INTRODUCTION OF GUESTS

The chair recognized Speaker Bonnen who introduced Sherry-Dawn and Jason Sheffield, speaking as follows:

Members, please give your attention to two incredibly generous and resilient constituents of mine, Jason and Sherry-Dawn Sheffield. Tragically, the Sheffields lost their three-year-old son, Rory, to a drowning incident in August of 2016 while they vacationed as a family on the Frio River. A volunteer firefighter nearby heard the family's call for 9-1-1 and joined in helping them to bring life back to Rory. He was life-flighted to a San Antonio hospital, but unfortunately, Rory did not survive. Rory was a vibrant and energetic young boy who was loved dearly by his parents and his siblings, Cody, Lorelei, and Jae. His nickname from his father was "Little Warrior."

Determined to help ensure that other families are spared the heartbreak they suffered, the Sheffields founded Rory, the Warrior, Inc. with the goal of equipping first responders with the tools they need to save lives. The organization purchases and provides funding for "hero bags," which are first aid kits for public safety personnel that contain emergency oxygen. They also deliver care packages called "blessing bags" to families with children who are receiving treatment in an intensive care unit.

Members, these two selfless individuals have created something good out of the most horrific tragedy, a tragedy that brings the strongest of all to our knees, the loss of a child. Sherry-Dawn and Jason work with the Texas Drowning Prevention Alliance and are here today as part of the Drowning Awareness Week that our colleague Representative Wray is going to honor and recognize with a

resolution here today. But I wanted to honor Jason and Sherry-Dawn for doing something that I can tell you we all have to question ourselves if we could do. Losing a child is unthinkable. No parent should bury their child. Rick Miller understands that. But to take that tragedy, that loss, and turn it into good for others—they're here today to do good for others from their loss. So help me in honoring and thanking them for turning tragedy into positive.
