice of, and trust claim material relating to, a trust claim regardless of whether the claim is for an injury resulting in cancer or an injury not resulting in cancer.
- Sec. 90.054. FAILURE TO MAKE TRUST CLAIM OR PROVIDE NOTICE AND TRUST CLAIM MATERIAL. (a) An MDL pretrial court may not remand an action to a trial court and a trial court may not commence trial in the action unless the claimant has:
 - (1) made each trust claim as required by this subchapter; and
- (2) served the notice of, and trust claim material relating to, those trust claims in accordance with Section 90.053.
- (b) If a claimant received compensation from an asbestos or silica trust for an injury that also gave rise to a judgment against a defendant for the same injury and the claimant failed to serve the relevant notice and trust claim material as

required by Section 90.053, the trial court, on a defendant's or judgment debtor's motion and after reasonable notice to the parties, may impose an appropriate sanction, including setting aside the judgment and ordering a new trial.

(c) This section may not be construed to require payment of a trust claim by an asbestos or silica trust before the MDL pretrial court remands the action for trial or before a judgment is rendered in the action.

Sec. 90.055. MOTION TO STAY. (a) A defendant may file a motion requesting a stay of the proceedings under Section 90.057 on or before the later of:

- (1) the 60th day before the date trial in the action is set to commence;
- (2) the 15th day after the date the defendant first obtains asbestos- or silica-exposure information that could support an additional asbestos or silica trust claim by the claimant; or
- (3) a date provided by court order if the court entered an order under Section 90.052(b).
 - (b) The motion described by Subsection (a) must include:
- (1) a list of asbestos or silica trusts not disclosed by the claimant against which the defendant in good faith believes the claimant may make a successful trust claim; and
- (2) information supporting the additional trust claim described by Subdivision (1), including information that may be used to meet the trust claim requirements of an asbestos or silica trust described by Subdivision (1).

Sec. 90.056. RESPONSE TO MOTION TO STAY. (a) Not later than the 14th day after the date the defendant files a motion to stay under Section 90.055 or the date provided by court order under Section 90.052(b), the claimant may file a response:

- (1) stating and providing proof that the claimant has made a trust claim identified in the defendant's motion and served the notice of, and trust claim material relating to, the claim as prescribed by Section 90.053; or
- (2) requesting a determination by the court that the fees and expenses, including attorney's fees, for filing a trust claim identified in the motion exceed the claimant's reasonably anticipated recovery from the trust.
- (b) If the claimant files a response making a request under Subsection (a)(2), the court shall determine whether the claimant's fees and expenses, including attorney's fees, for making the relevant trust claim exceed the claimant's reasonably anticipated recovery from the trust. If the court determines that the claimant's fees and expenses exceed the claimant's reasonably anticipated recovery, the claimant is not required to make the trust claim but shall provide the court with a verified statement of the exposed person's exposure history to asbestos or silica that is covered by the trust.

Sec. 90.057. STAY OF PROCEEDINGS. (a) The court shall grant a motion to stay under Section 90.055 if the court determines the motion was timely filed and the claimant is likely to receive compensation from a trust identified by the motion. The stay shall continue until the claimant provides proof that the claimant has made the claim and served notice of, and trust claim material relating to, the claim as prescribed by Section 90.053.

- (b) The court may not stay the proceedings if, with respect to each trust claim identified in the motion:
- (1) the court determines that the claimant has satisfied the requirements of Section 90.053(a); or
- (2) the court makes a determination described by Section 90.052(d) or 90.056(b).
- Sec. 90.058. EVIDENCE OF TRUST CLAIMS. (a) Trust claim material is presumed to be authentic, relevant, and discoverable in an action to which this subchapter applies.
- (b) Notwithstanding an agreement, including a confidentiality agreement, trust claim material is presumed to not be privileged in an action to which this subchapter applies.
- (c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), a party may use the trust claim material as proof of:
 - (1) exposure to an asbestos or silica product;
- (2) an alternate source for the cause of the exposed person's injury, death, or loss;
- (3) a basis to allocate responsibility for the exposed person's injury, death, or loss; or
- (4) any other issue relevant to adjudication of a claim asserted in the action.
- (d) This section may not be construed to affect the application of Section 33.003 to an action governed by this chapter.
- Sec. 90.059. MODIFICATION OF JUDGMENT BASED ON SUBSEQUENT TRUST CLAIM PAYMENT. (a) On a non-settling defendant's or judgment debtor's motion and after reasonable notice to the parties, the court that rendered the judgment has jurisdiction to and shall:
- (1) modify the judgment to reduce the amount of damages to be recovered by the claimant by the dollar amount of a trust claim payment made to the claimant after judgment was rendered if the claimant:
- (A) made a trust claim and failed to serve notice of, and trust claim material relating to, that trust claim in accordance with Section 90.053; or
- (B) made a trust claim after failing to disclose in response to an inquiry made in the action that the exposed person was exposed to the product or site for which the trust claim payment was made; and
- (2) order other relief that the court considers just and proper in connection with the payment.
- (b) If, before judgment is rendered, the claimant makes a trust claim and serves the notice of, and trust claim material relating to, the trust claim as required by Section 90.053(a), the court may not modify a judgment under this section for that trust claim, but the court may enter an appropriate order under Subsection (a)(2).

- (c) A defendant or judgment debtor must file a motion under this section not later than the 30th day after the date the defendant or judgment debtor discovers that the claimant received a payment from an asbestos or silica trust described by Subsection (a), but not later than the third anniversary of the date the judgment is signed.
- (d) If a judgment is required to be modified under this section, the court shall modify the judgment in a manner consistent with this section and make other orders the court considers just and proper on or before the 30th day after the date the motion is filed.
- (e) A court has jurisdiction and authority to enforce a judgment modified under this section to the same extent that the court has jurisdiction and authority to enforce other judgments.

SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 90, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, as added by this Act, applies to an action:

- (1) commenced on or after the effective date of this Act; or
- (2) pending on the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

The MDL pretrial court shall provide for the dismissal of such actions in a case management order entered for that purpose. All [such] actions for a silica-related injury shall be dismissed on or before August 31, 2015. All actions for an asbestos-related injury shall be dismissed on or before December 31, 2015.

- (b) Sections 2 and 3 of this Act take effect only if, pursuant to the request submitted under Section 4 of this Act, the United States Department of Transportation adopts a federal rule that includes the entire State of Texas in the eastern time zone. Sections 2 and 3 of this Act take effect on the date on which the federal rule that includes the state in the eastern time zone takes effect. If the United States Department of Transportation does not adopt a rule described by this subsection, Sections 2 and 3 of this Act have no effect.
 - (c) Section 4 of this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

- (b) The commission, with input from local mental health authorities, local behavioral health authorities, stakeholders, and the forensic director appointed under Section 532.013, and after considering any plan developed under Section 533.051, shall divide the state into regions for the purpose of allocating to each region state-funded beds in the state hospitals and other inpatient mental health facilities for patients who are:
- (1) voluntarily admitted to a state hospital or other inpatient mental health facility under Subchapter B, Chapter 462, or Chapter 572;
- (2) admitted to a state hospital or other inpatient mental health facility for emergency detention under Subchapter C, Chapter 462, or Chapter 573;
- (3) ordered by a court to receive at a state hospital or other inpatient mental health facility inpatient chemical dependency treatment under Subchapter D, Chapter 462, or inpatient mental health services under Chapter 574;
- (4) committed to a state hospital or other inpatient mental health facility to attain competency to stand trial under Chapter 46B, Code of Criminal Procedure; or
- (5) committed to a state hospital or other inpatient mental health facility to receive inpatient mental health services following an acquittal by reason of insanity under Chapter 46C, Code of Criminal Procedure.
- (c) The department, in conjunction with the commission, shall convene the advisory panel described by Section 533.051(c) at least quarterly in order for the advisory panel to:
- (1) develop, make recommendations to the executive commissioner or department, as appropriate, and monitor the implementation of updates to:
- (A) a bed day allocation methodology for allocating to each region designated under Subsection (b) a certain number of state-funded beds in state hospitals and other inpatient mental health facilities for the patients described by Subsection (b) based on the identification and evaluation of factors that impact the use of state-funded beds by patients in a region, including clinical acuity, the prevalence of serious mental illness, and the availability of resources in the region; and
- (B) a bed day utilization review protocol that includes a peer review process to:
 - (i) evaluate:
- (a) the use of state-funded beds in state hospitals and other inpatient mental health facilities by patients described by Subsection (b);
 - (b) alternatives to hospitalization for those patients;
 - (c) the readmission rate for those patients; and
 - (d) the average length of admission for those patients; and
- (ii) conduct a review of the diagnostic and acuity profiles of patients described by Subsection (b) for the purpose of assisting the department, commission, and advisory panel in making informed decisions and using available resources efficiently and effectively; and

- (2) receive and review status updates from the department regarding the implementation of the bed day allocation methodology and the bed day utilization review protocol.
- (d) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year, the advisory panel shall submit to the executive commissioner for consideration a proposal for an updated bed day allocation methodology and bed day utilization review protocol, and the executive commissioner shall adopt an updated bed day allocation methodology and bed day utilization review protocol.
- (e) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year, the department, in conjunction with the commission and the advisory panel, shall prepare and submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, the senate finance committee, the house appropriations committee, and the standing committees of the legislature having jurisdiction over mental health and human services a report that includes:
- (1) a summary of the activities of the commission, department, and advisory panel to develop or update the bed day allocation methodology and bed day utilization review protocol;
- (2) the outcomes of the implementation of the bed day allocation methodology by region, including an explanation of how the actual outcomes aligned with or differed from the expected outcomes;
- (3) for planning purposes, for each region, the actual value of a bed day for the two years preceding the date of the report and the projected value of a bed day for the five years following the date of the report, as calculated by the department;
- $\overline{(4)}$ for each region, an evaluation of the factors in Subsection (c)(1)(A), including the availability of resources in the region, that impact the use of state-funded beds in state hospitals and other inpatient mental health facilities by the patients described by Subsection (b);
- (5) the outcomes of the implementation of the bed day utilization review protocol and the impact of the use of the protocol on the use of state-funded beds in state hospitals and other inpatient mental health facilities by the patients described by Subsection (b); and
- (6) any recommendations of the department, commission, or advisory panel to enhance the effective and efficient allocation of state-funded beds in state hospitals and other inpatient mental health facilities for the patients described by Subsection (b).
- (f) Notwithstanding Subsection (d), not later than March 1, 2016, the advisory panel, with assistance from the department, shall submit to the executive commissioner an initial proposal for a bed day allocation methodology and bed day utilization review protocol for review. The executive commissioner shall adopt an initial bed day allocation methodology and bed day utilization review protocol not later than June 1, 2016. Before the commission adopts the initial bed day allocation methodology, the department shall continue to allocate state-funded beds in the state hospitals and other inpatient mental health facilities

according to the department's policy as it existed immediately before September 1, 2015, and the policy is continued in effect for that purpose. This subsection expires September 1, 2017.

SECTION _____. Subchapter D, Chapter 1001, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Sections 1001.086, 1001.087, and 1001.088 to read as follows:

Sec. 1001.086. TREATMENT ALTERNATIVES TRAINING CURRICULUM FOR JUDGES AND ATTORNEYS. (a) The department, with input from the court of criminal appeals and the forensic director appointed under Section 532.013, shall develop and maintain a training curriculum for judges and attorneys that provides information on inpatient and outpatient treatment alternatives to inpatient commitment to a state hospital for a patient whom a court is ordering to receive mental health services:

- (1) to attain competency to stand trial under Chapter 46B, Code of Criminal Procedure; or
- (2) following an acquittal by reason of insanity under Chapter 46C, Code of Criminal Procedure.
- (b) The training curriculum developed and maintained under Subsection (a) must include a guide to treatment alternatives, other than inpatient treatment at a state hospital, from which a patient described by Subsection (a) may receive mental health services.

Sec. 1001.087. CONTRACTING FOR AND ADMINISTRATION OF CERTAIN FUNCTIONS RELATING TO SUBSTANCE ABUSE. (a) The department may contract only with local mental health authorities and local behavioral health authorities to administer outreach, screening, assessment, and referral functions relating to the provision of substance abuse services. A local mental health authority or local behavioral health authority may subcontract with a substance abuse or behavioral health service provider to provide those services.

(b) A local mental health authority or local behavioral health authority who contracts with the department to administer outreach, screening, assessment, and referral functions relating to the provision of substance abuse services shall develop an integrated service delivery model that, to the extent feasible, uses providers who have historically administered outreach, screening, assessment, and referral functions.

Sec. 1001.088. MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE HOTLINES. The department shall ensure that each local mental health authority and local behavioral health authority operates a toll-free telephone hotline that enables a person to call a single hotline number to obtain information from the authority about mental health services, substance abuse services, or both.

SECTION _____. Not later than March 1, 2016, the Department of State Health Services shall develop the training curriculum required by Section 1001.086, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION _____. Section 1001.087, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, applies only to a contract that is entered into or renewed on or after September 1, 2015. A contract that is entered into or renewed before that date is governed by the law as it existed immediately before September 1, 2015, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

Sec. 62.106. SUSPENSION AND AUTOMATIC REINSTATEMENT OF ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN IN JUVENILE FACILITIES. (a) In this section, "juvenile facility" means a facility for the placement, detention, or commitment of a child under Title 3, Family Code.

(b) To the extent allowed under federal law, if a child is confined in a juvenile facility, the commission shall suspend the child's eligibility for health benefits coverage under the child health plan during the period the child is confined in the facility.

- (c) Not later than 48 hours after the commission is notified of the release from a juvenile facility of a child whose eligibility for health benefits coverage under the child health plan has been suspended under this section, the commission shall reinstate the child's eligibility, provided the child's eligibility certification period has not elapsed. Following the reinstatement, the child remains eligible until the expiration of the period for which the child was certified as eligible.
- Sec. 62.107. NOTICE OF CERTAIN CONFINEMENTS IN JUVENILE FACILITIES. (a) In this section, "juvenile facility" has the meaning assigned by Section 62.106.
- (b) A juvenile facility may notify the commission on the confinement in the facility of a child who is enrolled in the child health plan.
- (c) If a juvenile facility chooses to provide the notice described by Subsection (b), the facility shall provide the notice electronically or by other appropriate means as soon as possible, but not later than the 30th day, after the date of the child's confinement.
- (d) A juvenile facility may notify the commission of the release of a child who, immediately before the child's confinement in the facility, was enrolled in the child health plan.
- (e) If a juvenile facility chooses to provide the notice described by Subsection (d), the facility shall provide the notice electronically or by other appropriate means not later than 48 hours after the child's release from the facility.
- (f) If a juvenile facility chooses to provide the notice described by Subsection (d), at the time of the child's release, the facility shall provide the child with a written copy of the notice and a telephone number at which the child's parent or legal guardian may contact the commission regarding confirmation of or assistance relating to reinstatement of the child's eligibility for health benefits coverage under the child health plan, if applicable.
- (g) The commission shall establish a means by which a juvenile facility, or an employee of the facility, may determine whether a child confined in the facility is or was, as appropriate, enrolled in the child health plan for purposes of this section.
- (h) A juvenile facility, or an employee of the facility, is not liable in a civil action for damages resulting from a failure to comply with this section.
- SECTION _____. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, is amended by adding Sections 32.0264 and 32.0265 to read as follows:
- Sec. 32.0264. SUSPENSION AND AUTOMATIC REINSTATEMENT OF ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN IN JUVENILE FACILITIES. (a) In this section, "juvenile facility" means a facility for the placement, detention, or commitment of a child under Title 3, Family Code.
- (b) If a child is confined in a juvenile facility, the commission shall suspend the child's eligibility for medical assistance during the period the child is confined in the facility.

- (c) Not later than 48 hours after the commission is notified of the release from a juvenile facility of a child whose eligibility for medical assistance has been suspended under this section, the commission shall reinstate the child's eligibility, provided the child's eligibility certification period has not elapsed. Following the reinstatement, the child remains eligible until the expiration of the period for which the child was certified as eligible.
- Sec. 32.0265. NOTICE OF CERTAIN CONFINEMENTS IN JUVENILE FACILITIES. (a) In this section, "juvenile facility" has the meaning assigned by Section 32.0264.
- (b) A juvenile facility may notify the commission on the confinement in the facility of a child who is receiving medical assistance benefits.
- (c) If a juvenile facility chooses to provide the notice described by Subsection (b), the facility shall provide the notice electronically or by other appropriate means as soon as possible, but not later than the 30th day, after the date of the child's confinement.
- (d) A juvenile facility may notify the commission of the release of a child who, immediately before the child's confinement in the facility, was receiving medical assistance benefits.
- (e) If a juvenile facility chooses to provide the notice described by Subsection (d), the facility shall provide the notice electronically or by other appropriate means not later than 48 hours after the child's release from the facility.
- (f) If a juvenile facility chooses to provide the notice described by Subsection (d), at the time of the child's release, the facility shall provide the child with a written copy of the notice and a telephone number at which the child's parent or legal guardian may contact the commission regarding confirmation of or assistance relating to reinstatement of the child's eligibility for medical assistance benefits, if applicable.
- (g) The commission shall establish a means by which a juvenile facility, or an employee of the facility, may determine whether a child confined in the facility is or was, as appropriate, receiving medical assistance benefits for purposes of this section.
- (h) A juvenile facility, or an employee of the facility, is not liable in a civil action for damages resulting from a failure to comply with this section.
- SECTION _____. Sections 62.106(b) and 62.107(b), Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, and Sections 32.0264(b) and 32.0265(b), Human Resources Code, as added by this Act, apply to a child whose period of confinement in a juvenile facility begins on or after the effective date of this Act, regardless of the date the child was determined eligible for child health plan coverage under Chapter 62, Health and Safety Code, or medical assistance under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code.
- SECTION _____. Sections 62.106(c) and 62.107(d), Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, and Sections 32.0264(c) and 32.0265(d), Human Resources Code, as added by this Act, apply to the release of a child from a juvenile facility that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act, regardless of the date the child was initially confined in the facility.

HB 1514 ON SECOND READING (by Sheffield)

HB 1514 - POINT OF ORDER

Representative González raised a point of order against further consideration of **HB 1514** under Rule 4, Section 18 of the House Rules on the grounds that the committee minutes are incomplete.

The speaker overruled the point of order and submitted the following statement:

Representative González raised a point of order against further consideration of **HB 1514** under Rule 4, Section 18 of the House Rules on the grounds that the Insurance committee's minutes fail to state the date the committee adjourned. The point of order is respectfully overruled.

Rule 4, Section 18 requires each committee to "keep complete minutes of the proceedings in committee, which shall include. . .the time and place of each meeting of the committee." Rule 4, Section 18(a)(1) of the House Rules. Representative González correctly observes that the minutes for the Committee on Insurance show that the committee met at 5:34 p.m. on April 8, 2015, and adjourned at 2:56 a.m. Representative González notes "[o]bviously the committee did not adjourn at 2:56 a.m. on the same day it was called to order." However, because the minutes failed to specifically state that the committee adjourned at 2:56 a.m., April 9, 2015, Representative González argues that the minutes are "at best ambiguous and at worst incorrect."

The minutes are neither a violation of Rule 4, Section 18 nor inaccurate. The minutes accurately recorded a meeting that began one calendar day and continued for nine hours into the next calendar day. The minutes of a meeting are not a "blow-by-blow" description of the events that transpired at the meeting. The minutes must only contain the items required by the House Rules and any "other information that the chair shall determine." See Rule 4, Section 18(a)(5) of the House Rules. In this case, the minutes accurately reflected the correct day of the meeting, the correct time of adjournment, and all the other required information in the minutes.

In her point of order, Representative González raises the issue that other committees handle their notations of time in different manners. In the absence of a uniform format, it is not surprising that the chairmen of the committees in the house, responsible for the effective conduct of the business of their committee, choose to conduct their meetings, direct their staff, and prepare their official committee documents (including their committee minutes) in different manners. These are the duties and prerogatives of the chair of each committee and are not disturbed absent the violation of another house rule. See Rule 4, Section 6 of the House Rules. The question of whether the house should adopt more uniform standards for committee minute reporting or whether the method suggested by Representative González is in fact a "best practice" that all committees should embrace is an issue for the house to study or, alternatively, one which the committee coordinator may wish to review with the committee clerks. The point of order is respectfully overruled.
