HB 1760 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE MORALES SHAW: I just wanted to make sure that I read the bill and understood it. These are easy, they're not trick questions or anything. Last session, we passed a bill that did not permit, it was actually an exception to another bill, firearms on school property or where there were interscholastic events taking place where the students were. Is that correct?

REPRESENTATIVE HEFNER: We passed this same bill out of the house last session. Is that what you're talking about?

MORALES SHAW: We passed a bill and we had an amendment, it was the Thierry Amendment, that limited constitutional carry on school property or where there were interscholastic activities where there were students attending. That's my understanding that we passed that last session.

HEFNER: I'm not familiar with the exact bill you're talking about, if you had the bill number—but we have not addressed gun-free zones regarding schools at all, nor in this bill do we either.

MORALES SHAW: Okay. It's my understanding that what this bill does, and I just want to make sure I understood it correctly, is it makes an exception to that exception which means that you still can't carry firearms on school campuses, but

if there's an interscholastic activity—like a sporting event or any kind of school event—and it's not on school-owned property, it's on private property, then we still have constitutional carry.

HEFNER: No. We had some clarifying questions yesterday, this does not prohibit private property owners from prohibiting firearms on their property. This is just to clarify what a school-sponsored event is and what the premises is, and so no it does not mess with the private property owner's rights whatsoever.

MORALES SHAW: I think I understood yesterday's back mic questions which means if I'm a private property owner, I have one of those statutory signs that says "You can't carry a gun here," I can still do that?

HEFNER: Correct.

MORALES SHAW: Okay, I understood yesterday's questions. My clarification today is that if there's an interscholastic or other student activity, as long as it's not on a school-owned property or on school campus for that matter, then there's not a restriction to carry a firearm?

HEFNER: No, if it is a school-sponsored event, then they are still prohibited. So if the school can have a school-sponsored event at property that's not school property, then guns are still prohibited there because it's school-sponsored activity.

MORALES SHAW: Okay. So where does this exception allow firearms to be carried when it has to do with students?

HEFNER: So it would be like if you're in the Texas Capitol, for instance, and you're carrying your firearm in the Capitol and a local school comes down for a field trip. It's just to clarify that that doesn't become a school-sponsored event and make all those people carrying in the Capitol felons. It's just a clarification.

MORALES SHAW: Okay, I appreciate that, Representative Hefner.

(B) the district's Internet website, if the district has a website; and

(2) a reasonable opportunity to apply for the position.

(e) If, during the school year, the district must fill a vacant position held by a teacher, as defined by Section 21.201, in less than five [~~10~~] school days, the district:

(1) must provide notice of the position in the manner described by Subsection (d)(1) as soon as possible after the vacancy occurs;

(2) is not required to provide the notice for five [~~10~~] school days before filling the position; and

(3) is not required to comply with Subsection (d)(2).

SECTION _____. Section 39.1511, Utilities Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:

(a) Meetings of the governing body of an independent organization certified under Section 39.151 and meetings of a subcommittee that includes a member of the governing body must be open to the public. The bylaws of the independent organization and the rules of the commission may provide for the governing body or subcommittee to enter into executive session closed to the public only to address a matter that the independent organization would be authorized to consider in a closed meeting if the independent organization were governed under Chapter 551, Government Code ~~[sensitive matters such as confidential personnel information, contracts, lawsuits, competitively sensitive information, or other information related to the security of the regional electrical network].~~

(a-1) An independent organization's governing body or a subcommittee may adopt a policy allowing the governing body or subcommittee to enter into an executive session closed to the public and commissioners, including the commissioners serving as ex officio nonvoting members, only to address a contested case, as defined by Section 2001.003, Government Code, or a personnel matter that is unrelated to members of the governing body.

Amendment No. 1 was adopted.

Representative Bryant offered the following amendment to **CSHB 1500**:

Amend **CSHB 1500** (house committee report) by adding the following appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill and renumbering subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

SECTION _____. Section 39.1515, Utilities Code, is amended by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:

(a-1) In this section, "market monitor" means the entity selected under Subsection (a).

SECTION _____. Subchapter D, Chapter 39, Utilities Code, is amended by adding Section 39.1517 to read as follows:

Sec. 39.1517. NATURAL GAS MARKET MONITOR. (a) An independent organization certified under Section 39.151 shall contract with an entity selected by the commission to act as an independent market monitor for the natural gas market to:

(1) detect and prevent market manipulation strategies in the natural gas market to prevent the unreasonable restriction, impairment, or reduction in the level of competition; and

(2) recommend measures to enhance the efficiency of the natural gas market.

(b) In this section:

(1) "Market monitor" means the entity selected under Subsection (a).

(2) "Natural gas market" means transactions made by a gas supply chain facility described by Section 86.044(b), Natural Resources Code, or a gas pipeline facility described by Section 121.2015(a)(3) to supply natural gas for the electricity supply chain, as mapped under Section 38.203.

(c) The independent organization shall provide to the personnel of the market monitor:

(1) support and cooperation the commission determines is necessary for the market monitor to perform the market monitor's functions; and

(2) full access to the parts of the independent organization's main operations center and records that concern operations, settlements, and reliability.

(d) The independent organization shall use money from the fee authorized by Section 39.151(e) to pay for the market monitor's activities.

(e) The commission is responsible for ensuring that the market monitor has the resources, expertise, and authority necessary to monitor the natural gas market in this state effectively and shall adopt rules and perform oversight of the market monitor as necessary. The market monitor shall operate under the supervision and oversight of the commission.

(f) This section may not be construed to confer enforcement authority on the market monitor or to authorize the commission to delegate enforcement authority to the market monitor. The commission by rule shall define:

(1) the market monitor's monitoring responsibilities, including reporting obligations and limitations;

(2) the standards for funding the market monitor, including staffing requirements;

(3) qualifications for personnel of the market monitor; and

(4) ethical standards for the market monitor and the personnel of the market monitor.

(g) In adopting rules governing the standards for funding the market monitor, the commission shall consult with a subcommittee of the independent organization's governing body to receive information on how money is or should be spent for monitoring functions. Rules governing ethical standards must include provisions designed to ensure that the personnel of the market monitor are professionally and financially independent from participants in the natural gas market. The commission shall develop and implement policies that clearly separate the policy-making responsibilities of the commission and the monitoring, analysis, and reporting responsibilities of the market monitor.

(h) The market monitor immediately shall report directly to the commission any potential market manipulations and any discovered or potential violations of commission rules, protocols of the independent organization, or rules of the Railroad Commission of Texas.

(i) The market monitor shall consult with the Railroad Commission of Texas to obtain necessary information for the market monitor to perform the market monitor's functions. The commission may enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Railroad Commission of Texas to:

(1) ensure the market monitor has access to the information needed for the market monitor to perform the market monitor's functions; and

(2) provide oversight over the sharing of information between the Railroad Commission of Texas and the market monitor.

(j) The personnel of the market monitor may communicate with commission staff on any matter without restriction.

(k) The market monitor annually shall submit to the independent organization, the commission, and the Railroad Commission of Texas a report that identifies market flaws and recommends methods to correct the flaws. The independent organization and the commission shall review the report and evaluate whether changes to commission rules or protocols of the independent organization should be made.

CSHB 2127 - POINT OF ORDER

Representative Bryant raised a point of order against further consideration of **CSHB 2127** under Rule 8, Section 3, of the House Rules and under Article III, Section 30, of the Texas Constitution.

(C.J. Harris in the chair)

The speaker overruled the point of order, announcing his decision to the house as follows:

Mr. Bryant raises a point of order against further consideration of **CSHB 2127** under Rule 8, Section 3, of the House Rules of Procedure and Article III, Section 30, Texas Constitution, on the grounds that the bill contains more than one subject.

Mr. Bryant argues that field preemption is a judicial doctrine and not a substantive matter that can serve as a subject of legislation. The standard for finding a violation of the one-subject rule is a heightened one. 78 H. Jour. 5586 (2003). Here, the standard was not met.

Accordingly, the point of order is respectfully overruled.

Sec. 53.001. DEFINITIONS. In this section:

(1) "Advisory board" means the heat illness prevention advisory board established under Section 53.003.

(2) "Commission" means the Texas Workforce Commission.

(3) "Employer" means a person who employs one or more employees.

(4) "Heat illness" means a serious medical condition resulting from the body's inability to cope with a particular heat load and includes heat cramps, heat exhaustion, heat syncope, and heat stroke.

(5) "Heat safety expert" means a person that:

(A) possesses a certification or educational degree in public health, medicine, occupational safety, environmental science, human physiology, or a related field; and

(B) performs work focused on heat safety in the workplace.

Sec. 53.002. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies to all employers in this state, regardless of the location of employment, type of employment, or size or type of employer.

Sec. 53.003. HEAT ILLNESS PREVENTION ADVISORY BOARD. (a) A heat illness prevention advisory board is established to assist the commission in adopting employer heat illness prevention standards under this chapter.

(b) The advisory board consists of the following members appointed by the commission:

- (1) two members who are heat safety experts;
- (2) two members who are employed as construction workers;
- (3) one member who is an employer;
- (4) one member who is a representative of a non-profit organization engaged in worker safety issues; and
- (5) one member who is a representative of a construction worker labor union.

(c) The advisory board shall develop and recommend to the commission heat illness prevention standards that are consistent with this chapter and designed to protect employees from heat illness in indoor and outdoor work.

Sec. 53.004. HEAT ILLNESS PREVENTION STANDARDS. (a) The commission shall adopt rules establishing heat illness prevention standards. In adopting the rules, the commission shall give full consideration to the recommendations made by the advisory board under Section 53.003(c).

(b) The heat illness prevention standards must:

(1) be consistent with the standards and recommendations relating to heat and workforce safety contained in the Criteria for a Recommended Standard: Occupational Exposure to Heat and Hot Environments published by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health; and

(2) include:

(A) requirements for providing drinking water, access to nearby shade or climate-controlled environments, access to nearby restrooms and handwashing stations, and rest periods;

(B) effective emergency response procedures;

(C) acclimatization to working in heat;

(D) required training for employees and supervisors; and

(E) other related standards for protection against heat illness.

Sec. 53.005. REQUIRED NOTICE. (a) The commission shall prescribe and make available on the commission's Internet website an employer notice in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, and any other language the commission determines to be appropriate that outlines:

(1) the heat illness prevention standards adopted by the commission under this chapter; and

(2) employees' rights under this chapter.

(b) An employer shall post in a conspicuous place, accessible to employees, at the employer's place of business the notice prescribed by the commission under Subsection (b).

Sec. 53.006. EMPLOYEE TRAINING REQUIRED. An employer shall provide training to each of the employer's employees about the commission's heat illness prevention standards as they relate to employees, supervisors, and employers. The training, including any related written materials, must be provided to each employee in a language that the employee understands.

Sec. 53.007. UNLAWFUL EMPLOYMENT PRACTICE. An employer commits an unlawful employment practice under this chapter if the employer retaliates or discriminates against an employee who:

- (1) experiences heat illness in the workplace;
- (2) reports to the employer an instance of heat illness or a violation of this chapter or other applicable standards;
- (3) files a complaint or with the Texas Workforce Commission related to a violation of this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter;
- (4) files suit related to a violation of this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter; or
- (5) testifies, assists, or participates in any manner in an investigation, proceeding, or hearing under this chapter.

Sec. 53.008. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY. The commission shall assess an administrative penalty in an amount that is at least \$1,000 against an employer for each violation of this chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter. For purposes of this section, each day a violation continues is considered a separate violation.

Sec. 53.009. CIVIL LIABILITY. (a) In addition to any administrative penalties assessed under this chapter, an employer is liable in a civil action for personal injury, death, or any other damages caused by the employer's failure to comply with the heat illness prevention standards adopted under this chapter. An employee is not required to exhaust any applicable administrative remedies before filing an action under this section.

(b) An employee that prevails in an action against an employer under this section is entitled to recover from the employer all court costs and reasonable attorney fees related to the action.

(c) If the court presiding over an action filed by an employee under this section finds that an employer knowingly violated the heat illness prevention standards adopted under this chapter, the court shall award exemplary damages in an amount equal to triple the amount of compensatory damages otherwise due to the employee.

SECTION _____. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, but not later than October 1, 2023, the Texas Workforce Commission shall appoint the advisory board members to the heat illness advisory board established under Section 53.003, Labor Code, as added by this Act.

(b) Not later than January 1, 2024, the heat illness advisory board shall submit to the Texas Workforce Commission the recommended heat illness prevention standards the board develops under Section 53.003(c), Labor Code, as added by this Act.

(c) Not later than March 1, 2024, the Texas Workforce Commission shall adopt rules to implement this Chapter 53, Labor Code, as added by this Act, including rules prescribing heat illness prevention standards as required by Section 53.004, Labor Code, as added by this Act.

(3) December 31, 2026, if the person received a discharge and dismissal under Article 42A.111, Code of Criminal Procedure, for the offense on or after January 1, 2000, but before January 1, 2010; or

(4) December 31, 2027, if the person received a discharge and dismissal under Article 42A.111, Code of Criminal Procedure, for the offense before January 1, 2000.

(d-2) For purposes of Subsection (d-1) and Section 411.0716(b), a person to whose records Subsection (c) applies is considered to have received a discharge and dismissal under Article 42A.111, Code of Criminal Procedure, on the date described by Subsection (c)(2).

(9) Add the following appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill and renumber subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

The person is not eligible for an extension of that appointment or for a subsequent appointment on a temporary basis as a county jailer under that subsection at the same or a different county jail until the first anniversary of the date the person separates from the temporary appointment during which the person reached two years of cumulative service.

(b-3) A person whose county jailer license has ~~expired~~ become inactive may be appointed as a county jailer on a temporary basis under Subsection (b).
