The chair recognized Representative G. Bonnen who addressed the house, speaking as follows:

It's with a very heavy heart that we gather here this morning to lay out a memorial resolution that marks tomorrow's one-year anniversary of the tragic shooting that took place at Santa Fe High School. We gather here today in memory of two remarkable teachers and eight innocent students who were robbed too soon of their lives, their childhoods, and the lifetime of opportunities they had in front of them. Thirteen others were also injured. In the years since, the days have been long and difficult as they have worked to mend both physical and emotional wounds. I was there on the scene at Santa Fe that day. The events in the weeks that followed will forever remain etched in my mind. And it's impossible to grasp the grief and the heartbreak that we as a community have felt

as parents, teachers, and students were forced to confront their worst fears and set forth on a journey of healing that no one should have to go through. In the aftermath of this devastating tragedy, our community and, in fact, the entire state, responded with extraordinary strength and compassion for those who were affected in an outpouring of love and prayers for those that we lost and those who were left behind. We as Texans wept with them; we grieved with them; and today, we remember them. My prayer, our prayer, is that the victims' families and friends be filled with the best memories of their loved ones and of the time they had together and that the terrible pain of this tragic loss may be eased.

But even in the face of this grievous evil, we also found hope as we learned of great acts of courage and compassion. Students in the classroom where the shooting began sought shelter in a storeroom, and one young man placed himself in front of the door in an effort to prevent the shooter from entering. He gave his life that day in a heroic effort to protect his classmates and his teacher. Two campus officers courageously confronted the shooter within three minutes, confining him to his location in the school, and from that moment forward no other students or teachers were injured. One of the officers suffered near-fatal wounds, and thankfully, he has survived. There were countless other acts of compassion and love in the hours and the days and in the weeks that followed. In Matthew 19:14, Jesus says to his disciples, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." For the loved ones we lost, we know he has called them home.

I'm going to read to you the names of the eight students and the two teachers who we lost on that day: Jared Black, Shana Fisher, Christian Garcia, Aaron McLeod, Angelique Ramirez, Sabika Sheikh, Christopher Stone, Kimberly Vaughan, Cynthia Tisdale, and Glenda Ann Perkins. There are no words that I could say that would heal the wounded hearts that remain. And this is an important reminder to hug your kids a little bit tighter, to draw strength from one another, to pray for one another, and for us to commit ourselves to doing all that we can to see that our schools and our communities are safer so that future generations of students and teachers and their families are spared from traveling down this most painful path. As we solemnly reflect on the first anniversary of this great tragedy, we remember those whose lives were lost, and our hearts go out to those who were forever altered. Thank you to all who have united with our community to promote healing in the aftermath of this heartbreaking tragedy. It is truly an honor to represent the people of Santa Fe, Texas, who in the face of great adversity have shown the entire world courage, compassion, resilience, and love.

(1) On page 1, strike lines 8 through 16 and substitute the following:

(a-1) If a property owner requests binding arbitration under this chapter to appeal appraisal review board orders involving two or more contiguous tracts of land that are owned by the property owner [~~contiguous to one another~~], a single arbitration deposit in the amount provided by Subsection (a)(2) is sufficient to satisfy the requirement of Subsection (a)(2). For purposes of this subsection, "contiguous tracts of land" means improved or unimproved tracts of land that are touching or that share a common boundary, as determined using appraisal district records or legal descriptions of the tracts.

(2) On page 1, strike line 24 and substitute the following:

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

Amendment No. 1 was adopted.

SB 1887 (Murr - House Sponsor), A bill to be entitled An Act relating to jurisdiction over certain child protection and juvenile matters involving juvenile offenders.

Amendment No. 1

On behalf of Representative Springer, Representative Murr offered the following amendment to **SB 1887**:

Amend **SB 1887** (house committee printing) as follows:

(1) On page 1, strike lines 15-18 and substitute the following:

(h) A judge exercising jurisdiction over a child in a suit instituted under Subtitle E, Title 5, may refer any aspect of a suit involving the child that is instituted under this title to the appropriate associate judge appointed under Subchapter C, Chapter 201, serving in the county and exercising jurisdiction over the child under Subtitle E, Title 5, if the associate judge consents to the referral.

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(2) On page 1, lines 20 and 21, strike "juvenile court".

(3) On page 1, line 24, through page 2, line 1, strike "FOR ADJUDICATION OR DISPOSITION." and substitute "TO COMBINE PROCEEDINGS. (a)".

(4) On page 2, at the end of line 2, insert "district or statutory county".

(5) On page 2, line 3, strike "a county" and substitute "another county".

(6) Strike page 2, lines 4-7, and substitute the following:

child in a suit instituted under Subtitle E, Title 5. A case may only be transferred under this section with the consent of the judge of the court to which the case is being transferred.

(b) Notwithstanding Section 51.04, a district or statutory county court to which a case is transferred under this section has jurisdiction over the transferred case regardless of whether the court is a designated juvenile court or alternative juvenile court in the county.

(c) If the court exercising jurisdiction over the child under Subtitle E, Title 5, consents to a transfer under this section, the juvenile court shall file the transfer order with the clerk of the transferring court. On receipt and without a hearing or further order from the juvenile court, the clerk of the transferring court shall transfer the files, including transcripts of records and documents for the case as soon as practicable but not later than the 10th day after the date an order of transfer is filed.

(d) On receipt of the pleadings, documents, and orders from the transferring court, the clerk of the receiving court shall notify the judge of the receiving court, all parties, and the clerk of the transferring court.

Amendment No. 1 was adopted.

SB 2505 (C. Bell - House Sponsor), A bill to be entitled An Act relating to the powers, duties, and governance of the Westwood Magnolia Parkway Improvement District; providing authority to impose taxes and issue bonds. **SB 2505** was withdrawn by the author and, pursuant to Rule 6, Section 24, of the House Rules, was returned to the Committee on Local and Consent Calendars.

SB 2530 was withdrawn by the author and, pursuant to Rule 6, Section 24, of the House Rules, was returned to the Committee on Local and Consent Calendars.
