Sec. 72.039. DISTRICT COURT CASELOAD ANALYSIS. (a) In this section:

(1) "Clearance rate" has the meaning assigned by Section 72.083.

(2) "Judicial officer" means a district judge or an associate judge, master, magistrate, or referee who conducts proceedings for district courts.

(b) The office at least once every two years shall conduct a district court caseload analysis. The analysis must concentrate on the weighted caseload of the district courts in the 30 most populous counties in this state, considering the nature and complexity of cases heard by each court, and include the following information, disaggregated by county:

(1) the number of cases filed in each district court with jurisdiction in the county in each of the preceding five state fiscal years;

(2) the clearance rate for each district court with jurisdiction in the county in each of the preceding five state fiscal years;

(3) the number of estimated full-time equivalent judicial officers serving district courts in the county in the preceding state fiscal year;

(4) the number of full-time equivalent judicial officers needed to serve the district courts in the county based on the most recent weighted caseload analysis;

(5) the calendar year for creation of the most recently created district court in the county; and

(6) any other relevant information identified by the director.

(c) Not later than October 1 of each even-numbered year, the office shall report the results of the analysis conducted under Subsection (b) to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and each member of the legislature.

MAJOR STATE CALENDAR HOUSE BILLS SECOND READING

CSHB 1605 ON SECOND READING (by Buckley, Dutton, Bonnen, K. King, K. Bell, et al.)

CSHB 1605, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to instructional material and technology, the adoption of essential knowledge and skills for certain public school foundation curriculum subjects, and creating allotments for the procurement of certain instructional materials under the Foundation School Program; authorizing a fee.

CSHB 1605 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE LEO-WILSON: Is it true that when **SB 6** was passed in 2011, it lowered the amount of TEKS coverage for publishers—that is what every child must know at each grade level—to a dismal 50 percent coverage requirement in all written instruction materials? I believe that your bill will correct this.

REPRESENTATIVE BUCKLEY: Yes, that is correct. Back in 2011 when the State Board of Education oversight of vetting the materials began, what we found is that the standards that were approved by our elected bodies of the SBOE began to show up less frequently in our materials. So in other words—the important points, as far as in the curriculum, where Texas said what kids should know—simply found its way out of the instructional materials. And so this bill seeks to replace that oversight so that our materials that our kids have in the classroom are providing them with the lessons they need to be successful on state assessments—but more importantly, to improve student outcomes so that they learn more and have a brighter future.

LEO-WILSON: That is correct. And the current situation is that unelected, unaccountable publishers actually were in charge of self-certifying their TEKS coverage to the TEA in their very own materials. To your knowledge, has any publisher ever certified to TEA that their materials were woefully inadequate?

BUCKLEY: No, they haven't. And really I think as you look—our publishers often have the responsibility to produce materials for the entire country. And so often they will put materials that align to our TEKS, but it will be a small box on the side of a page of a textbook. It won't be focused in on the things that we've decided, that Texans have decided, that our State Board of Education and those groups that work with them, the parents, the teachers, the administrators, the community members—what we've found to be important for Texas schools is often not reflected in the materials.

LEO-WILSON: Yes. And I appreciated Mike Morath's, the TEA commissioner's, testimony before your board. They started investigating why test scores have plateaued or plummeted since 2011, and much of it had to do with instructional materials. Being a teacher's number one teaching tool, it contained less than 20 percent of the TEKS. Do you, like I, inherently believe that students who have been taught from instructional materials that don't contain much of the TEKS—to hold them accountable to pass a STAAR test, where the test is covering 100 percent of the TEKS?

BUCKLEY: Yes, it's difficult on our kids if the instructional materials don't meet all the standards that we know our kids need to be successful on the assessments, and I would offer, even beyond the assessment. And one of the things that's interesting, when it comes to legislation and about watching high quality instructional materials that cover the TEKS in action is I've had the opportunity to visit classrooms. I've been in classrooms that are using these materials. I've seen how young people are learning. But most importantly, I've seen how teachers have responded. Teachers with one or two years of experience have told me, because of high quality materials that cover the standards, "I want to make sure that I stay in the teaching profession." A teacher that had been moved from third grade to fifth grade pulled me aside to say she wasn't sure she could do it but the high quality materials allowed her to move from third grade to fifth grade and still be effective and still make sure her kids are learning.

LEO-WILSON: That's correct. I believe that your bill actually removes some of the current authority from the TEA commissioner over curriculum evaluation and puts it straight back in the elected SBOE's control over curriculum rules. I also believe—when I read it—that your bill restores to citizens of Texas the ability to voice their concerns over content, curriculum coverage, and instructional materials by their elected State Board of Education members having a measure of oversight.

BUCKLEY: Absolutely, this bill actually shifts authority and power from the commissioner's office to the SBOE. It repeals his independent authority and it requires that the review of materials be done by SBOE. Even on our open education resources, this bill requires that the SBOE approve those materials as well. So it absolutely puts the approval process back in the hands of the elected body.

LEO-WILSON: Does your bill allow for the approved instructional materials and authorize the state board to add a list of adopted materials as well as rejected materials?

BUCKLEY: Yes, correct.

LEO-WILSON: And over the open-source materials, is it important that a parent be able to see what is hitting their child's desk? Does your bill provide a parent portal so that a parent, before school starts, can look at the materials that will be on their child's desk?

BUCKLEY: That is correct. There is a parent portal that is provided by the publisher of the material. It does not put the burden on the teacher or the school district.

LEO-WILSON: Does your bill also allow an appeal process if a parent does find something that's objectionable, or unsuitable, to go before the local school board and then, even there, up to the TEA?

BUCKLEY: That is correct. It makes certain that there's a level of transparency in our schools involving instructional materials and curriculum so that parents can feel comfortable. And I think also, just as important—we talk about the transparency about what we're being taught—but it also provides a portal where parents can glean an insight into what the kids are learning to be helpful at home. As a father of three, I've found often, because of instructional materials that weren't always sent home with the child—this was, I guess, the moment where we went from a lot of textbooks that you carried around to more virtual textbooks. What we found is that it was often difficult for me to help my kids with their homework because I didn't really have access. This provides the oversight and transparency to make sure that the content is suitable and appropriate, but it also provides parents to really be a partner in their kids education to help them with their homework, to make sure that they are learning everything they need to learn.

LEO-WILSON: I think one of the important things—and the criticisms of this bill—is this is a digital Common Core. But while there's been much noise made over in the other chamber throughout the years, since **SB 6** in 2011, stating that they have abolished Common Core in Texas, the evidence actually confirms that Common Core is currently in our instructional materials. **SB 6** actually allowed Common Core straight to the front door of our children's instructional materials. I believe, and read in your bill, that this would allow the State Board of Education to adopt measures and criteria for adoption and rejection. And if Common Core is found in these materials, they have the ability to go back to the commissioner and rework it until it gets a majority vote.

BUCKLEY: That's absolutely correct. What this does, since 2011 and the lack of oversight, it clearly hands that oversight back to elected officials. They can then make sure that Texas standards, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills—the TEKS, are in the materials that our kids have in their possession. And one thing about OER—we keep thinking about virtual and digital—the content itself and the bill actually prescribes for the printing of these materials to be bound and for kids to have, if you will, a textbook in their hands. When I went to the classrooms and saw OER in action—what you saw were materials that kids had on their desk, materials that they would carry home in their backpacks, that were clearly aligned with the lesson of the day. We're often, because of the OER moniker, we tend to think that this is some sort of online curriculum; this is exactly the opposite of that. This is about high quality instructional materials in great Texas classrooms that create a high quality learning environment for kids.

LEO-WILSON: I appreciate this bill, Mr. Chairman, and I believe that this is the most important bill that we will pass this session. As a retired public school teacher, I want to thank you for saving teachers from spending late nights and countless weekends trying to find material to supplement their inadequate instructional materials. As a citizen and a taxpayer, I want to thank you for recognizing the importance of having an elected body overseeing the agency's production of the open-source materials, because it is only by an elected body that citizens can hold accountable. I believe, and you answer if this is correct or not, but this bill will reverse one of the worst mistakes that the legislative body ever made in **SB 6**. I feel that your bill ensures the next generation of students to become successful.

BUCKLEY: I believe that as well.

(c) Additional state aid provided under this section shall be deposited to the credit of the district's instructional materials and technology account maintained by the commissioner under Section 31.0212 and may be accessed only for the procurement of instructional materials in accordance with this section.

(d) Funds provided to a school district under this section must be spent in compliance with the requirements for the use of funds provided under this section and Section 31.0211.

Sec. 48.308. ADDITIONAL STATE AID FOR OPEN EDUCATION RESOURCE INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIAL. (a) Subject to Section 31.0751, a school district is entitled to additional state aid for each school year in an amount not to exceed \$20 for each student for the costs incurred or for which the district is obligated to pay during the school year in which the aid is provided for the printing and shipping of open education resource instructional material made available under Subchapter B-1, Chapter 31.

(b) The amount to which a school district is entitled under this section may not exceed actual costs incurred by the district or for which the district is obligated to pay during the school year for which the funds were provided.

(c) Additional state aid provided under this section shall be deposited to the credit of the district's instructional materials and technology account maintained by the commissioner under Section 31.0212 and may be accessed only for the procurement of instructional materials in accordance with this section.

(d) Funds provided to a school district under this section must be spent in compliance with the requirements for the use of funds provided under this section and Section 31.0211.

(3) Add the following appropriately numbered SECTION to the bill and renumber subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

SECTION _____. Section 48.277(b), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) For purposes of calculating maintenance and operations revenue under Subsection (a), the commissioner shall:

(1) for purposes of Subsections (a)(1) and (2), use the following applicable school year:

(A) in a school year ending in an even-numbered year, the 2019-2020 school year; and

(D) from 2015 to 2020, Texas lost 572 children to firearm homicides, more than any other state;

(E) overall firearm homicide rates in Texas have increased 66 percent from 2014 to 2020;"

(2) Renumber accordingly the subsequent subsections.

AMENDMENT NO. 1 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE BRYANT: Ladies and gentlemen, I don't think the irony is lost on any of us that on the same day that we recognize the families of the children that were murdered in Uvalde along with their teachers, that we're not taking up a bill to protect ourselves and these children against guns, we're taking up a bill to protect guns.

This amendment amends the legislative findings of this bill. This bill was written in order to prevent the establishment of merchant codes, used by credit card companies and retailers, to categorize the types of purchases that go through their system. It prohibits such a category to be created for guns. I have offered this amendment, a modification of the legislative findings, that supports the purpose of this bill to prevent guns from becoming part of a merchant code by pointing out that, indeed, the demand for such measures as this exists and is vastly enhanced by a series of factors. Reading from the amendment, it says the legislature finds that calls for maintaining firearms purchases by methods which may include merchant category codes have increased due to the dramatic increase in gun violence in Texas. For example, three of the 10 deadliest mass shootings in modern United States history have occurred in Texas in the past five years. The following mass shootings have occurred in Texas: 26 people killed in Sutherland Springs in 2017; 23 people were killed in Killeen in 1991; 13 more people were killed in Killeen in 2009; 23 people were killed in El Paso in 2019; 21 people were killed in Uvalde, Texas in 2022; and just last week, five more people were killed in a mass shooting in Cleveland, Texas.

Firearm homicide rates for children under 18 have more than doubled in Texas between 2014 and 2020. From 2015 to 2020, Texas lost 572 children to firearm homicides, more than any other state. Overall, firearm homicide rates in Texas have increased 66 percent from 2014 to 2020. And I might have added to this amendment the fact that 92 gun bills are sitting bottled up in the Select

Committee on Community Safety, including one by Mr. King, that already has the support of a majority of the members of this house, and the Robb Elementary bill that I introduced that covers three important areas—all reasonable measures. But we can't get them to the floor for a vote. Is there any question, or any misunderstanding, about why there is a growing demand for measures like the one Mr. Schaefer is attempting to prevent? I don't think so.

REPRESENTATIVE C. MORALES: Thank you, Representative Bryant, for your amendment. I didn't get to hear everything; there was a little interruption back here. But can you just tell me really quickly: What does you amendment do?

BRYANT: My amendment amends the legislative findings of the bill to point out the reasons why there is great demand to institute measures, such as merchant codes that include firearms sales, which is exactly what Mr. Schaefer is trying to prevent. We've got to have a legislative finding to back up the reasons for the bill, and I've amended the legislative findings.

C. MORALES: Thank you. And why is it important that this bill not only lists that the legislature recognizes the right to bear arms, but also recognizes the dramatic increase in gun violence in Texas?

BRYANT: Because this legislature is not doing anything about it. We all stand up in honor of the families from Uvalde today. We don't do one single thing to protect them and the kids, and here is a bill on the floor to protect guns.

C. MORALES: So would you say that it's irresponsible not to consider these tragedies when discussing any legislation in regards to guns?

BRYANT: I say it is an exercise of willful ignorance to put on the blinders and pretend that we have no responsibility in this area. This is something we have a moral obligation to deal with. These are reasonable bills. These are not bills to ban guns. I'm just like Ms. Ramos. I've got more guns in my house than people. We all do. But for goodness sakes, we ought not to have a situation in which an 18-year-old kid can go out and buy an assault rifle and go straight to the schoolhouse and murder 19 kids. And he didn't just shoot them down like in the movies; he blew them up. They weren't recognizable. They had to be identified by their tennis shoes. Are we not able to act at all? Mr. Guillen, won't you kick that bill out of committee? Let us have a vote. Ninety-two bills are bottled up in your committee.

C. MORALES: Have any of our efforts to continue expanding the right to bear arms, like permitless carry, campus carry, and lawless storage resulted in increased protection of Texans? Has it resulted in more successful cases of citizens being able to protect themselves, or has it caused more senseless and preventable deaths?

BRYANT: The legislative findings that are in this amendment assert that more deaths, just as you referenced, are part of our immediate history—just the last five years. That is the reason why there's a demand for measures like merchant codes that identify firearms purchases that Mr. Schaefer's trying to prevent.

C. MORALES: By adding this section, it would help track guns used in horrible cases—as in Uvalde, Santa Fe, El Paso—and prevent future mass shootings from happening?

BRYANT: That would be the case if the bill doesn't pass. If the bill does pass, it will be just the opposite.

C. MORALES: Thank you, Representative Bryant.

REPRESENTATIVE SCHAEFER: I do oppose this amendment. This amendment has nothing to do with the background checks that are required when you go to a retailer, that's mentioned in this bill, and purchase a gun. This bill is about not tracking lawful purchase and creating a database to spy on Americans. So with that, I oppose the amendment.

BRYANT: Members, the amendment modifies the legislative findings by pointing out that the reason why people are demanding measures, like Mr. Schaefer is trying to prevent, is our almost unimaginable history in this state of repeated mass killings as recently as only three or four days ago. I won't make my entire speech again. I urge you to search your conscience and vote for this amendment.

AMENDMENT NO. 2 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE BRYANT: This amendment relates back to what Representative Ramos was speaking of a moment ago in her questions. It's very peculiar that this bill recites the Texas Constitution, but cuts it off mid-sentence. Its says, "Every citizen shall have the right to keep and bear arms in the lawful defense of himself or the State;" and it stops right there. But in our Constitution, the sentence continues "... but the Legislature shall have power, by law, to regulate the wearing of arms, with a view to prevent crime." This amendment simply includes in the bill the full sentence, rather than a half of a sentence which is inaccurate, misleading, and fails to state the wishes of the people with regards to reasonable regulation of who gets to carry a firearm.

REPRESENTATIVE RAMOS: The discussion previously when we were talking about the Texas Constitution, which was partly cited in this bill—do you have any understanding of why the second part that talks about the legislature's power by law, why that would've been excluded in the original bill?

BRYANT: Well, I assume it's because the authors wish that it wasn't there, but it is there.

RAMOS: I asked the author of the bill, regarding this vision of the bill. Is it your impression, or is it your understanding, that regulating the wearing of arms—that that is specifically is on the legislature to solely to regulate that part? And only when individuals are actually carrying? What is your understanding of what that means?

BRYANT: It simply means that, according to our state Constitution, the legislature has the power, by law, to regulate the wearing of arms, with a view of preventing crime. In other words, that's our responsibility in this legislature. That's what that means.

RAMOS: And the wearing of arms, I guess, would also include the purchasing of those arms that you are wearing, correct?

BRYANT: That is correct.

RAMOS: And this bill is about the purchasing of those arms, correct?

BRYANT: That is correct.

RAMOS: I think it's a great amendment, and I appreciate you being thorough and following the constitutional provisions.

BRYANT: Members, the amendment simply includes the whole sentence in our Constitution in the bill and not simply just half of it. I urge you to vote for it.

REPRESENTATIVE SCHAEFER: This amendment adds nothing to the bill. I've never seen it before and I oppose it.

BRYANT: I urge your aye vote.

AMENDMENT NO. 3 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE BRYANT: Members of the house, this amendment excludes assault weapons from the coverage of Mr. Schaefer's bill. In other words, we would not be prohibiting the creation of a merchant code for assault weapons. If I might quote briefly from the 2018 coverage of this topic in *The New York Times*:

A *New York Times* examination of mass shootings since the Virginia Tech attack in 2007 reveals how credit cards have become a crucial part of the planning of these massacres. There have been 13 shootings that killed 10 or more people in the last decade—that was in 2018—and in at least eight of them, the killers financed their attacks using credit cards. Some used credit to acquire firearms they could not otherwise have afforded. Those eight shootings killed 217 people. I urge you to vote for this amendment to make sure that assault weapons remain eligible for the creation of a merchant code.

REPRESENTATIVE RAMOS: Representative Bryant, your amendment specifically—I couldn't hear too well what you said your amendment covered. Could you repeat that part?

BRYANT: Yes. Mr. Schaefer prohibits the creation of merchant codes for gun purchases. My amendment excludes assault weapons from that prohibition so that we would be able to create merchant codes for transactions involving the purchase of assault weapons, and assault weapons are defined specifically in the bill.

RAMOS: Okay, so your amendment effectively allows there to be the code that tags these assault weapons in these purchases?

BRYANT: That's correct.

RAMOS: Are you aware of any other codes—merchant codes—that specifically exclude a whole industry-type product, such as guns, that we're including in this legislation?

BRYANT: There is no other merchandise excluded. The merchant code index, the book of merchant codes, is as thick as a small phone book. It includes every type of product. No other product is excluded. I'm simply asking in this amendment that we allow the creation of merchant codes for assault rifles.

REPRESENTATIVE SCHAEFER: Members, this bill has nothing to do with grenade launchers so I oppose this amendment. Vote two.

BRYANT: I urge you to vote for the amendment so that merchant codes can continue to be created, or could be created if they chose to do so, for assault rifles—very simple—for assault rifles. I urge you to vote for the amendment.

(vi) Section 20A.02(a)(7), 20A.02(a)(8), or 20A.03, Penal

Code;

(D) an offense described by Article 62.001(6)(C) or (D), Code of Criminal Procedure; [and]

(E) criminal actions against persons who are detained as provided by Section 51.12, Family Code, after transfer for prosecution in criminal court under Section 54.02, Family Code; and

(F) criminal actions in which a defendant is found competent to stand trial under Article 46B.084, Code of Criminal Procedure;

(3) election contests and suits under the Election Code;

(4) orders for the protection of the family under Subtitle B, Title 4, Family Code;

(5) appeals of final rulings and decisions of the division of workers' compensation of the Texas Department of Insurance regarding workers' compensation claims and claims under the Federal Employers' Liability Act and the Jones Act;

(6) appeals of final orders of the commissioner of the General Land Office under Section 51.3021, Natural Resources Code;

(7) actions in which the claimant has been diagnosed with malignant mesothelioma, other malignant asbestos-related cancer, malignant silica-related cancer, or acute silicosis; and

(8) appeals brought under Section 42.01 or 42.015, Tax Code, of orders of appraisal review boards of appraisal districts established for counties with a population of less than 175,000.

Moreover, the current attorney general himself agrees that his "opinions cannot create new provisions in the law." Ken Paxton, *Attorney General Opinions*, https://www.texasattorneygeneral.gov/attorney-general-opinions (accessed May 2, 2023). Because an opinion is not a statute, the amendment seeks to add subject matter beyond the scope of the bill. *See* 81 H. Jour. 4135-4137 (2009).

Accordingly, the point of order is well-taken and sustained.

(1) On page 1, line 16, strike "change in law made by this Act applies" and substitute "changes in law made by this Act apply".

(2) Add the following appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill and renumber subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

SECTION _____. Section 46.06, Penal Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a), (c), and (d) and adding Subsection (c-1) to read as follows:

(a) A person commits an offense if the person:

(1) sells, rents, leases, loans, or gives a handgun to any person knowing that the person to whom the handgun is to be delivered intends to use it unlawfully or in the commission of an unlawful act;

(2) intentionally or knowingly sells, rents, leases, or gives or offers to sell, rent, lease, or give:

(A) to a [any] child younger than 18 years of age a [any firearm,] club, [Θ r] location-restricted knife, or firearm other than a semiautomatic rifle described by Paragraph (B); or

(B) to a person younger than 21 years of age a semiautomatic rifle that is capable of accepting a detachable magazine and that has a caliber greater than .22;

(3) intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly sells a firearm or ammunition for a firearm to any person who is intoxicated;

(4) knowingly sells a firearm or ammunition for a firearm to any person who has been convicted of a felony before the fifth anniversary of the later of the following dates:

(A) the person's release from confinement following conviction of the felony; or

(B) the person's release from supervision under community supervision, parole, or mandatory supervision following conviction of the felony;

(5) sells, rents, leases, loans, or gives a handgun to any person knowing that an active protective order is directed to the person to whom the handgun is to be delivered;

(6) knowingly purchases, rents, leases, or receives as a loan or gift from another a handgun while an active protective order is directed to the actor; or (7) while prohibited from possessing a firearm under state or federal law, knowingly makes a material false statement on a form that is:

(A) required by state or federal law for the purchase, sale, or other transfer of a firearm; and

(B) submitted to a [licensed] firearms dealer licensed under[, as defined by] 18 U.S.C. Section 923.

(c) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under Subsection (a)(2)(A) [(a)(2)] that the transfer was to a minor whose parent or the person having legal custody of the minor had given written permission for the sale or, if the transfer was other than a sale, the parent or person having legal custody had given effective consent.

(c-1) It is an exception to the application of Subsection (a)(2)(B) that the recipient of a transfer of a firearm is:

(A) a peace officer; or

(B) a member of the United States armed forces; or

(C) has been honorably discharged from the United States Armed es.

forces.

(d) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor, except that:

(1) an offense under Subsection (a)(2)(A) [(a)(2)] is a state jail felony if the weapon that is the subject of the offense is a handgun; and

(2) an offense under Subsection (a)(2)(B) or (a)(7) is a state jail felony.

SECTION _____. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails over another Act of the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023, relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted codes.
